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Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail – Passenger Service from Houston to Dallas

Environmental Impact Statement

The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) is preparing an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposed Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail Project.

The proposed project would connect Dallas and Houston with a dedicated High-Speed Rail (HSR) system proposed by a private company, Texas Central Railway (TCR).

FRA completed an independent evaluation of potential HSR corridor alternatives and determined that the Utility Corridor is the only feasible end-to-end corridor alternative. FRA's [Alternatives Analysis Technical Report](#) documents the potential HSR corridor alternatives that were evaluated, and describes FRA's screening process.

FRA identified six draft alignment alternatives for further evaluation in the Draft EIS, following a comprehensive analysis of major corridors proposed for the project.

Through the natural progression of the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process, FRA has narrowed the focus of its environmental analysis in its [Alignments Alternatives Analysis Report](#). FRA evaluated 22 potential route alternatives within five major geographical areas using environmental constraints screening criteria, as required by NEPA. As part of the EIS, the environmental and social impacts of various alternative HSR route alignments will be analyzed including possible routes that share corridors with an existing rail line and along electric utility lines. The TCR's proposed high-speed line would operate on a dedicated right-of-way and would not share track or infrastructure with existing trains or rail lines. In addition, the EIS will analyze the potential impacts of stations, power or fueling stations, and maintenance facilities to support HSR operations.

Next Steps

FRA is working on addressing public comments received on the Draft EIS and conducting additional environmental analysis to inform the Final EIS. FRA expects to publish the Final EIS in Spring 2020.

What is High-Speed Rail?

Frequent, express service between major population centers 200–600 miles apart, with few intermediate stops. Top speeds of at least 150 mph on completely grade-separated, dedicated rights-of-way (with the possible exception of some shared track in terminal areas). Intended to relieve air and highway capacity constraints. (FRA, High Speed Rail Strategic Plan, April 2009) By comparison, traditional passenger rail service between cities generally travels at top speeds of 79 to 90 mph on shared track and makes numerous intermediate stops.



Environmental Impact Statement Now Underway for High-Speed Rail between Dallas and Houston

A last minute request for a meeting in Dallas comes into your Houston office. A critically ill relative is taken to a Houston hospital while you're in Dallas. How to get there quickly without traffic and parking worries? A new solution for rapid travel between the new cities is in the works. If the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) approves the Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail (HSR) proposed by a private company, the Texas Central Railway (TCR), for the first time it will be possible to take a fast passenger train between the two cities.

High-speed rail between Texas cities was first considered in the 1980s and several projects are currently under development including a leg from Fort Worth to Dallas that would connect to the Dallas to Houston HSR. The Texas Rail Plan prepared by the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) in 2010 presented a vision for high-speed rail in the state and identified the development of the Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail project by a private applicant.

High-Speed Rail in Texas

FRA, and its co-lead agency TxDOT, are currently overseeing the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Dallas to Houston HSR project. This environmental document must be prepared and approved before the project can move forward. As proposed, the 24-mile Dallas to Houston HSR would provide reliable, safe, and economically viable passenger rail service using proven HSR technology between Dallas and Houston. It would offer an alternative to automobile travel on Interstate 45 or air travel between two major metropolitan areas. The proposed train vehicle is based on the N700

Tokaido Shinkansen—the bullet train currently in use in Japan. The Dallas to Houston HSR would travel at speeds up to 205 mph, resulting in a 90-minute trip between the two cities. It would be a “closed” system meaning that the train would run on dedicated high-speed rail tracks that would not share any at-grade intersections with roadways or other train tracks (grade separated). Terminal stations would be located in Dallas and Houston with a possible intermediate station.

However, at this point neither the exact route of the proposed HSR nor the station locations have been determined. TCR has looked at nine possible alternative alignments and performed a detailed analysis of each one based on environmental, engineering, and financial and project delivery considerations. The results: two alignments (page 3) that ranked the highest (i.e., the most strengths and least weaknesses). FRA has reviewed this analysis and performed additional assessments that have led them to concur with TCR’s evaluation. These two alternatives will undergo a detailed evaluation in the EIS.



Project Scoping – We want to hear from you!

At this stage in the EIS development, additional input is being sought from federal and state agencies, and the public on the proposed alternatives. This process, called scoping, consists of agency coordination meetings and a series of public scoping meetings to be

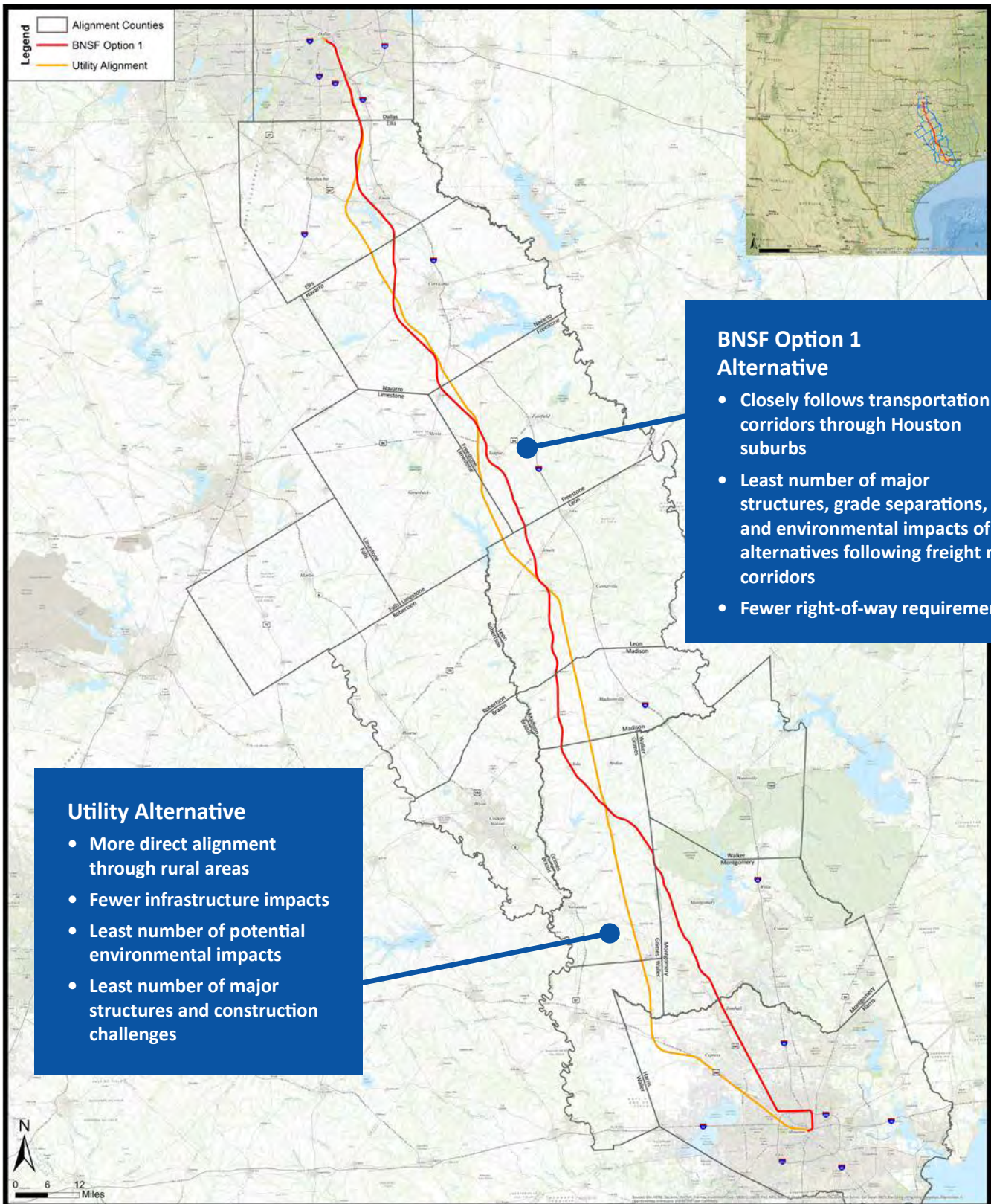
held in October at six locations from Dallas to Houston (see table for locations and dates). Specifically the FRA is seeking comments and suggestions about the proposed routes and station locations, as well as information about project area until November 14 when the scoping period officially ends. At the scoping meetings, participants will have a chance to review project materials, including the alternative evaluations completed thus far, as well as possible station locations. Project team members will be on hand to answer questions. Next Steps

The two alternatives, the no-build alternative, and any other alternatives that might emerge as a result of project scoping, will be evaluated and studied further in the EIS. This evaluation will include field work, data gathering and analysis of this information to determine the potential environmental impacts of the proposed project. Environmental impacts on air and water quality, land use, socioeconomics, neighborhoods, environmental justice, among other areas will be determined. This process will begin when scoping is complete in mid-November and will be completed in mid-2015 when a draft EIS will be issued for public and agency review. A series of public hearings will be held to formally gather public comments on the draft EIS.

What is an Environmental Impact Statement?

- The Environmental Impact Statement being prepared under FRA’s guidance is a document required by National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) for large construction projects receiving federal funds, or in this case, requiring federal safety regulation.
- The FRA has authority to regulate the safety of railroads, including the proposed project and must approve the proposed action before it can be implemented. Current FRA regulations do not address equipment requirements for train speeds above 150 mph. For this project, FRA’s approval of the Applicant’s high-speed rail technology through a Rule of Particular Applicability (regulations that apply to a specific railroad or a specific type of operation) constitutes the federal action.
- EIS discloses project information, describes the project and study areas, and analyzes possible environmental consequences associated with construction.
- Includes public involvement at beginning of EIS development and throughout the process

FRA Completes High-Speed Rail Corridor Alternatives Analysis

The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) undertook an independent evaluation of potential corridor alternatives as the first stage in a two-part process to determine the feasible alternatives to be evaluated in the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). In the first phase of narrowing the potential corridor alternatives to be evaluated in the EIS, FRA completed a Corridor Alternatives Analysis Technical Report.

FRA's evaluation resulted in the Utility Corridor being identified as the only feasible corridor. The Utility Corridor is the only corridor that demonstrates the potential to meet Texas Central High-Speed Railway's (TCR) purpose and technical requirements.

FRA evaluated three potential corridor alternatives from existing federal and state planning documents, in addition to TCR's proposed Utility Corridor:

- BNSF Corridor
- UPRR Corridor
- I-45 Greenfield Corridor
- Utility Corridor

In addition to evaluating dedicated high-speed rail corridors, FRA also studied other transportation alternatives to meet TCR's purpose, including high-speed rail alternatives – Higher-Speed Rail Service, Conventional Speed Rail Service, Direct Bus Service, and I-45 Expansion.

FRA determined that the Utility Corridor is the only feasible corridor with the potential to accommodate TCR's proposed high-speed rail system. Furthermore, FRA determined that the high-speed rail alternatives (Higher-Speed Rail Service, Conventional Speed Rail Service, Direct Bus Service, and I-45 Expansion) do not meet the purpose of the project as identified by TCR. FRA has determined that portions of these corridors, combined with the Utility Corridor, may be feasible and should be retained for further investigation even though the agency has determined that the BNSF, UPRR, and I-45 Greenfield Corridors are not feasible as end-to-end corridors,

Next, FRA will identify and evaluate potential alignment alternatives for the Utility Corridor in the second stage of the two-part process to determine the feasible alternatives to be evaluated in the EIS. FRA will independently evaluate potential alignment alternatives proposed by TCR based on National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) screening criteria. In addition to the No Build Alternative, against which all Build Alternatives will be compared and evaluated as required by NEPA, FRA will identify and determine the feasible Build Alternatives in the second part of the alternatives analysis.

The Utility Corridor is the only corridor that demonstrates the potential to meet Texas Central High-Speed Railway's (TCR) purpose and technical requirements.

FRA evaluated a total of four potential corridor alternatives, three from existing federal and state planning documents, and TCR's proposed Utility Corridor:

- BNSF Corridor
- UPRR Corridor
- I-45 Greenfield Corridor

In addition to evaluating dedicated high-speed rail corridors, FRA also studied other transportation alternatives to meet TCR's purpose, including high-speed rail alternatives – Higher-Speed Rail Service, Conventional Speed Rail Service, Direct Bus Service, and I-45 Expansion.

FRA determined that the Utility Corridor is the only feasible corridor with the potential to accommodate TCR's proposed high-speed rail system. In addition to the No Build Alternative, against which all Build Alternatives will be compared and evaluated as required by NEPA, FRA will identify and determine the feasible Build Alternatives in the second part of the alternatives analysis.

Project Status

FRA completed the [Scoping Summary Report](#) in April 2015. The report documents the outreach activities that occurred during the public scoping period. It also summarizes the approximately 4,400 public and agency comments received during the public scoping period.

Coming up Next on the Project

FRA will identify and evaluate potential alignments within the Utility Corridor based on potential alignment alternatives proposed by TCR.

The results of the second part of the alternatives analysis process will determine the Build Alternatives, as well as the No Build Alternative, which will be evaluated in the EIS.

Draft Environmental Impact Statement for Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail: Now Ready for Public Review

The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) has issued the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposed Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail (HSR) Project (Project). The Draft EIS is available for public review at the locations shown in Table 1 and on FRA’s website at <https://www.fra.dot.gov/Page/P0700>. The Draft EIS documents FRA’s evaluation of Texas Central High Speed Railway (TCRR) and its affiliates’ proposal to construct and operate a 240-mile, for-profit, HSR system connecting Dallas and Houston using the Japanese N700 Tokaido Shinkansen technology.

The Draft EIS describes FRA’s evaluation of the possible environmental impacts of the Project and recommends a preferred alternative from among six Build Alternatives between Dallas and Houston. In preparing the document, FRA, as the lead federal agency, worked in cooperation with the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), Federal Transit Administration (FTA), the Surface Transportation Board (STB), United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE), and United States Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS). The Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) provided technical assistance to FRA in the preparation of the Draft EIS. In addition, public feedback was considered along with input from other federal, state, and local agency stakeholders.

FRA completed the initial agency and public scoping process for the Project in early 2015. Next, FRA evaluated the four potential HSR corridors that were presented to the public and agencies during scoping, and reviewed alternative transportation modes (e.g., higher-speed and conventional speed rail services,

direct bus service, and expansion of Interstate Highway (IH)-45). FRA determined that these alternative modes would not meet the purpose and need of the project and eliminated them from further consideration. From the four potential HSR corridors evaluated, FRA carried the Utility Corridor forward for further analysis, but also retained elements of the other corridors to develop reasonable alignment alternatives for consideration in the Draft EIS.

TCRR then developed 21 potential alignment alternatives for FRA's evaluation. These alignment alternatives were primarily located within the Utility Corridor; however, in response to public scoping comments, TCRR also proposed alignment alternatives that used a portion of the IH-45 corridor. TCRR developed the potential alignment alternatives to avoid known environmental and engineering constraints.

FRA completed an independent analysis of TCR's alignment alternatives and identified eight segments that create six end-to-end Build Alternatives. TCRR identified one Dallas Terminal Station near IH-30, just south of downtown Dallas; one Brazos Valley Station location near State Highway (SH)-30 in Grimes County; and three Terminal Station options in Houston: Houston Industrial Site (south of Hempstead Road), Houston Northwest Mall Site (north of Hempstead Road), and Houston Transit Center Site (west of IH-610). FRA evaluated these Build Alternatives and the proposed stations in the Draft EIS.

Public Comments on the Draft EIS

FRA will hold 10 public hearings in January and February 2018, which will allow the public to comment on the Dallas to Houston HSR Draft EIS. FRA will conduct one hearing in each of the impacted counties beginning January 29, 2018. The locations, dates, and times of all of the public hearings are noted in Table 2. Before the public hearing presentation begins, an open house will be held to allow for comments, questions, and review of project exhibits. FRA and TCRR staff will be available to answer questions at that time. The public hearing presentation will begin at 6 pm, followed by a public comment period. Note that the hearings in Harris and Grimes counties will start at 6 pm with a presentation at 7 pm.

What is an Environmental Impact Statement?

The EIS is a document required by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) for any projects resulting in significant environmental impacts that receive federal funding or require other federal approval. In this case, approval for the safe operation of a new technology is required.

- FRA has jurisdiction over every area of railroad safety and is authorized to prescribe regulations and issue orders as necessary for railroad safety. Current FRA regulations do not comprehensively address safety requirements for train speeds above 150 mph, such as the Project's proposed operations. Therefore, FRA may issue a Rule of Particular Applicability (regulations that apply to a specific railroad or a specific type of operation), impose requirements or conditions by order(s) or waiver(s) or by taking other regulatory action to ensure the Project is operated safely. This regulatory action constitutes a major federal action that significantly affects the quality of the human environment, and so an EIS is required.
- This EIS discloses project information, describes the Project and study areas, and analyzes potential benefits and impacts to the environment associated with construction and operation of a HSR system.
- An EIS also documents the lead agency (ies)'s decision-making process for selecting (or recommending, in the case of a Draft EIS) a preferred alternative.
- The EIS process affords feedback from agencies and the public at various points in the Project's development process.

Next Steps

After the close of the public comment period, FRA will consider and respond to every comment received as part of the preparation of the Final EIS. FRA will announce the availability and publication of the Final EIS to the public.

Upon completion of the Final EIS, FRA will issue a Record of Decision (ROD) on the Project in compliance with NEPA. If FRA selects a Build Alternative in the ROD, FRA would also document additional actions required by FRA or TCRR to initiate construction and monitor and mitigate impacts.

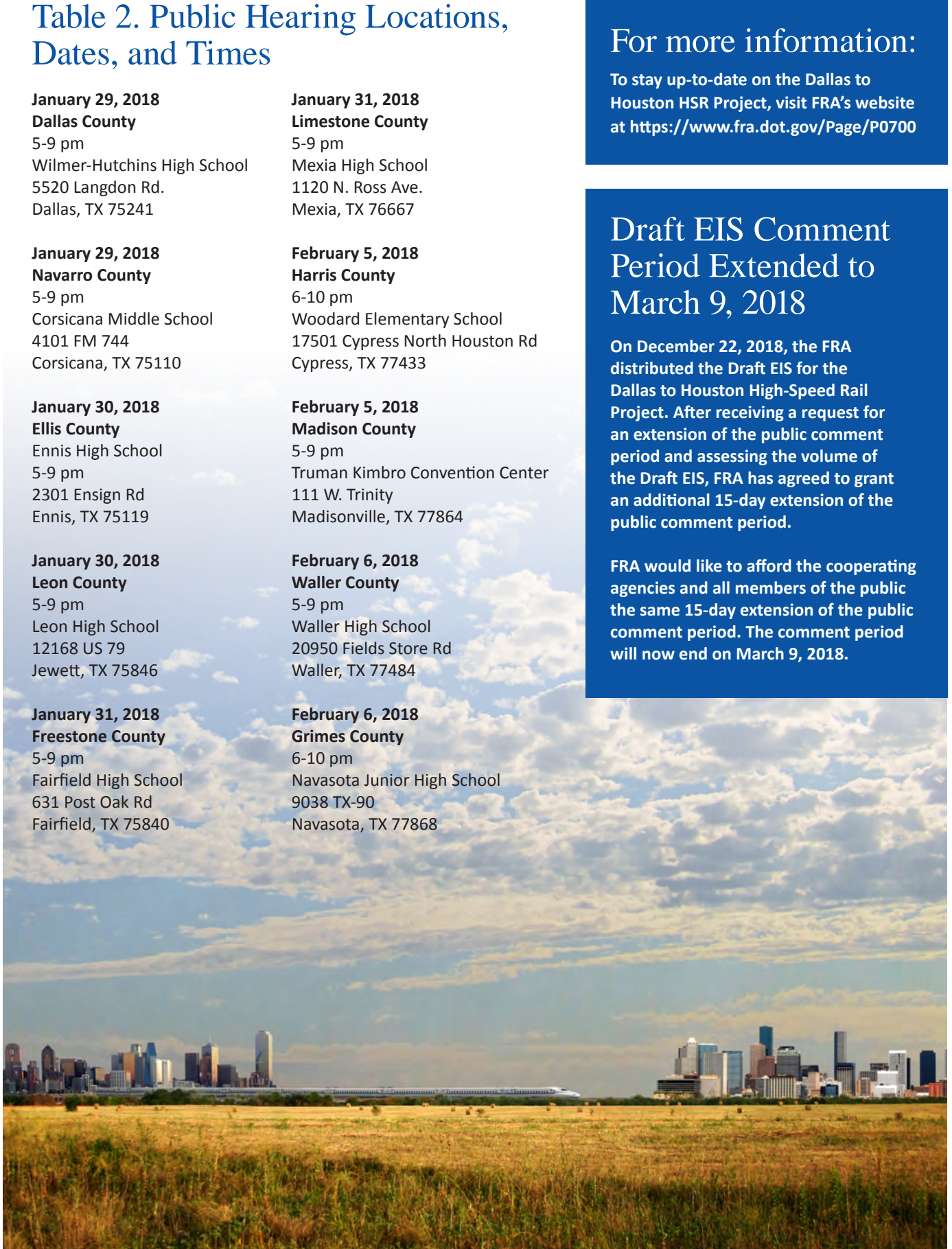

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

This concerns your letter, dated September 10, 2014, requesting that the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Galveston District (CESWG), participate in preparation of the Central Texas High Speed Rail Corridor (CTHSRC) Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) as a cooperating agency. The EIS is for the proposed high speed rail corridor extending from Dallas to Houston. The application for the proposed project is submitted by Texas Central High Speed Rail, LLC. The lead agency for the preparation of the EIS is the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA).

Based on review of the possible alignments for the proposed project, including an initial assessment of wetland or water crossings provided by the applicant, we believe that the CESWG has potential jurisdiction by law over work proposed in Montgomery, Waller, and Harris Counties, Texas. Wetland and water crossings in the Texas Counties of Dallas, Ellis, Navarro, Freestone, Limestone, Leon, Madison, and Grimes, would fall under the jurisdiction of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Fort Worth District. CESWG is prepared to participate on the project as a cooperating agency, as defined in 40 CFR 1501.6. However, we would ask that, as lead agency, FRA assist in the funding of this activity to the extent funds are available, per 40 CFR 1501.6 (b)(5).

Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) has reviewed preliminary information received at the first Texas Oklahoma Passenger Rail Study Agency Scoping Meeting on March 27, 2013 and offers the following information for consideration when moving forward with this project and preparing a service-level Environmental Impact Statement (EIS).

Project Description

The Texas-Oklahoma Passenger Rail Study (TOPRS) commenced in winter 2013 and is expected to be completed by fall 2014. It will document the costs, benefits, and impacts of rail service alternatives compared to a no-build alternative in a service-level EIS.

The EIS will provide a high-level review of rail needs and potential service options in the corridor (called a service-level EIS). The study could conclude with a decision to advance individual projects for more detailed study or a decision against making further investments in passenger rail in the corridor. Before any identified project could be constructed, the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) would need to complete additional environmental review and identify funding.

High-speed passenger rail has been under consideration in Texas since the late 1980s. In the 1990s, a private consortium was awarded a franchise to design, build, and operate high-speed rail in the state. Although demand appeared to support the development of high-speed rail, lack of funding and other obstacles prevented the project from moving forward. Since then, other proposals for high-speed passenger rail in Texas have been submitted to the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA), with each proposal showing revenues that exceed operating expenses but requiring some amount of funding to build.

In 2000, FRA designated the South Central corridor, including the area from San Antonio to Dallas/Fort Worth, as a future high-speed rail corridor. In 2010, TxDOT received a grant from FRA to study passenger rail in this corridor.

The TOPRS will consider a range of passenger rail options for the 850-mile corridor. Today's passenger rail service can range in speed from 79 miles per hour to more than 220 miles per hour. The different speed options will influence ridership, the number and location of stations, and costs.

TxDOT and FRA will make decisions about TOPRS after reviewing input from the public and other public agencies.

Recommendation: TPWD recommends using existing railroad right-of-way (ROW) whenever possible. Where new construction is the only feasible option, TPWD recommends constructing the passenger rail along existing roads, pipelines, transmission lines, or other utility ROWs and easements to reduce habitat fragmentation. By utilizing previously disturbed existing utility corridors, county roads, highway, and railroad ROWs, adverse impacts to fish and wildlife resources would be mitigated by avoiding and/or minimizing the impacts to undisturbed habitats.

Purpose and Scale of this Analysis

The purpose of this letter is to communicate to TxDOT/FRA the general concerns TPWD has regarding potential impacts to natural resources from the construction of the proposed passenger rail. This letter is not intended to replace coordination with TPWD as the proposed project progresses. However, TPWD hopes to make TxDOT/FRA aware of potential concerns early in the planning process to help guide the design and location of the proposed passenger rail and minimize adverse impacts to natural resources to the extent possible.

The proposed passenger rail may potentially cross the following Texas Conservation Action Plan's (TCAP) ecoregions of Texas as shown on the attached map.

- Cross Timbers
- East Central Texas Plains
- Edwards Plateau
- Southern Texas Plains
- Texas Blackland Prairies
- Western Gulf Coastal Plain

TPWD reviewed the ecoregions of Texas as designated by the TCAP. The TCAP's purpose is to provide a statewide "roadmap" for research, restoration, management, and recovery projects addressing Species of Greatest Conservation Need (SGCN) and important habitats. SGCN include terrestrial, freshwater, and marine birds, mammals, reptiles, amphibians, invertebrates, fishes, plants, and plant

communities. The goal of the plan is ultimately to conserve and improve the status of these species and, as possible, prevent listings under the Endangered Species Act. More information on the TCAP can be found at <http://www.tpwd.state.tx.us/landwater/land/tcap/>.

Potential impacts to natural resources will generally vary by ecoregion. This letter will attempt to address some of these potential impacts on a regional scale. Because a study area has not yet been determined, ecoregions that are traversed by IH 35 are included on the attached TCAP ecoregion map. An additional ecoregion that is not traversed by IH 35 was added (Western Gulf Coastal Plain ecoregion) because there are several potential passenger rail routes in South Texas as displayed on the TOPRS corridor map that was issued at the Agency Scoping Meeting.

Information regarding natural resources and potential impacts is provided at a coarse scale, and general recommendations that apply to all ecoregions have been provided for your planning reference. As this project progresses and a study area is determined, it is recommended that TxDOT/FRA contact TPWD early in the planning process for site-specific information and recommendations.

General Recommendations – All Ecoregions

Below are bulleted lists of potential natural resource concerns that could be a result of the proposed project and recommendations to minimize adverse impacts. The recommendations and potential natural resource concerns listed below are applicable to all ecoregions listed above.

Natural Resource Concerns:

- Clearing of woody vegetation
- Introduction of non-native species in native grasslands/rangelands
- Clearing/fragmentation of riparian corridors (route would cross most major rivers and many tributaries)
- Impacts to aquatic species (freshwater mussels/designated mussel sanctuaries, fish, etc.)
- Direct and indirect (visual/noise) impacts to TPWD managed areas – taking of TPWD property
- Direct and indirect (visual/noise) impacts to non-TPWD managed areas (federal, city, county, non-governmental organizations, etc.)
- Impacts to SGCN from TCAP as well as species shown on TPWD and U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS) county lists
- Fragmentation of wildlife travel corridors
- Removal of Whooping Crane stopover habitat in its migration corridor
- Taking of USFWS designated critical habitat
- Impacts to Colonial Waterbird Rookeries

Recommendations:

- Use native vegetation and water conservation in station landscaping
- Use bridge spans rather than culverts where feasible to retain stream characteristics and aquatic and terrestrial movement
- Implement Best Management Practices (BMPs) for construction in wetlands/temporary crossings to minimize impacts
- Construct wildlife crossings, particularly in wildlife travel corridors
- Comply with applicable state and federal regulations (listed below)

Threatened and Endangered Species

The USFWS should be contacted for guidance, permitting, survey protocols, and mitigation for federally listed species. For USFWS threatened and endangered species lists by county please visit <http://www.fws.gov/endangered/>.

Managed Areas

Chapter 26 of Parks and Wildlife Code requires demonstration of no feasible or prudent alternative to taking of TPWD lands such as State Parks and Wildlife Management Areas (WMA). If the proposed passenger rail will cross any TPWD lands it will require an easement or transfer of property authorized by the TPWD Commission. This process can take several months to a year, and compensatory mitigation will be required. If the proposed project has the potential to impact a TPWD State Park, please contact David Riskind at (512) 389-4897 and if the project has the potential to impact a WMA, please contact Dennis Gissell at (512) 389-4407.

Please note that Chapter 26 of Parks and Wildlife Code also applies to public areas that are managed by counties and cities. Coordination with the Grants-In-Aid Branch of TPWD and local park administrators is necessary to prevent conversion of grant-assisted lands to other than public outdoor recreation use as prohibited by Section 6(f) of the Land and Water Conservation Act.

TPWD also recommends TxDOT/FRA address compliance with the above-listed state and federal regulations, as well as any others that pertain to the proposed passenger rail project, in the service-level EIS.

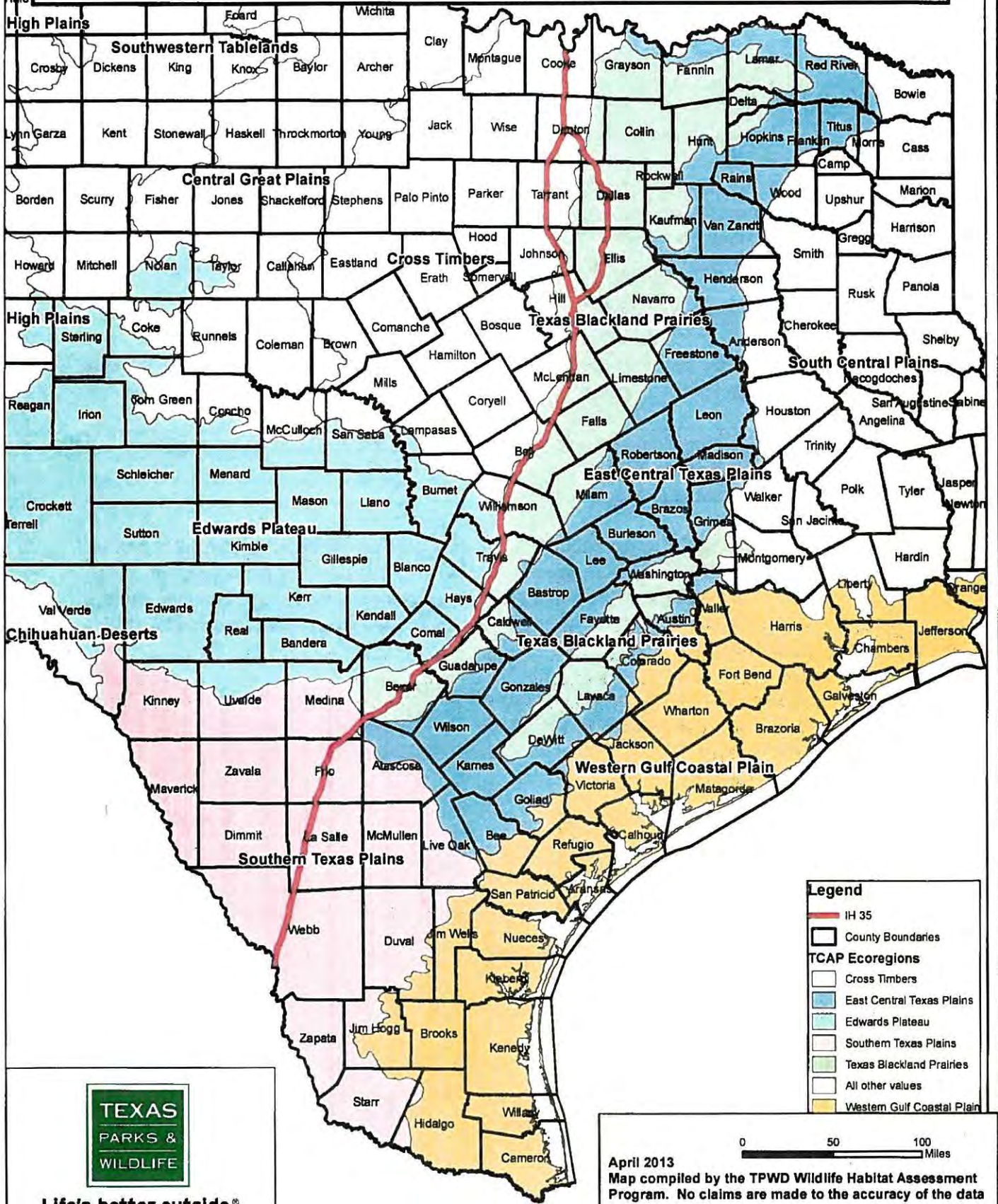

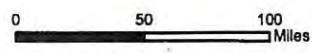

Available GIS files should be used as a starting point for on-the-ground surveys.

- Overall project definition Project is still the same from project inception
 - Common segments are defined as areas that are common across all 6 build alternatives and include Segment 1(Dallas and Ellis counties) and Segment 5 (Grimes, Waller and Harries counties). There are no alternatives for the alignment for the common segments.
 - AECOM , FRA and TCRR have worked together to continue the refinement of the limits of disturbance (LOD)
 - Increased the use of viaduct (original design was 40%, now it is approximately 60% viaduct)
 - Minimize project footprint at roadway crossings and ancillary facilities (TPSS and maintenance of ways facilities)
 - Identification of three alternative terminal station locations in Houston. One terminal station in Dallas
 - TCRR filed petition with STB in April 2016. STB declined the request in July 2016 because there was no obvious connection between TCRR and other facilities (Amtrak). TCRR is continuing to explore options to see if STB will reconsider the STB determination (like a through ticketing option with Amtrak). TCRR has stated their preference for STB to take jurisdiction. STB involvement would not affect the footprint of the project
 - TCRR has also made the determination to seek credit assistance from DOT. This does not change the project definition

- **ADEIS Update**

- Federal Actions
 - Rule of Particular Applicability (RPA) or a series of waivers may be issued by FRA. This is the reason that FRA is preparing this EIS. Because the FRA does not currently have safety regulations for this type of technology. TCRR submitted a petition for a RPA in April 2016 and FRA is currently reviewing.
 - Should TCRR apply, DOT may provide credit assistance in the form of direct loans, loan guarantees or standby lines of credit. The department offers a few different programs that the TCRR is currently exploring

 - a. Navasota Ladies Tresses: previously coordinated with Moni Belton on survey protocol in August 2016; surveys were completed in October-November 2016
 - b. Houston toad: currently preparing for surveys this month and working on survey plan with Jeff Hill (meeting with Mr. Hill is forthcoming)
 - c. Large-fruited sand verbena (LFSV): focus of this meeting – needing to work with the USFWS on the agency's preferred survey protocol for this species
4. AECOM LFSV Habitat Suitability Model (HSM) (Mr. Durish)
 - a. Modeled via a compilation of data layers from current literature for the LFSV as well as coordinated with Dr. Paula Williamson at Texas State.
 - b. There are three Texas Parks and Wildlife Department Texas Natural Diversity Database hits in our study area, and those records matched our 75-100% HSM.
 - c. USFWS (Amber Miller) agreed our mapping was "spot on" as far as what we've recommended as habitat and have done a great job of capturing this information
5. LFSV Survey
 - a. Land access is our first challenge as we can only survey within those properties for which we have access within the Limits of Disturbance (Mr. Durish)
 - b. Good we're having this call now vs. later. Considerations (Ms. Miller):
 - i. Blooming period – typically March is peak season, can go through late April/early May
 - ii. If project is built in 2019, could get in three survey periods – USFWS prefers two-three survey seasons to capture plant locations
 - iii. Dr. Williamson said to be careful about ID'ing plants – only 25% of plants in a population are in flower in a given year – more surveys AECOM can do, the better – much variation in blooming periods per year

- iv. Ms. Miller sent an email to Anita Tiller (Mercer Arboretum and Botanic Gardens, Precinct 4 for Harris Co.) and Dr. Williamson to request reference sites to gauge where plants are right now (if they're blooming). There are three reference populations, but status is unclear as it's been a while since last surveys there were last completed.
- v. Ms. Miller to provide survey protocol to apply for this species (#s of surveys, blooming period, soil profiles, reporting requirements, etc.).
- vi. Ms. Jensen will share with USFWS our progress once surveys are scheduled and underway

DISCUSSION POINTS

- The Draft EIS notes that the LOD for Build Alternatives C and F would be west of IH-45 where the park is not programmed. The Draft EIS did not note any significant impacts to the recreational components of the park on the east side of IH-45. FRA noted that IH-45 already bisects the park and that LOD of the two Build Alternatives in this area would parallel IH-45. The Section 4(f) determination for Fort Boggy was *de minimis*.
- TPWD provided comments to FRA on the park and disagrees with FRA's determination. In their comments TPWD noted future programming would occur on the west side of IH-45. TPWD also noted concerns related to noise and vibration.
- TPWD raised concerns about the elevation of the alignment, which rises above the highway, and questions if the tree line would truly block any visual impacts. TPWD is also concerned about the noise impacts to the recreational components of the park. The trees are leafless for two or three months of the year.
- TPWD also noted that there are hiking trails and primitive camp sites with the quarter mile study area. The entire state park is recreational property so any take of land would require mitigation. FRA agreed that the Project would incorporate land, but it would not change the attributes of the park that make it a 4(f) resource. TPWD also noted that recreational hunting occurs on the west side of the park. FRA asked if IH-45 impacted the hunting area. TPWD says that it does not. The west side of the park is approximately 600 acres (shaped like a pie wedge). The LOD would directly impact 67 acres of that area of the park. This area is mostly hunting with some trails. TPWD acknowledged they have some access/control issues in this section of the park.
- TPWD also noted the actual acreage of the park, which is incorrect in the EIS. AECOM and FRA will update the text accordingly.
- TPWD is concerned that the EIS did not go into a more robust discussion of impacts to the park user. Their comments on the EIS include strengthening that section. FRA and AECOM noted that the lack of information is not indicative of a lack of analysis, but is due to the analysis indicating limited impacts.
- Would forested acres be mitigated? And who would TPWD negotiate mitigation with, FRA or Texas Central? Mitigation would be discussed with FRA and documented within the EIS. Texas Central would be responsible for the mitigation commitment. The Draft EIS identified Build Alternative A as the recommended preferred. This Build Alternative does not impact Fort Boggy. If FRA's recommendation changes to Build Alternative C or F, they would communicate that change to TPWD to discuss mitigation options. The Final EIS is currently scheduled to be published around the end of 2018/first of 2019. The Record of Decision would follow the Final EIS and is currently on the Dashboard schedule for August 2019. This is not the only FRA permission that Texas Central would need for their project. FRA would also need to publish their Final Rule on the safety of the system.

- TPWD provided a scanned copy of a map of the park noting trails and camp sites. It's a big difficult to read, so TPWD will update it with some additional information (including primitive camp sites and hunting areas on the west side) and provide that to AECOM and FRA.
- Once AECOM and FRA receive the updated map they will take another look at the noise and vibration and the visual to see if the evaluation of the updated information identifies new impacts. TPWD noted that the topography of the park often captures sound and carries it into the park.
- TPWD also raised concerns about cultural resources (archaeological sites) within the LOD. AECOM has not completed any surveys on Fort Boggy property. FRA noted that it is atypical for archaeological sites to fall under Section 4(f) protection, but that FRA is sensitive to the need to complete surveys. TPWD recommended completing surveys early if FRA determines that Build Alternative C or F are the preferred.
- FRA will coordinate another call with TPWD to discuss the results of any new analyses and potential impacts on the park.

DISCUSSION POINTS

- In reviewing the potential project schedule, FRA recognizes there are several components related to USFWS responsibilities that need to be discussed. FRA has completed two years of species surveys for Navasota ladies-tresses, Large fruited sand verbena and Houston toad.
- TCR completed two years of surveys for Houston toad prior to FRA's EIS work. The alignments were slightly different and the protocols (study area, number of nights) were not the same as the current work. Can USFWS utilize any of that data?
- FRA has identified NLT species in the study area, which triggers formal consultation with USFWS. Additionally, there are areas of potential habitat for NLT and LFSV that FRA was not able to access, so mitigation will be required for those areas.
- FRA plans to conduct the third year for each species – NLT (October/November 2018), Houston toad (January-June 2019) and LFSV (February/March 2019). Typically, FRA would complete third year surveys and develop a biological assessment as the next step in formal consultation with USFWS. Based off of the timing of the third year surveys, FRA would likely have a biological assessment completed and ready for review by August 2019. USFWS would have 30 days to review the biological assessment and issue their biological opinion.
- FRA is looking at the potential to complete the Final EIS by summer 2019 with a ROD following within about 60 days. With all of these pieces in play, what are the options for completing formal consultation?
- What are the schedule implications for a sequential process?
- Would it be possible to submit a biological assessment prior to completing the third year, receive the biological opinion while completing the third year of Houston toad and then revise the biological opinion (if appropriate) based on the third year findings. USFWS raised some concerns with essentially completing consultation two times. She said that iterative biological opinions are an administrative burden.
- Would it be possible to submit a biological assessment and receive a biological opinion post-Record of Decision? Charlotte will talk to the Clear Lake office to see what they recommend.
- Since USFWS has a federal responsibility, do they want to designate FRA as the lead agency to conduct Section 106 coordination? Charlotte noted that USFWS usually designates an agency when doing Section 10 with a private landowner. Charlotte will reach back to the regional office to see if they need to designate FRA as the lead. Kevin will email Charlotte with the question so that she has information to forward to the regional office.
- FRA has received a substantial number of comments based on bird and train collisions. Does USFWS have any suggestions on how to address the potential for these impacts? There is a new interpretation from the Interior on this topic, but there is no standard language and predictability is difficult.

- FRA has also received comments about potential impacts to Monarch butterflies, a species USFWS is currently evaluating. Does USFWS have any standard language FRA can review in response to this species/concern? The regional lead for this species sits in Charlotte's office; she will see if she has any language.
- USFWS requested a follow-up meeting that included the species experts to talk through the potential schedule and consultation timeline. FRA will work to schedule that meeting.

DISCUSSION POINTS:

- Safety Minute - Being a defensive driver during survey efforts this Spring
- Project Update and Information
 - Team Introductions
 - Project History and Schedule – AECOM provided background for ongoing project (in year 5 overall, year 3 of surveys) and explained FRA and AECOM's roles in the development of the DEIS (released December 22, 2017), public comments, and the ongoing preparation of the FEIS
 - AECOM clarified that comments had been received during the formal public comment period of the DEIS by both the USFWS (including some of the species specialist) and Department of Interior.
- Navasota ladies'-tresses – AECOM explained that the previous reports (submitted in 2016 and 2017, and the recently completed 2018 submitted last night) detail the below items. While Moni initially had difficulty finding files AECOM had provided, she was able to confirm receipt of all files, including the 2018 NLT Technical Memo.
 - 2016-2018 survey efforts
 - Methodology
 - Habitat Modeling – was previously reviewed in 2016 as AECOM developed the surveys protocols with USFWS
 - Pedestrian Surveys
 - Property Access - AECOM detailed that surveys covered approximately 47% of modeled suitable habitat due to private land access
 - Findings – In 2017 found 4 individuals; and in 2018 found 21 on one parcel, and 5 other individuals on a non-preferred alignment.
 - Coordination with experts
- Potential Impacts
 - Individuals and Habitat – AECOM provided a verbal explanation of the proposed activities on parcel TX-MA-043.000 (Road re-reroute west of the population and centerline of project on viaduct east of the population).
 - USFWS asked for specific location information which AECOM stated is in the report on page 6.

- Mitigation/Avoidance Measures
 - Avoidance Measures, Design, and Exclusion Fencing – AECOM explained the property and potential construction activities, with the idea of implementing exclusion fencing to avoid and minimize impacts to the population, Moni stated she has several questions regarding an appropriate buffer, if these plants could be permanently impacted by construction activities, what are the specific (Detailed plan, detailed timeline, and construction activities) construction activities that would be occurring near population.
 - AECOM stated that the project had an overall 5 year construction timeline (spilt into multiple segments that would be constructed simultaneously) It is anticipated that all road reroutes would be construction prior to the main line. AECOM will reach out to Texas Central for more detail, but a detailed breakdown of schedule for this area may be difficult prior to further engineering design.
 - Moni stated that relocation of the individuals was not an option anymore because Dr. Smeins only had a 5% success rate recently.
 - Moni expressed concerns regarding secondary impacts to the individuals. AECOM needs to provide more details regarding specifics of construction activities that would occur near individuals.
 - Erin mentioned that possibly we could look at mitigation measures such as timing/seasonality of construction. Amanda also further explained that Erin was speaking about timing/seasonality of construction specifically at the location in proximity to the NLT population and not along the entire rail.
 - AECOM explained that FRA/TC is aware that areas not surveyed would require mitigation.
- ROW/Property where population found
 - Transmission Line ROW – AECOM asked USFWS about involving CenterPoint in the BA/BO discussion since the NLT population was in their maintained ROW and Moni said that would be something that would happen down the line and she didn't see a need to engage them at this point.
 - USFWS states that the population appeared to have adapted to an area that has been altered (i.e., active maintain electrical transmission ROW)
- BA / BO
 - Effects determination - Amanda explained that we are all on the same page in trying to avoid impacting the population of NLT.
 - Moni was pleased and stated that it appears that we are on the right track but just need more details to be sure appropriate measures will be in place.

*FRA and AECOM Management had to leave the call at 1:35
Everybody was thanked for their time as the meeting ran late (1:50 pm).*

ACTION ITEMS:

- A collective decision was made to have another meeting in 4 weeks when USFWS would have additional time to review the report and project specifics.
- TCRR and FRA will provide USFWS with specific information regarding construction activities near the NLT populations to help assess whether there would be any secondary impacts.

DISCUSSION POINTS:

- Safety Minute – As summer approached remember to wear sunscreen and protection while performing outdoor activities.
- Updates and Continued Discussions
 - Reviewed March 11 Email for construction schedule timeline (rail versus road)
 - The road rerouting would have to be done as one of the first steps of this sequence; late summer/early Fall 2020; and work in the alignment is to begin September 2020
 - Major earth work 4 month period and then the following year would be fill activities
 - USFWS is mostly worried about secondary concerns. With avoidance and maintaining existing hydrology the population (based on the size, surveys results, presence within transmission line ROW) should continue to thrive post-construction. Therefore indirect affects (dust) is the primary concern. Some additional conservation measures to include could be:
 - Could we maintain the tree line between proposed road and transmission line, particularly the western treed area (USFWS is basing this measure based on existing College Station /TxDOT population). This could be used as the “first line of defense”
 - TCRR will evaluate with engineers but it does not appear to be a concern for the forested areas west of the transmission (next to the proposed road). Engineering will need to look further into the treed areas east of the transmission line and next to existing road
 - If forested area is removed, could possibly look at modified dust suppression (i.e. water truck, but depends on length running to minimize run-off). TCRR clarified that dust suppression would not be to saturation (to minimize costs of water)
 - Since this would be formal consultation – this would need to be incorporated as Conservation measures
 - What is the buffer between the existing road and the population? What is the plan for the existing road, would the area be restored?
 - TCRR anticipates that the road would be abandoned in place above the population, and would only be demolished when it is under/in-conflict with the proposed centerline

- Need to be able to define the type of temporary fencing and construction fencing (i.e. orange exclusion fencing? Need to be sure to define how the exclusion areas are defined.
 - The schedule is slightly misleading because we will not be doing year road activities
 - Greatest impacts from dust during blooming or rosettes. Blooming is approximately 6 weeks during late October-early November and there are exposed rosettes in spring.
 - Could also include biological monitors while near site to make sure that direct and indirect are avoided or minimized.
 - Need to understand the mowing schedule from the utility.
 - USFWS suggests that conservation measures discussed about could be carried forward for other plant species.
- USFWS has a good relationship with CenterPoint for conservation measures on NLT. They already have avoidance and minimization techniques in place. USFWS would like FRA/TCRR to coordinate with CenterPoint NLT contact. FRA maybe able to incorporate similar measures already performed by CenterPoint into the BA. USFWS would also like TCRR to coordinate construction timing. USFWS would like to minimize ongoing activities at the site by multiple parties (CenterPoint maintenance and TCRR construction at same time).
- Revised delisting criteria for NLT should be posted soon to the federal register. Conservation and preservation of existing sites, or areas for suitable habitat is allowed if plants are taken (or not surveyed).
 - CenterPoint is actively looking for conservation sites and suitable habitat

ACTION ITEMS:

- TCRR to confirm easement is maintained by CenterPoint
- TCRR to review with design build team if engineering can minimize tree removal adjacent to population
- USFWS to provide CenterPoint NLT contact
- AECOM to reach out to CenterPoint to coordinate existing maintenance procedures, conservation, and preservation measures, and facilities TCRR engineering coordination on schedule with CenterPoint.

Jeff Hill provided information regarding a Houston Toad that was found during construction in Leon County (East of I-45 in Centerville, TX) by a biological monitor. He described the Process of fencing and biological monitors.

-Foot surveys as clearing is happening (ahead of clearing).

-

-Silt fencing (as exclusion) at edge of LOD to ensure HT is not entering the cleared area during construction. Bury fencing about 1 foot. Sometimes toads will stay at silt fence until after construction and will be found when the fencing is removed.

-Trapping after clearing (cover boards, pit falls) to remove any trapped HT. Should observe less and less wildlife overtime and frequency/level effort can become less overtime. After rain, trapping needs to occur again and the integrity of the fencing needs to be checked.

-After final grade, pull up silt fence and allow revegetation to occur. Restore with natives and if not then leave bare. DO NOT USE INVASIVE SEED MIXES EVEN IF REQUESTED BY LANDOWNERS.

-Try and limit disturbance by using already disturbed areas for staging/laydown. Limit spills from vehicles. Limit to "regular" vehicles and trucks after removing fencings and reseeding. This will reduce likelihood of disturbing revegetation and Houston Toads.

DISCUSSION POINTS

USFWS appreciated the red-lined version of the BA from FRA and stated that the revisions were clear and resolved any questions on the LFSV and HT topics (excluding compensatory mitigation that we were discussing further today).

USFWS stated that since the last call they have reviewed TCRR's concerns and had discussions with the Regional Office. Two main points came out of those discussions:

1. Any changes to the project LOD resulting in a change to the impacts to protected species as currently described in the BA, would result in TCRR having to reinitiate Section 7 process and the USFWS would need to reassess and redraft a new BO.
2. While the language still needs to be drafted, the USFWS believes that a compensatory mitigation plan would need to be developed that would include a strong funding mechanism (not controlled by USFWS) for land acquisition, management, and monitoring of required acreage. USFWS is strongly recommending land acquisition with a long term management plan and protection in perpetuity before construction begins in the unsurveyed suitable habitat.

TCRR expressed concern that the first item removes any incentive for TCRR to continue to refine and reduce impacts to protected species as detailed design progresses. USFWS stated that changes to the Project would require updating the BA and reinitiating Section 7 Consultation.

USFWS is discussing further what the language should be for the compensatory mitigation and financial plan. USFWS anticipates that it will need to include language for acquisition and management to be in place prior to construction. They are open for the acquisition of land to be in place prior to construction in suitable habitat (that have not been surveyed for 3 consecutive years).

- Moni would like to run the Suitable habitat language by the Regional Office (Michelle) so that TCRR COULD start construction in suitable habitat if species is not present (i.e. surveyed for 3 years and not present), since TCRR will not be mitigating for impact to those areas.
- USFWS will also include timeline language in the BO, similar to that the construction must begin within 5 years of the BO
- USFWS stated that work cannot begin in unsurveyed suitable habitat until mitigation /off sets, are completed for the proposed impacts to these habitats. At this time, the Service is requesting land acquisition of suitable habitat, with long term management plan. We discussed developing at a minimum a funding mechanism. TCRR asked if that also includes funding, could

the language include a contingency plan. The concern is making sure that they can find and purchase enough property with suitable habitat in place prior to start of construction within impacted unsurveyed habitat. Therefore, TCRR would like to identify what the contingency options may be available if land purchase is not fully viable.

- USFWS feels that this is the language in the BA that they don't agree with.
- USFWS has had issues with other projects and land acquisition (happened with CenterPoint powerline. Because they were unable to acquire the acreage required (< 40 acres).
- Resources are limited for mitigation banking (Lady Bird Johnson, TPWD) so USFWS does not know of a specific resource to reach out too for a "Plan B" Purchase
 - Would like to see an effort by TCRR to acquire appropriate mitigation

USFWS stated that the Financial Plan to be developed by TCRR and that USFWS need to discuss further with Regional Office to determine the language for the Financial Package option. USFWS requested that both parties start drafting language for further discussion. TCRR volunteered to begin drafting language to provide to FRA and USFWS for review.

Denise is no longer on the project and Amber is concentrating on LFSV since 2016. Amber is going to have another review on the other species to make sure there are no other concerns, and also look at the previous response matrix.

USFWS will be focusing on the BA/BO process and will not be providing further comments on the AFEIS.

ACTION ITEMS:

- USFWS will continue further discussions with Regional Office regarding today's questions/concerns on mitigation and timing.
- TCRR to draft preliminary language on compensatory mitigation and financial package/planning for FRA to review.
- USFWS/FRA/TCRR will schedule another meeting to discuss again the timing of implementation and compensatory mitigation.

USFWS Clarification Provided After Meeting (3/18/2020):

- USFWS provided clarification regarding changes to impacts and reinitiation of formal consultation. They stated that if a final BA is provided to the Service, and the Service provides a Biological Opinion (BO) based on that information then yes, reinitiation of the formal Section 7 process would be required. The Service at that point would need to reevaluate the new information in the BA and update their BO.
- USFWS provided an update to text stating "USFWS stated that work cannot begin in unsurveyed suitable habitat until mitigation /off sets, are completed for the proposed impacts to these habitats. At this time, the Service is requesting land acquisition of suitable habitat, with long term management plan. We discussed developing at a minimum a funding mechanism. TCRR asked if that also includes funding, could the language include a contingency plan."

- USFWS provided further clarification stating “The BO’s are written with a 5 year timeline. At the end of the 5 years, if HSR has not started work or completed off-sets then HSR may have to request a extension of time for the existing BO or reinstate depending on project status. FWS did not state work must begin in 5 years. It is up to HSR when construction will start for the project. HSR can start construction in suitable habitat where species were surveyed and not present. As outlined in the BA for NLT the total is 387 acres.”
- USFWS stated “The Service does not approve of the use of the term contingency planning when discussing offsets. The Service anticipates that through consultation, we can jointly agree on an appropriate and feasible plan for offsetting impacts addressing TCCR concerns.” During the meeting TCR stated “contingency” as in if there is not enough occupied land to be purchased and set aside as conservation easement with long term management and monitoring, then what is the next step? It is now the understanding that this would be addressed if needed in close coordination with USFWS.
- USFWS asked for clarification and stated “ Is the intent here to state that, “the concern is to find and purchase property with suitable habitat in place prior to start of construction in unsurveyed habitat for areas that are proposed to be impacted”? “ This is correct. For the areas that were not surveyed that are proposed to be impacted (mitigation/offset acres) the concern is making sure TCR can find and purchase enough property that is appropriate to USFWS for mitigation/offset.
- USFWS confirmed that “Contacts have changed for the lead point of contact for this project. Denise Ruffino is no longer working on this project; Amber is lead. Since 2016, Amber has been coordinating on LFSV; she will now review the other species to make sure there are no other concerns.”

Dear Mr. Carter:

The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) is the lead federal agency preparing the Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the proposed Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail (HSR) Project (Project), as required by the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA). Texas Central Railroad, LLC (TCRR) and its subsidiaries are proposing to construct and operate the Dallas to Houston HSR system and are responsible for Project development and implementation. The Project would intersect the Texas counties of Dallas, Ellis, Navarro, Freestone, Limestone, Leon, Madison, Grimes, Waller, and Harris.

This letter is regarding the proposed impacts of the above project to a portion of the Fort Boggy State Park. A map is provided in **Attachment A** identifying the location of the proposed project and the impacts to the Fort Boggy State Park.

As a Section 4(f) protected resource, Fort Boggy State Park is subject to protection under Section 4(f) of the U.S. Department of Transportation Act of 1966. The Section 4(f) process is simplified when there are only *de minimis* impacts from the proposed project. FRA makes a *de minimis* determination of a project's Section 4(f) impacts and the Section 4(f) process is satisfied and no further action is needed.

Fort Boggy State Park Description

Fort Boggy State Park is located on either side of IH-45, a four-lane divided highway, approximately four miles south of Centerville (**Attachment A: Figure**). The 1,847-acre park is owned and managed by the Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD). Coordination between FRA and the TPWD identified the primary purpose of Fort Boggy State Park is for recreation (camping, picnicking, hiking, mountain biking, swimming, small boating, fishing, hunting, and ranger-led programs), including access to the property and the ability of park users to undertake the permitted recreational activities within property.

The portion of Fort Boggy State Park on the west side of IH-45 (approximately 1/3 of the park or 600 acres according to the TPWD and known herein as the west side property) is undeveloped with forest and

wetlands; it can be used for hunting during the designated seasons with permission from the TPWD.¹ The west side property is not routinely accessible to park users due to locked gates with “No Trespassing” signs (five along the boundary with IH-45). In 2018, the TPWD indicated that future planning for the west side property could include trails and an equestrian area; however, realization of such a plan would depend on the ability of the TPWD to secure funding for a permanent access center, driveway, parking, and supporting staff. Therefore, for the foreseeable future, activities on the west property are limited to seasonal hunting.

The portion of the property on the east side of IH-45 (approximately 2/3 of the park or 1,247 acres and known herein as the east side property) contains developed and undeveloped areas. The developed area includes a 15-acre lake, a day use area, campsites, and five cabins. The lake is open to small boats, canoes, and kayaks. The undeveloped areas are forested with hiking trails. The nearest of the east side property amenities to the limits of disturbance (LOD) is a trail that is more than a quarter-mile from the LOD. Access to the east side property is from Highway 75.

Potential Use of Fort Boggy State Park

FRA assessed the potential for project impacts to Fort Boggy State Park from each alternative, including loss of property, and impacts on park activities related to changes in access, noise, vibration and visual impacts. FRA assessed each of these concerns as they relate to potential for adverse effects to the features, attributes, or activities on the property.

Incorporation of land: The LODs of Build Alternatives A, B, D and E are approximately seven miles west of the property. Build Alternatives A (preferred), B, D and E would not permanently incorporate any portion Fort Boggy State Park and, because of the distance between the LODs and the park, no constructive use of Fort Boggy State Park would occur with those alternatives. No adverse effect on the features, attributes, or activities would occur under Build Alternatives A, B, D or E that qualify the property for protection under Section 4(f). Please note that FRA identified Build Alternative A as the preferred alternative in the Draft EIS and plans to identify it as the preferred alternative in the Final EIS as well.

The proposed viaduct of Build Alternatives C and F (Segment 3C) would be aligned on the west side of IH-45, primarily within the existing highway right-of-way. However, because the existing right-of-way is insufficiently wide to accommodate the existing highway, reconstruction of the existing frontage road and the proposed LODs and drainage improvements, permanent incorporation of a portion of the west side property of Fort Boggy State Park into the proposed transportation use would be required. Specifically, permanent incorporation of approximately 67 acres (3.6 percent) of the overall park property (including east and west side properties) would occur in the form of a strip of land the length of the property along the west side of IH-45.

Incorporation of a portion of the property by Segment 3C in Build Alternatives C and F would reduce the seasonal hunting area on the west side of the park by approximately 11 percent. Although Build Alternatives C and F would reduce the amount of land that is available for hunting on the property, approximately 89 percent of the property on the west side of IH-45 would remain as a single, large landholding and available for the hunting as the primary function of that portion of the property. For this reason, although a permanent incorporation of a portion of the west side park property would occur with

Build Alternatives C or F, there would be no adverse effects on the features, attributes, or activities that qualify the property for protection under Section 4(f).

Access: None of the Build Alternatives would change access to the east side of Fort Boggy State Park during construction or operation of the project. No adverse effect on the features, attributes, or activities would occur under Build Alternatives A, B, D or E that qualify the property for protection under Section 4(f) because the alternatives would be approximately seven miles from the park.

As described above, the portion of the west side property that would be permanently incorporated into Segment 3C, if Build Alternative C or F is selected, is currently undeveloped, forested land on the west side property that does not contain developed recreational features. The viaduct would enable Build Alternatives C and F to provide for continued access under the structure to the west side property during project operations.

During construction of Build Alternatives C or F, one or more access gates to the west side property of Fort Boggy State Park along IH-45 may have to be closed. However, existing gates along the north, west and south sides of the property would not be affected by the project; thus, public access to the property from these other gates would be unchanged. TCRR would coordinate with TPWD during final design and construction planning with specific regard to providing access to the west side property from gates along IH-45. TCRR would consider restricting construction activities in the area of Fort Boggy State Park during the time period(s) when TPWD enables hunting access to the west side property. By restricting construction activities, TCRR would minimize or avoid, where practicable, disruption to planned and programmed seasonal hunting events on the west side property of Fort Boggy State Park. TCRR in coordination with the TPWD would make public notice of hunting restrictions and temporary closure of gates along IH-45 during project construction. Although the number of access points to the west side property would be reduced during construction of Build Alternatives C or F, access to the west side of the park would be provided and there would be no adverse effect on the features, attributes, or activities that qualify the property for protection under Section 4(f).

Noise: Build Alternatives A, B, D and E would be approximately seven miles from the park and would have no noise impact on the park.

The noise analysis in the Draft EIS (**Section 3.4.5 Noise and Vibration**) identified maximum distances within which a construction noise impact from the project could occur, 200 feet from the LOD to a residence during daytime hours and 630 feet from the LOD to a residence during nighttime hours. The developed recreational areas and facilities of Fort Boggy State Park, which are located on the east side property, are more than a quarter-mile (1,320 feet) through forest from LOD of Build Alternatives C and F. The 1,320-foot distance is more than twice the nighttime distance and more than six times the daytime distance for potential noise impacts. Therefore, no construction noise impact from Segment 3C of Build Alternatives C or F would not occur to the east side property.

The noise analysis in the Draft EIS identified a maximum distance within which an operational noise impact from the project could occur (1,300 feet daytime and nighttime when trains are present). The developed recreational areas and facilities of Fort Boggy State Park, which are located on the east side property, are 1,320 feet from the LOD, which is greater than the distance in which a noise impact could occur.

In addition to the foregoing methodology, the evaluation for Fort Boggy State Park also considered the noise analysis for a nearby residential property. The Draft EIS noise analysis predicted noise levels at representative locations along the Build Alternatives. Although the analysis did not specifically analyze Fort Boggy State Park, the analysis of Segment 3C in Build Alternatives C and F included a residential location approximately 4,000 feet north of the park, on the west side of IH-45 (known as LT-13). The residence is adjacent to (0 feet from) the existing frontage road with the home structure approximately 50 feet from the rear property line, a boundary shared with the IH-45 right-of-way line. The analysis at this residential location is helpful for understanding potential noise impacts at Fort Boggy State Park because the residence is adjacent to the IH-45 ROW, as is also the case with the west portion of the park property. In addition, the noise analysis for the residential property used a unit of measurement that considers daytime and nighttime noise exposure of the property, which is known as the equivalent, day-night sound level (Ldn). This unit of measure is applicable to the park property because the TPWD permits daytime as well as nighttime uses on the park property as a whole. The noise analysis for LT-13 determined that the existing, equivalent day-night (Ldn) Project sound level is 62 decibels. The noise impact analysis provides a Project noise level of 58 (Ldn). Using the FTA's noise impact methodology and noise impact criteria figure, a Project noise level of 58 decibels Ldn is below the 59 decibels Ldn threshold for impact. Thus, no operational noise impact would occur at the residence or at Fort Boggy State Park.

On the west side property of Fort Boggy State Park, a temporary construction noise impact would occur to approximately one third of the property along the length of IH-45 (within 200 feet of the LOD), affecting seasonal hunting activities within that portion of the west side property. During operations, the impacted area would be approximately half of the west side property along the length of IH-45 (within 1,300 feet of the LOD) when trains are present.

Although a construction noise impact would occur to portions of the west side property under Build Alternatives C or F, in general, construction and operational noise would have no adverse effect on the features, attributes, or activities (public recreational facilities) that qualify the property for protection under Section 4(f).

Vibration Impacts: The vibration analysis in Chapter 3.4, Noise and Vibration predicted that no operational vibration impacts would occur at representative receptors along the LOD, including Segment 3C, in Build Alternatives C and F. Use of vibration-absorbing techniques to reduce or eliminate vibration in the viaduct structure would also reduce or eliminate the potential for the viaduct to transmit vibration from train operations to and through the ground.

Vibration from temporary construction activities related to Build Alternative C or F could occur. During final design and if Build Alternative C or F is selected, TCRR would conduct additional vibration assessment during final design of the viaduct. The purpose of the assessment would be to determine if a vibration impact to the west side property could occur, evaluate specific final design measures (such as track ballast and track fastener types) to reduce or eliminate the potential for vibration to occur on the west side property, identify additional feasible and reasonable mitigation measures, if needed, to address vibration impacts, and incorporate all vibration-reducing and mitigation measures into the final project design. FRA would review these evaluations prior to construction. Any feasible mitigation would be stipulated in the post-ROD Mitigation Monitoring Program, which will be independently managed by FRA.

Although a construction vibration impact could occur to portions of the west side property under Build Alternatives C or F, further study and mitigation commitments would be applied as warranted. No

operational vibration impact would occur; as such, there would be no adverse effect on the features, attributes, or activities (public recreational facilities) that qualify the property for protection under Section 4(f).

Visual: The HSR viaduct may be visible from areas of the east side of the park that are actively managed for recreational activities. The viaduct would be elevated above the existing ground approximately 40 feet to the top of the rail. This height is almost to the height of the tallest trees on the property, which would act to shield views of the viaduct from users of the property at ground-level. The forested condition of the property dominates foreground, middleground and background views of east side park users during leaf-on as well as leaf-off seasons. The forest would remain dominant in user views during leaf-on or leaf-off conditions, although portions of the viaduct and train operations may be partially visible through the trees during leaf-off conditions.

Hunters' views in forested areas of the park that are closer to the viaduct (east and west sides of the park) are also dominated by the forest in leaf-on and leaf-off conditions, but the existing IH-45 infrastructure and traffic are also visible depending on the user location and the type and density of the vegetation between the user and the highway. Under the same conditions, the viaduct in Segment 3C may also be part of hunters' views through the forest.

Although the viaduct may be visible to park users, the visual change would not substantially impair the activities, features or attributes (public recreational facilities) that qualify the property for protection under Section 4(f).

All Possible Planning to Minimize Harm: TCRR would work with the TPWD to incorporate park-related stipulations into minimization and mitigation commitments to address the impacts of Build Alternatives C or F, if selected, and to the extent feasible. Minimization and mitigation is not warranted for Build Alternatives A, B, D, or E because no use of Fort Boggy State Park would occur under those Build Alternatives.

Under Section 4(f),² FRA made a preliminary finding in the Draft EIS that the use of Fort Boggy State Park by Build Alternatives C or F, including all measures to minimize harm, would have a *de minimis* impact on the property because the proposed permanent incorporation of a portion of the west side property would not adversely affect the activities, features, or attributes that qualify Fort Boggy State Park for protection under Section 4(f). The preliminary *de minimis* impact finding was included for public review and comment in the Draft EIS published on December 17, 2017.

Should Build Alternatives C or F be selected, FRA and TCRR are committed to undertaking additional coordination with the TPWD with regard to addressing impacts and will implement specific minimization and mitigation measures to reduce or eliminate the impacts to the extent reasonably feasible. Under Section 4(f) of the U.S. Department of Transportation Act of 1966, and after review of the project impacts and mitigation commitments, FRA's opinion is that the impact of Build Alternatives C or F to Fort Boggy State Park will be minimal and will not adversely alter or affect the activities, features, or attributes that qualify the resource for protection under Section 4(f).

The TPWD must concur in writing with FRA's *de minimis* impact finding to complete the Section 4(f) process for the property.

Your written concurrence that this project will not adversely affect the activities, features, and attributes of TPWD is necessary in order for FRA to make the Section 4(f) *de minimis* determination.

To acknowledge that you have been notified of the intent for FRA to apply the Section 4(f) *de minimis* finding and your agreement that the activities, features, and attributes of the facility will not be adversely affected, please sign below and return the signed copy to Kevin Wright of my staff at the letterhead address above. FRA will make your signed copy part of the Section 4(f) letter part of the record for the Project, and your concurrence will enable FRA to complete the Final EIS and Section 4(f) Evaluation.

Please also inform the FRA in writing if you do not concur with FRA's *de minimis* finding. Your prompt response is appreciated, no later than 15 days after receipt of this letter.

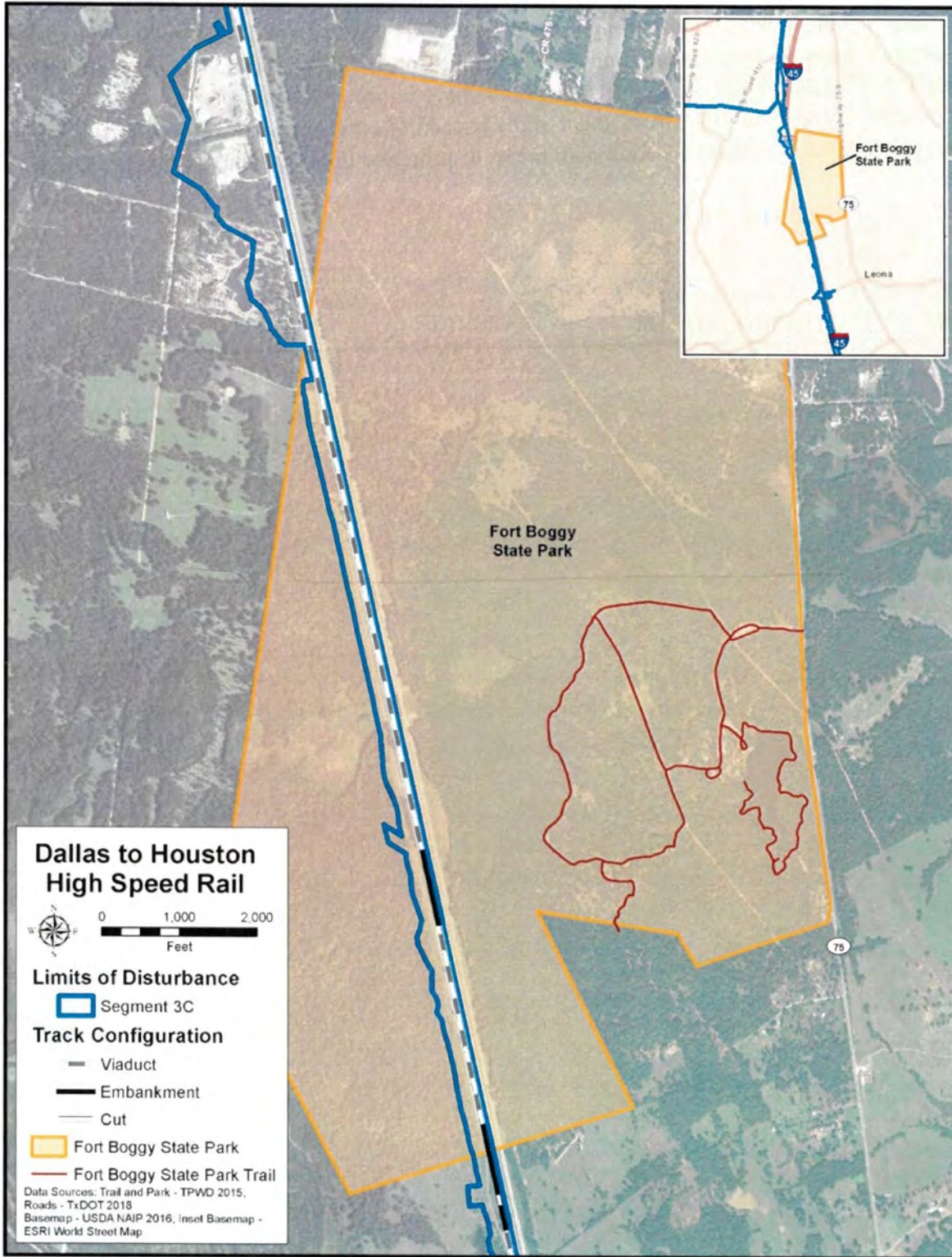

The Texas Parks and Wildlife Department (TPWD) received the February 12, 2020 letter requesting concurrence with the United States Department of Transportation (USDOT) Federal Railroad Administration's (FRA) *de minimis* determination regarding Section 4(f) of the USDOT Act (49 U.S.C. 303(a)) for impacts to Fort Boggy State Park (Leon County, Texas) associated with Build Alternatives C and F of the proposed Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail Project. TPWD does not concur with FRA's *de minimis* finding.

TPWD finds FRA's Section 4(f) *de minimis* finding to be incorrect. TPWD does not agree that the direct taking of 67 acres of parkland and other indirect impacts by the proposed project options will not adversely affect the activities, features, and attributes that qualify Fort Boggy State Park for protection under Section 4(f). Additionally, the Gift Deed that conveyed Fort Boggy State Park to TPWD for perpetual stewardship in the public trust transfers ownership of the property from TPWD to a third party if any portion of the conveyed land is used for any purpose other than conservation. For further discussion of TPWD's Section 4(f) concerns, please refer to TPWD's February 20, 2018 comment letter to FRA and the United States Army Corps of Engineers regarding the proposed project's Draft Environmental Impact Statement and Section 404 Permit Applications.

DISCUSSION POINTS

- FRA traveled to Texas to meet with the counties in the study area to solicit feedback as well as discuss any outstanding questions or comments on the Dallas to Houston HSR Project not raised through the public comment period.
- The Dallas to Houston HSR Project is a privately funded project being led by TCR. FRA is evaluating the project in order to render a safety determination on the Tokaido Shinkansen system TCR proposes to use. Many of the comments raised by UPRR relate to the design of the Project, which is being led by TCR. Typically, a federal agency undergoes the NEPA process because they are funding a project, but that is not the case on this Project.
- FRA released the Draft EIS on December 22, 2017 and the public comment period closed on March 9, 2018. FRA hosted 11 public hearings on the Draft EIS and received approximately 20,000 comments on the Project. FRA's current work focuses on responding to the public comments, conducting Section 106 consultation, meeting with stakeholders and agencies and conducting environmental justice outreach. Additionally, FRA received comments about the ridership data and will conduct a high-level evaluation to determine if the process TCR undertook is reasonable.
- Tyson has been meeting with TCR to work through potential issues. TCR and UPRR have mostly worked through ROW challenges in Dallas County (three miles) and the areas in the rural counties (Hearn Yard is west of the alignments), but still have a lot of work to do in Harris County along Hempstead Road (Eureka Hub). This is a particularly challenging corridor and UPRR would recommend a meeting of all of the stakeholders – Harris County, City of Houston, Houston METRO, Gulf Coast Rail District, UPRR, TCR, utility providers, etc.
- The crossings in general are nothing new, but UPRR needs to understand electrification and signaling of TCR's line. Also, UPRR is asking TCR not to box in their lines by creating walls they can't navigate through or around.
- UPRR currently has 30-35 grade crossings in the Hempstead Corridor. Will they be able to ever clear these if the viaduct is there? UPRR also noted that Post Oak is a key corridor for the UPRR and that they are working with the City of Houston.
- UPRR is asking for 102 feet of separation from their line in order to operate a passenger line safely. UPRR does not plan to take on any liability if there is a UPRR trail derailment that impacts the passenger rail since UPRR was already there.
- UPRR does not feel that putting the two railroads (UPRR and TCR) together is an acceptable answer.
- UPRR would be willing to review the mitigation measures in the Draft EIS related to their lines.
- UPRR suggests that FRA call a meeting of all of the stakeholders if TCR cannot resolve the challenges in the Hempstead corridor.

DISCUSSION

- FRA invited Dallas County representatives to meet on the Dallas to Houston HSR Project to solicit feedback as well as discuss any outstanding questions or comments not raised through the public comment period.
- The Dallas to Houston HSR Project is a privately funded project being led by TCR. FRA is evaluating the project in order to render a safety determination on the Tokaido Shinkansen system TCR proposes to use. TCR is designing the project and FRA is evaluating that design with limited input in the planning of the project. For this meeting, FRA will facilitate a conversation between TCR and the county.
- FRA did not analyze the economic viability of the project. If TCR were to apply for and receive federal funds FRA would have to review the economic viability to determine if the loan could be repaid.
- FRA released the Draft EIS on December 22, 2017 and the public comment period closed on March 9, 2018. FRA hosted 11 public hearings on the Draft EIS and received approximately 20,000 comments on the Project. FRA's current work focuses on responding to the public comments, conducting Section 106 consultation, meeting with stakeholders and agencies and conducting environmental justice outreach.
- The City of Lancaster spoke with TCR early on in the process and voiced some concerns related to the alignment and the Lancaster airport. TCR modified the alignment to resolve those concerns.
- Commissioner Price voiced concerns related to potential impacts along Pleasant Run Road and Wintergreen Road. TCR adjusted the alignment (to be reflected in the Final EIS) to span over Pleasant Run Road and Wintergreen Road. The typical pier spacing is 100-110 feet. TCR and their design-build team can work with the county to determine the pier locations (median versus edge of ROW) and the full ROW needed to allow an expansion to those roads in the future.
- Commissioner Price also voiced concerns related to the location of the Trainset Maintenance Facility (TMF) and its impacts to the inland port. TCR plans to move the TMF to a parcel at Simpson Stuart Road and IH-20. They provided mapping for the county attendees to review.
- TCR is working with the City of Dallas, UPRR and the USACE on the approach to the station and the necessary permissions (Section 408 crossing of the levee) for the Project. TCR is revising their engineering in preparation for the Final EIS and will provide that to FRA later this year.

- Commissioner Price noted that there are some concerned constituents in the southern sector of Dallas. TCR asked for Commissioner Price's assistance in scheduling a meeting to speak with them about the Project and to work together to determine how to best manage the impacts.
- Judge Jenkins, Michael Morris and Commissioner Price noted that the Project will benefit the entire region, but the southern sector will carry the burden of the Project. They asked TCR to consider how best to outreach and engage these residents, which could include DBE goals for contractor and employees.
- There was some discussion related to the TxDOT Loop 9 project in Ellis County. TCR met with TxDOT and has modified the alignment in the area to accommodate for the project.
- From a safety perspective, TCR noted that all thoroughfares and access points will remain open. There will be no grade crossings along the alignment that would require gates/waiting.
- How does TCR propose to protect piers within medians that could be struck by large semi-trucks? The system will incorporate rail protection and TxDOT protection on the ground that would hopefully stop a vehicle prior to it hitting the pier.
- TCR committed to meeting with local fire, police and emergency response representatives to discuss concerns, resource needs, training and access. TCR will need to work through the safety issues in order to receive their safety ruling from FRA.

- FRA invited Ellis County representatives to meet on the Dallas to Houston HSR Project to solicit feedback as well as discuss any outstanding questions or comments not raised through the public comment period.
- The Dallas to Houston HSR Project is a privately funded project being led by TCR. FRA is evaluating the project in order to render a safety determination on the Tokaido Shinkansen system TCR proposes to use. Many of the comments raised by Ellis County relate to the design of the Project, which is being led by TCR. Typically, a federal agency undergoes the NEPA process because they are funding a project, but that is not the case on this Project. FRA will facilitate a conversation between TCR and the county.
- FRA released the Draft EIS on December 22, 2017 and the public comment period closed on March 9, 2018. FRA hosted 11 public hearings on the Draft EIS and received approximately 20,000 comments on the Project. FRA's current work focuses on responding to the public comments, conducting Section 106 consultation, meeting with stakeholders and agencies and conducting environmental justice outreach. Additionally, FRA received comments about the ridership data and will conduct a high-level evaluation to determine if the process TCR undertook is reasonable.
- Does FRA have a role in determining the economic viability of the Project? There is no federal funding attached to the Project so the federal government will not review the viability. Additionally, the NEPA process does not require that economic viability be part of the Purpose and Need. It is an objective of TCR.
- FRA is evaluating the ridership because FRA incorporates the estimates in air quality, transportation and economic assessment of the Project. TCR noted that approximately 15M people travel between Dallas and Houston. According to TCR, their estimate removed delivery drivers and travelers that begin their trip beyond Dallas or continue their trip beyond Houston. What remained was the basis for the number of people who could become a rider. TCR also noted that most of the ridership is anticipated to come from vehicles.
- There was a discussion on the cost of a ticket. TCR noted an average plane ticket (accounting for tickets purchased in advance, at the last minute, etc.) would cost \$174. A first class ticket on the HSR train, purchased at the last minute, would compete with that price point. TCR believes that 90 percent of the trips (including home to final destination) would be faster via the HSR than driving. They expect a target ridership of 5M people with growth to 7-10M within the first 10-15 years. TCR completed an investment-grade study for HSR in this corridor.
- The county noted that there may be an environmental benefit for the state, but for local residents in Ellis County or the City of Ennis there are no realized benefits to support the Project.

There is concern about the dirt/fill needed to support the Project and where TCR will get it. TCR will “balance” cut and fill where possible, buy it on the open market (much of the HSR is in proximity to freight lines) or haul it from parcels they own. They will not mine from adjacent parcels unless the landowner and TCR have come to an agreement to that effect.

- TCR distributed information from the EIS and some revised maps to the Ellis County representatives. The overall alignment is about 50 percent earthen embankment and 50 percent viaduct. The train operates in a sealed corridor which means there are no crossings along the alignment. Each intersection is grade separated and the majority will be rail over road with a vertical clearance that meets TxDOT standards (ranging from 16.5-22 feet). The embankments will not block off public roads. If the Project results in a loss of access for a private landowner, TCR will provide a new access point to them.
- The Draft EIS evaluated a conceptual engineering phase. TCR has not completed final design for the Project. Their design-build team will refine the engineering to determine exact placement of bridge columns, road crossings, etc. The typical pier span is 100-110 feet, but if that’s not enough, TCR can work with the county to provide additional ROW clearance.
- TCR evaluated the rail/road crossings and is working to make them majority rail over road. If TCR needs to build a road over the rail, they will pay for the road. They will also ask for maintenance rights from the county. TCR will protect the road over rail crossings with fencing to protect the track down below. If TCR builds a bridge over the road and does something to the road below, they will pay to repair the road. If the county currently maintains a road under the rail they can continue to do that. TCR would ask that if maintenance or a modification is needed that TCR is alerted so that they can monitor for any potential impacts to operations.
- When the alignment is on embankment there will be fencing along the low side. The system will incorporate an intrusion protection system and camera system that would alert the operating center if anything goes through the fence (impacts from animals, weather issues, etc.).
- TCR will conduct maintenance on the system at night, which would typically be the only time people would be within the secured area of the system.
- TCR commits to working with all local emergency management on how to access the viaduct or embankment. TCR will not close any public roads and will coordinate with emergency management on access in general and specifically during construction. TCR anticipates long-term coordination protocols to address access, equipment needs, training, etc.
- TCR plans to construct an initial test track (30 miles) at a to be determined location. The full alignment will be constructed in tandem and in sections. This type of construction approach could lead to miscommunication between any number of construction representatives and emergency management personnel. TCR would like to initiate meetings with emergency management now to inform the development of the safety protocols and processes. Tim Birdwell will serve as a contact for TCR with Ellis County.
- TCR noted joint access roads adjacent to the rail. They clarified the purpose and designation of these roads in preparation for the Final EIS. All roads will be built and paid for by TCR. Some of these maintenance roads will be gravel roads for access and others may be paved. TCR will coordinate with landowners who may want to access these roads. TCR is proposing realigning a few public roads. If there are impacts to response times to emergency management, TCR would like to meet with the County to talk through the road modifications to see what can be done.
- Floodplains were another area of concern for Ellis County. The Project mapping includes the FEMA designated floodplains and TCR will span them on viaduct. TCR anticipates conducting analysis and will submit letters to FEMA for map revisions if those are required. TCR is not

blocking off drainage and will use culverts. TCR will take the responsibility for maintaining their culverts.

- How will the USACE oversee construction within a wetland? TCR will cause temporary impacts to wetlands during construction and will have to repair/revegetate them per USACE mitigation. TCR is coordinating with the USACE on other permissions for the Project.
- TCR recognizes that utility crossings will require a significant amount of coordination. They expect to raise some of the overhead electric towers, close or move oil and gas pipeline access, relocate water or wastewater lines, etc. All of that will be done at TCR's expense and they will work with County or utility owner to address it.
- What happens if a utility needs to cross the HSR ROW? TCR's agreement with that utility owner will outline the process, which may include boring under a bermed area.
- TCR will have a plan on how to secure the train. They will have a police force. All of this will be included in the safety planning of the Project.
- Will TCR allow any sort of cable or fiber optics in the ROW? Right now, TCR only plans to include what is being used to support the Project.
- Would it be possible to add a stop to the line in the future if ridership warranted it? Yes, the system would allow for that.
- Will FRA monitor the noise impacts once the line is operational? FRA would not monitor the noise on a continual basis.
- TCR noted that a lot of the land is tax-exempt now and would be added to the tax rolls with the Project.
- The County Judge's office will help coordinate additional meetings to talk through safety, including the construction process and rerouting of roads. It is important to consider roads that may be perceived as good alternatives, but could have extenuating conditions (historic flooding) that make them bad alternative for emergency response access.
- TCR proposed a small realignment in the Ellis County to FRA that would mitigate impacts and straighten the curvature. FRA plans to send a letter to newly impacted landowners about this change. They will send a copy of the letter to the County.
- TCR is evaluating wildlife crossings along the corridor and is working with experts on how best to design those so that wildlife chooses the crossing versus a road.
- FRA thanked everyone for attending the meeting and encouraged the County to meet with TCR and reach out via phone or email to FRA to discuss the Project.

DISCUSSION POINTS

- Commissioner Cagle welcomed everyone to the meeting and noted that the alignment impacts Harris County precincts 3 and 4 and the proposed station locations are in precinct 4. Harris County is supportive of the project, they just want to make sure that it's done right. The County's jurisdiction is mostly outside of Beltway 8 minus a bit near Jersey Village.
- FRA invited the counties in the study area to meet to solicit feedback as well as discuss any outstanding questions or comments on the Dallas to Houston HSR Project not raised through the public comment period.
- The Dallas to Houston HSR Project is a privately funded project being led by TCR. FRA is evaluating the project in order to render a safety determination on the Tokaido Shinkansen system TCR proposes to use. Many of the comments raised by the counties relate to the design of the Project, which is being led by TCR. Typically, a federal agency undergoes the NEPA process because they are funding a project, but that is not the case on this Project.
- FRA released the Draft EIS on December 22, 2017 and the public comment period closed on March 9, 2018. FRA hosted 11 public hearings on the Draft EIS and received approximately 20,000 comments on the Project. FRA's current work focuses on responding to the public comments, conducting Section 106 consultation, meeting with stakeholders and agencies and conducting environmental justice outreach. Additionally, FRA received comments about the ridership data and will conduct a high-level evaluation to determine if the process TCR undertook is reasonable.
- FRA is reviewing the existing conditions or affected environment to determine what updates need to be made to the document. Post-Hurricane Harvey floodplain changes will be incorporated into the design and document. Commissioner Cagle wants to make sure that the alignment is also available for hurricane evacuations. He asked TCR to calculate how many people they could evacuate from the region over a 48 hour period.
- Barbara asked for clarification on how FRA will address the comments. Each comment will receive a response and the comments/responses will be a new appendix to the Final EIS. For those comments that are more emotional than project based, FRA will likely respond with "comment noted" or "not germane to NEPA."
- FRA noted that they will likely publish the Final EIS next summer with a ROD by the end of the year. TCR would like to be under construction by 2019.
- Harris County wants to be sure that there are appropriate grade separations in place, particularly during construction, to allow for movement within the neighborhoods.

- TCR will address all of Lloyd's comments on the EIS that the county submitted to TCR. TCR has been working with Lloyd Smith (Harris County Engineering) to work through roadway crossings. The alignment will be completely on viaduct allowing for rail over roads in Harris County. This will allow for thoroughfare movement across the county. TCR will provide an updated profile to Lloyd for review. TCR believes the impacts through Harris County have been minimized and hopes to give the County flexibility to manage their roadways. TCR has not set the pier locations, but the spans are typically 100-110 feet.
- TCR is updating their design to accommodate the current 500-year flood, which will be the new 100-year flood level and is working through any valley storage loss. Harris County wants to be sure that flood control is on the same page with the data.
- TCR moved the TMF location in Harris County and will update the aerials. TCR will be grade separated along the full alignment and will maintain emergency routes
- TCR is hiring an architect to work on the station design in Harris County, which will undergo a standard development process
- Houston station locations – TCR's preferred site is the mall site and they will need to conduct traffic analysis on the stations
- TCR and Harris County will work out a process to discuss development projects that come through the planning commission and would require coordination with TCR. For example, there is a 2,000 acre Johnson development in the Hockley area near the alignment.
- TCR is working on the Hempstead Corridor knowing that there are a lot of ideas and stakeholders. Lloyd would like to be in the loop as decisions are made about Hempstead.
- TCR have entered into a joint ticketing agreement with Amtrak, so they will be working out how to transfer between the stations. They are also working out how to best connect to METRO's Northwest Transit Center. Harris County precincts 1 and 2 are east of the project and are interested in the improvement to connections to transit, environmental justice, etc.
- TCR confirmed that vertical clearance on all roads will follow TxDOT standards (minimum of 16.5 feet and a max of 22 feet). TCR has evaluated all of their road crossings and modified most to rail over road. There are approximately 10 locations of road over rail across the full alignment.
- TCR continues to conduct outreach to the counties to talk about emergency access.
- TxDOT does not have a regulatory role outside of ROW right now, but they may have rail inspectors in the future for the project. FRA has regulatory authority on the safety of the system. TCR has re-petitioned STB to take jurisdiction. If they assert jurisdiction, STB would have regulatory authority on the operation of the system.

DART Coordination Meeting

DISCUSSION POINTS

- AECOM provided a general update on the status of the Project and outlined the objectives for this meeting, which is to understand and document any challenges, concerns or questions DART may have related to the construction and operation of the Dallas to Houston HSR project, as well as any potential impacts to DART.
- One of the biggest challenges right now is the turnover of staff within the City of Dallas management team. The staffing changes have resulted in no one having a complete understanding of the relative magnitude of the HSR project and how this relates to TxDOT's horseshoe, DART's second downtown alignment, DART's streetcar, the TxDOT/NCTCOG' Core Express as well as other freeway improvements. It is DART's belief that no one is taking a comprehensive, cumulative look at these projects and the overall demand they will place on each other.
- DART projects from conceptual planning to revenue service take approximately 10 years. DART is assuming that the HSR project will be operating by 2025. With that in mind, DART is interested in the cumulative impacts so that they can look at their financial plan and determine how to best allocate their resources to implement their operational plans and improvements as well as services that support the HSR project. One of the big questions that DART is currently dealing with is how to prioritize the projects. Some of their current project discussions include:
 - Second downtown alignment (D2) for light rail
 - Expanded bus service in the southern sector
 - New bus connections in support of a future convention center hotel
 - Cotton Belt
 - Additional light rail station south of the Cedars Station
 - Additional streetcar lines that connect to uptown and Trinity Groves
- What level of coordination has occurred between DART and TCR regarding connectivity? Steve is aware of conversations at three levels.
 - Gary Thomas (CEO) and the TCR Executive team. His understanding of those conversations is that DART is fully supportive of the project and Gary has offered up DART services.
 - Tim McKay (EVP) and the TCR Executive Team. Steve understanding is that Tim offered up DART services as a technical representative for the design/build. DART also offered to operate the HSR for TCR.
 - Steve (VP of Rail Planning) and TCR Team, including Matthews Southwest. Steve's conversations have focused on local project implementation planning efforts. DART also provided TCR with data and information to aid in their project development.
- What, if any, assumptions has DART made about their system in relation to the project?
 - From a ridership perspective, DART assumed a third of the HSR riders would get in a personal car and drive away from the station; another third would walk away and grab a cab/Uber, etc.; a the final third would transfer into the DART system (bus or LRT).

- In support of this added ridership and general operational optimization, DART expanded their LRT platforms so that three car trains could be used.
- From a capacity perspective, DART recognizes that the first trains to arrive in the morning will probably carry business travelers who would hit the DART system during peak hours. With this in mind, DART is considering an expansion of the Trinity Railway Express (TRE) to Union Station via a lower connection. This would help take some stress off Union Station and create a multi-modal hub at the HSR station. In this scenario, DART may also try to connect the streetcar.
- DART met with ARUP to talk about bus staging areas, but no commitments were made by any parties. Steve thinks having as much separation of the various modes as possible is a good thing and suggests using visual, user friendly directional finding to efficiently move people to personal vehicle, ride share options, bus, transit, etc. This may also include enclosed (air conditioned) moving sidewalks. All of this goes back to the critical need of understanding the cumulative impacts of projects and making sure that room is preserved for what may need to be added in the future.
- DART has completed some geography work and recognizes curb space would be at a premium, so there would need to be sort of a staging area. DART offered up their code share ticketing through DART app, which is connected to Uber and Lyft. DART has had conversations about where cars back-up and wait; how do the cars get out of downtown; how much land area do you allocate to these things? There is a lot of coordination still to do. Also, how does security screening come into this process?
- What changes would DART anticipate making to its service plan if TCR opens a HSR station south of IH-30? Some of these have already been discussed and or completed.
 - For example, DART has already extended the station platforms to add train cars.
 - As previously mentioned, there is some discussion about extending TRE to Union Station.
 - DART may want to make some adjustments to rubber wheel services based on anticipated activity centers. Should they run a DLink shuttle route in downtown to create a local circulator to different points to downtown?
 - Is there a streetcar tie-in between Houston and McKinney that includes a DLink connection? Do you expand the streetcar to Knox/Henderson?
 - Is there a tie into D2? Could DART excavate a Skylink-type connection (as seen at DFW airport on the secure side that connects the terminals)?
- Does DART have any concerns about impacts to their infrastructure or operations? There are no anticipated impacts to any DART facilities, but the HSR line would cross the DART red and blue lines south of downtown.
 - There has been some early conversations about DART extended TRE service to the inland port, so they would want to make sure the HSR project wouldn't preclude that.
 - DART's general guideline for future planning is a request to the HSR team not to box anyone in prematurely and to do their best to account for something early on and if there's an opportunity to share cost for the extension of TRE, great.
 - Does HSR have a maintenance facility in south Dallas County? If so, DART may want to consider bus routes that tie to the Westmoreland and Camp Wisdom stations. DART working on TMA for inland port area to provide for bus services to move people to those employment centers.

- The general conclusion is DART sees HSR as a great opportunity to expand the benefits of transit, specifically within the region. DART wants to make sure that riders understand that it's safe and secure and that there are economic and environmental benefits.

DISCUSSION POINTS

- City staff circulated the Draft EIS among multiple departments. Their feedback focuses on the environment, traffic congestion mitigation and noise impacts. Their biggest concern is the protection of the Dallas levee system. They submitted comments specific to the 404 and 408 permission directly to the USACE
- Due to the similar alignments across all six Build Alternatives, their comments relate to impacts to affected homeowners and the overall planning of the Dallas terminal station. The big question is what can the city do around the station to make it a destination. Transportation, road management, pedestrian movement – the City wants the area to have density and walkability. The traffic circulation around the station is a critical item.
- The City noted that Matthews Southwest has applied for a grant to design a water gardens project near the sumps (generally between the station footprint the Trinity). It is largely undefined and no determinations have been made about ownership/maintenance. Will it be a park? Will it be part private land and part parks department?
- The City and its associated Trinity-related stakeholders had comments about pier placements, impacts to utilities outside the levees, impacts to the Central Wastewater Treatment Plant outfall channel. The City feels there are engineering solutions to all of these impacts.
- What vehicle would the City need to have in place to coordinate with TCRR on these types of impacts? Mark noted the City would likely use a Master Development Agreement between TCRR and the City of Dallas to cover a host of issues like land rights/ownership. The initiation of this type of agreement requires council approval and then can be managed by staff.
- Additionally, the City may also enter into a Master Crossing Agreement, something like what they use with DART, to address crossings of City roads. This would also require council approval.
- The City also needs to consider what their risk is if the project is abandoned during construction or only operates for a short period of time. What do they do with the permanent structure that was built?
- The City is very interested in coordinating with TCRR on seamless connectivity to multiple modes of transportation, particularly with the news that TCRR and Amtrak have come to terms on through ticketing. The station design accounts for large parking structures. Where are these people coming from and going to? How does the City plan for this level of service? What does this multi-modal station/transportation center look like for the City – streetcar, access to the Convention Center and/or Union Station, TRE Extension, DFW Core Express, IH-30 plans?
- The City feels that there are lots of opportunities to connect all of the transportation projects being discussed to ensure that the roadway network can accommodate the integration of all land use and transportation changes. Coordination across all of these projects would go a long way to minimizing or mitigating the impacts. AECOM recommendation the City meet with DART on these topics.
- In addition to the local circulation around the station, are there other transportation considerations such as effective park and ride options at different points within the City?
- As is, the City sees no fatal flaws with the Project.

DISCUSSION TOPICS

- AECOM provided a general update on the status of the Project and outlined the objectives for this meeting, which is to understand and document any challenges, concerns or questions the City of Houston may have related to the construction and operation of the Dallas to Houston HSR project, as well as any potential impacts to the City of Houston.
- The City's biggest issues are traffic growth – Houston needs six lanes on Hempstead Road and that can be configured as six general purpose or four general purpose and two managed lanes. The Major Thoroughfare Plan shows that expansion (they have the 100 feet of ROW necessary to make it happen). Then there is the first/last mile and the site of terminus in Houston at the mall site. Bringing people to that area and then dispersing them onto some of the busiest freeways in Texas. How do they take 400 people off the train and move them? The City needs to understand how TCR plans to move the people. Uber and Lyft may be part of the solution, but they are not the only solution. The City would like to see some type of plan for a transit connection.
- Maureen and Jennifer noted that the traffic mitigation focused on roadway intersections and there was one area N. Post Oak and Katy (Northwest Transit Center) where the document didn't reference the BRT line that is under construction. One option would be to extend that service up to the station.
- They also noted the need for connectivity of roads on the map (even though they're not already on the ground). TCR has been meeting with the county to work through those and the next round of engineering should address them.
- The City adopted a new bike plan and wants to make sure that those plans are considered in the document.
- UPRR wants to make sure there is a separation of the freight line and the HSR line. Depending on the design, the HSR project will prevent some thoroughfare crossings and make it necessary for roadways to go over the freight line and HSR, which means you're cutting off business access and potentially impacting future mobility options. Hempstead is 75 feet from centerline of UPRR and there is already an issue of people stacking up on the tracks. UPRR is expecting increases in freight traffic and the City is expecting increases in vehicular traffic. How do you maintain safety? UPRR standard for separation is 102 feet from the ROW.
- If the HSR project prohibits UPRR expansion to businesses or the warehousing development it could mean more trucks on the roadways.
- There is a lot of infrastructure along Hempstead already. TxDOT has plans for that area for a tollroad. There are a lot of utilities as well. The City of Houston is supportive of the project, but they want to make sure it is done right. TCR has an MOU between them and the City of Houston. TCR recognizes that traffic studies and connectivity are important and need to be considered. TCR is working to figure out what brings resolution to all parties and they recognize it is an incredibly complex corridor when it comes to infrastructure.

DISCUSSION POINTS

- AECOM provided a general update on the status of the Project and outlined the objectives for this meeting, which is to understand and document any challenges, concerns or questions METRO may have related to the construction and operation of the Dallas to Houston HSR project, as well as any potential impacts to METRO.
- METRO and TCR have had a number of conversations at different levels (policy and staff) that have been happening for some time and occur every few weeks. METRO would like to be part of the conversation related to the design. The City of Houston wants to make sure there are good connections from the station to downtown Houston.
- METRO Northwest Transit Center design is at 90% so understanding connectivity is key. The Amtrak agreement with TCR adds another layer to the conversation. AECOM noted that FRA has not chosen a preferred station location in Houston. Also, FRA has asked TCR for clarification on the passenger connectivity for Amtrak so that they can document, at least conceptually, how TCR plans to connect passengers and if that is done in coordination with METRO or others.
- METRO has been working on their long-range plan, which has not been published. They have accounted for HSR in the plan and include a percentage of riders coming from the train and into their system. They did not have the percent of mode split available and offered to send that to AECOM. They see an importance of connecting to the potential HSR station.
- The Hempstead/290 corridor is an area of significant growth for the region and METRO is looking at options for that corridor as well. For example, is there room underneath the viaduct for some sort of LRT or other alternative? METRO's BRT system goes up through Uptown and connects at the Northwest Transit Center. It could potentially go further or turn and go downtown. The HSR project would also impact the City's highway system going west.
- METRO's short-range project list is significantly smaller. As previously stated, the Northwest Transit Center engineering is almost done and METRO anticipates completing construction by 2020. There is some potential scope to look at the connection between the Transit Center and the HSR. TCR met with HNTB (designer of the Northwest Transit Center) early on and will meet with them again in the next couple of weeks.
- The updates to the Northwest Transit Center include increasing the bus bays from 12 to 23, which will double the size of the facility. AECOM will verify the document addresses this change in conditions and that it factors into the traffic impacts.
- METRO participated in a fare analysis with TCR early on in their planning. METRO has a 36% mode split coming into downtown.
- As the city develops out west, the Northwest Transit Center almost becomes a new center of transfers for the system. It includes two BRT bays. METRO uses a one way reversible lane on IH-10, but that could become a two way all day ramp with managed lanes from the Northwest Transit Center to downtown. METRO could consider a service patten that would extend the BRT from

downtown Houston (southeast existing stations) up the central business district ramp to IH-10 to the Northwest Transit Center to transfer to uptown and the end of line could be the mall site assuming that is the station. Ultimately, METRO's long range plans include LRT, which could be on a structure on the north embankment of IH-10 that then transitions to Old Katy Road and the Northwest Transit Center. Then it could travel up Post Oak to another station at the mall site and then continue up Mangham.

- METRO is looking to coordinate with TCR on a short-term BRT solution and a long-term LRT solution. They have received the station area plan from TCR.
- METRO is assuming the need for a connection between the Northwest Transit Center and the mall site. They also assume that it would need to be elevated and dedicated BRT with HOV in each direction. TxDOT has a reserved area along 610 and the UPRR tracks are at grade. METRO would have to clear all of that and then meet/manage the elevation of the HSR station. Generally, METRO wants to coordinate with TCR so as not to prohibit METRO options in the future. Right now the UPRR crossings are at-grade. METRO needs an effective connection over UPRR (clear the tracks) that would allow METRO to maintain a schedule throughout their system.
- METRO has a fleet mix that includes natural gas. METRO is looking at clean diesel for BRT, which negligible on emissions. They tested electric, but the batteries cannot support the run times and the air conditioning needed to operate so there are no electric vehicles in the fleet anymore.
- As a summary, the general concerns from METRO are access and traffic impacts; impacts to the Little York parking area (the long-range plan includes a build out for rail at that location even though it is underutilized at this point; drainage basins across Harris County are all up for evaluation; and maintaining pedestrian access during construction at/along bus stops, particularly along 290.
- METRO will be looking for strong commitments on mitigation, particularly related to increases in traffic around the station areas in order to avoid or minimize impacts to METRO operations.
- AECOM will reach out to Susan to further discuss any of METRO's comments and Mike for any design consideration coordination.

DISCUSSION TOPICS

- AECOM provided a general update on the status of the Project and outlined the objectives for this meeting, which is to understand and document any challenges, concerns or questions Gulf Coast Rail may have related to the construction and operation of the Dallas to Houston HSR project, as well as any potential impacts to Gulf Coast Rail.
- AECOM met with METRO and the City of Houston yesterday. Jerry and Megan drove around the Hempstead Corridor this morning. There seems to be a lot of interest/potential on this area. What level of conversation is happening related to the redevelopment of the whole corridor – TxDOT, UPRR, City of Houston, Metro, Gulf Coast, TCR, etc.? What would that look like and who would lead it? The Gulf Coast Rail District has been very focused on commuter rail along Hempstead out to Waller. They want to preserve that envelope and have an agreement with TCR for the ROW underneath TCR's viaduct.
- The City of Houston has ROW on Hempstead that would generally support an expansion from four to six lanes. TCR would need about 50 feet for their ROW. The current design shows TCR on the south side of the street, which would require City of Houston ROW. If that holds, the City of Houston would need additional ROW on the north side to support their expansion of Hempstead. In general, the City of Houston is interested in high capacity transit options and the commuter line Gulf Coast Rail would like to see would support the City's objectives.
- How could TCR's viaduct structure support a ROW for Gulf Coast Rail underneath it? TCR said they are reviewing their foundations to see if they could modify the shape. TCR will also need to respond to UPRR's concern about the need for crash walls.
- Commuter rail to Waller could offer up transit-oriented development opportunities for the local jurisdictions.
- There was some discussion about FRA's role in conducting public involvement. Most people are used to the public involvement process that FTA, FHWA, TxDOT support, which has caused additional frustration for them on this project. FRA has a very limited scope on this project (evaluation of safety) and is not the planning agency, which can be a challenge to adequately communicate.
- Gulf Coast Rail reiterated an importance to connect to downtown Houston and noted that doing so would probably also require some level of coordination amongst all parties. What does METRO need versus TxDOT versus the City of Houston versus Gulf Coast Rail versus UPRR versus TCR? There are a substantial number of people who will need to go downtown or to the medical center – what type of accommodation can be done that doesn't default to Uber and Lyft? And what would that do to the LOS on the local roadways? How do you avoid making the trip from the station to downtown almost as long as the trip from Dallas?
- TCR asked if Gulf Coast Rail has a timeframe related to commuter rail. They don't. They know they need to think about it sooner rather than later given the HSR project.

Brazos Valley MPO Coordination Meeting

DISCUSSION TOPICS

- AECOM provided a general update on the status of the Project and outlined the objectives for this meeting, which is to understand and document any challenges, concerns or questions the Brazos Valley MPO may have related to the construction and operation of the Dallas to Houston HSR project, as well as any potential impacts to the MPO.
- The document assumes that Texas A&M and Sam Houston State University would support some sort of shuttle service between the station and their campuses. Dan works with A&M on their transportation services and is aware of an interest in supporting game day traffic only. A&M has a parking area near the stadium that is exclusive to Uber and Lyft, so the school will rely on those options. If there is a vocal request/demonstrated need for additional shuttle service he would expect the university to respond. He can't speak for Sam Houston State and what they would do. He said that Brazos Valley Transit would be open to operating the shuttle service, but cannot fund it.
- A&M is opening their R.E.L.L.I.S campus in Bryan on the Brazos River near SH 47 and 21. Blinn College is engaged in the project and each of A&M satellite campuses will host at least one class on the R.E.L.L.I.S. campus. 3M will have an office building on campus. By 2020 they are expecting 5,000 people and by 2025 15,000 people. AECOM will evaluate the potential for indirect and cumulative effects.
- The MPO adopted a resolution that SH30 is the preferred corridor for IH-14. The section between Fort Hood and IH-35 is already open. The MPO is pushing for the segment between IH-35 and IH-45, which would include the SH30 corridor to be the next segment for study (five years) and construction (five years).
- Brazos County has adopted a resolution in support of the HSR project and station. Dan expects the Mayors of College Station and Bryan, as well as the MPO to follow.
- Brazos Valley Council of Governments has spent \$7M laying down fiber optic lines throughout their geography (as far north as Buffalo and south as Brenham) and has worked with the local hospitals, ISDs and UPRR (new rail yard in Robertson County) on that project.
- Brazos County is working to create a regional mobility authority to help address transportation needs. RMAs can be developed in areas of a population less than 1 million people. It would have a board with a governor appointed chairperson. One of the first projects would be to look at University Drive and the need for express lanes and main lanes. TxDOT is funding a study and A&M is evaluating the feasibility.
- Dan coordinates with Peter Lang at A&M. He leads their transportation services. He will send an updates related to their plans. Dan suggested reaching out to Wendy Weedon at Brazos Transit to discuss the project.

Public Comments and Questions

Questions and comments from meeting attendees following the presentation included the following:

1. How much will a ticket cost?
 - Approximately 80% of the ticket price of a flight between Dallas and Houston.
2. Will the ticket price be regulated?
 - No, just as air travel prices are not regulated.
3. Is this the first HSR in the U.S.?
 - California has HSR under construction. There is also the Acela, but it is not truly HSR because it reaches only 150 mph.
4. Will we have input into the FRA rule allowing trains to run faster than 150 mph?
 - Feedback on this rule is part of the EIS process.
5. Is the rulemaking separate from the EIS process?
 - Yes, they are technically two separate items, but they are connected; the Rule of Particular Applicability (RPA) is a ruling on the safety of the system because we do not have regulations for anything over 150 mph. Because the project requires this ruling (aka a federal action by FRA's Office of Safety), the NEPA process must be followed, which is why the FRA's Office of Project Delivery is drafting an EIS.
6. Is speed the only concern for FRA for the HSR?
 - The speed is one of the "triggers" for evaluating the system, but FRA's Office of Safety is looking at the safety/security of the entire system and how it would operate in the U.S., so it is not limited to speed. FRA's Office of Safety's priority is managing the NEPA process to evaluate the No Build and Build Alternatives.
7. What are the residential impacts?
 - These are yet to be determined.
8. Has TCR purchased any properties?
 - TCR is purchasing options on properties.
9. Is HSR competing with local TxDOT rail projects that could bring more local benefit?
 - TCR is not in competition with any local transit agencies for rail projects.
10. Will there be two tracks, or one track?
 - Two tracks, one northbound, one southbound.
11. Does TCR own/operate any other US HSR system?
 - TCR does not own or operate any other US HSR system.
12. Will manufacturing occur in the US/Texas?
 - This is yet to be determined. If federal assistance is sought, that triggers a Buy America requirement.

13. If manufacturing happens in the US, how many jobs would that create?
 - The construction phase would create 10,000 jobs per year over four years for a total of 40,000 jobs.
14. Is there any consideration of minority representation in job creation?
 - Private construction does not need to meet federal requirements for MBE/WBE. However, companies are generally sensitive to MBE/WBE participation.
15. How many trains will run per day?
 - Every 30 minutes during peak hours, every hour during off-peak times.
16. What is the capacity of a train?
 - 400 seats.
17. What is the best case/worst case timeline?
 - It is supposed to open in 2021-2022, which is the best case. (No worst case given.)
18. If an incident (safety) occurs, how do I get off the train?
 - To be determined.
19. Will this affect our taxes?
 - Everyone will pay sales tax when they purchase a ticket, and TCR will pay sales tax to the government.
20. Who pays taxes on ticket revenue?
 - TCR. Each county will benefit from taxes from ticket sales.
21. What is the project budget?
 - \$10-\$12 billion.
22. Is TCR getting federal funding?
 - No federal funding anticipated at this time.
23. Who are the investors?
 - The investors (that we are aware of) include the government of Japan and many Texas business owners/philanthropists.
24. Can anyone (“normal people”) invest or buy stock in the company?
 - Potentially in the future.
25. Does our input go to the FRA?
 - Yes.
26. How will we know when the deadline for feedback is? Will there be public announcements—TV, radio?
 - It is up to FRA to decide how they will announce the public hearing on the DEIS. The minimum is a notice in the newspaper. They can choose to also announce via other public means.
27. Will the train be elevated?
 - Yes.
28. Will the train put a strain on the electrical system in Texas, given our existing heat/electricity problems?
 - Based on our calculations, the electrical grid will have ample capacity to serve the train.

Following the presentation, attendees were given the opportunity to review the display board exhibits and meeting materials and ask any questions about the proposed project individually to AECOM representatives.

Public Comments and Questions

Questions and comments from meeting attendees following the presentation included the following:

- Several comments/questions about clarifying Segments 2A and 2B (the two alternatives in Ellis County) and distances of a segment to different roads/points on the map.
- An attendee noted that her house/property was between the two segments and wanted to understand what impact either route would have on her house/property.
- An attendee noted that the prime farmland in the study area is the most productive in the state because it does not require irrigation.
- An attendee expressed his frustration with conversations he has had with TCR and was concerned about fair treatment to landowners. This attendee also submitted a comment form with additional questions; specifically one was "How was the Surface Transportation Board able to grant TCR (a private company) confidentiality?"
- How will this benefit residents of Ellis County?

There is concern about the dirt/fill needed to support the Project and where TCR will get it. TCR will “balance” cut and fill where possible, buy it on the open market (much of the HSR is in proximity to freight lines) or haul it from parcels they own. They will not mine from adjacent parcels unless the landowner and TCR have come to an agreement to that effect.

- TCR distributed information from the EIS and some revised maps to the Ellis County representatives. The overall alignment is about 50 percent earthen embankment and 50 percent viaduct. The train operates in a sealed corridor which means there are no crossings along the alignment. Each intersection is grade separated and the majority will be rail over road with a vertical clearance that meets TxDOT standards (ranging from 16.5-22 feet). The embankments will not block off public roads. If the Project results in a loss of access for a private landowner, TCR will provide a new access point to them.
- The Draft EIS evaluated a conceptual engineering phase. TCR has not completed final design for the Project. Their design-build team will refine the engineering to determine exact placement of bridge columns, road crossings, etc. The typical pier span is 100-110 feet, but if that’s not enough, TCR can work with the county to provide additional ROW clearance.
- TCR evaluated the rail/road crossings and is working to make them majority rail over road. If TCR needs to build a road over the rail, they will pay for the road. They will also ask for maintenance rights from the county. TCR will protect the road over rail crossings with fencing to protect the track down below. If TCR builds a bridge over the road and does something to the road below, they will pay to repair the road. If the county currently maintains a road under the rail they can continue to do that. TCR would ask that if maintenance or a modification is needed that TCR is alerted so that they can monitor for any potential impacts to operations.
- When the alignment is on embankment there will be fencing along the low side. The system will incorporate an intrusion protection system and camera system that would alert the operating center if anything goes through the fence (impacts from animals, weather issues, etc.).
- TCR will conduct maintenance on the system at night, which would typically be the only time people would be within the secured area of the system.
- TCR commits to working with all local emergency management on how to access the viaduct or embankment. TCR will not close any public roads and will coordinate with emergency management on access in general and specifically during construction. TCR anticipates long-term coordination protocols to address access, equipment needs, training, etc.
- TCR plans to construct an initial test track (30 miles) at a to be determined location. The full alignment will be constructed in tandem and in sections. This type of construction approach could lead to miscommunication between any number of construction representatives and emergency management personnel. TCR would like to initiate meetings with emergency management now to inform the development of the safety protocols and processes. Tim Birdwell will serve as a contact for TCR with Ellis County.
- TCR noted joint access roads adjacent to the rail. They clarified the purpose and designation of these roads in preparation for the Final EIS. All roads will be built and paid for by TCR. Some of these maintenance roads will be gravel roads for access and others may be paved. TCR will coordinate with landowners who may want to access these roads. TCR is proposing realigning a few public roads. If there are impacts to response times to emergency management, TCR would like to meet with the County to talk through the road modifications to see what can be done.
- Floodplains were another area of concern for Ellis County. The Project mapping includes the FEMA designated floodplains and TCR will span them on viaduct. TCR anticipates conducting analysis and will submit letters to FEMA for map revisions if those are required. TCR is not

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- In support of this added ridership and general operational optimization, DART expanded their LRT platforms so that three car trains could be used.
- From a capacity perspective, DART recognizes that the first trains to arrive in the morning will probably carry business travelers who would hit the DART system during peak hours. With this in mind, DART is considering an expansion of the Trinity Railway Express (TRE) to Union Station via a lower connection. This would help take some stress off Union Station and create a multi-modal hub at the HSR station. In this scenario, DART may also try to connect the streetcar.
- DART met with ARUP to talk about bus staging areas, but no commitments were made by any parties. Steve thinks having as much separation of the various modes as possible is a good thing and suggests using visual, user friendly directional finding to efficiently move people to personal vehicle, ride share options, bus, transit, etc. This may also include enclosed (air conditioned) moving sidewalks. All of this goes back to the critical need of understanding the cumulative impacts of projects and making sure that room is preserved for what may need to be added in the future.
- DART has completed some geography work and recognizes curb space would be at a premium, so there would need to be sort of a staging area. DART offered up their code share ticketing through DART app, which is connected to Uber and Lyft. DART has had conversations about where cars back-up and wait; how do the cars get out of downtown; how much land area do you allocate to these things? There is a lot of coordination still to do. Also, how does security screening come into this process?
- What changes would DART anticipate making to its service plan if TCR opens a HSR station south of IH-30? Some of these have already been discussed and or completed.
 - For example, DART has already extended the station platforms to add train cars.
 - As previously mentioned, there is some discussion about extending TRE to Union Station.
 - DART may want to make some adjustments to rubber wheel services based on anticipated activity centers. Should they run a DLink shuttle route in downtown to create a local circulator to different points to downtown?
 - Is there a streetcar tie-in between Houston and McKinney that includes a DLink connection? Do you expand the streetcar to Knox/Henderson?
 - Is there a tie into D2? Could DART excavate a Skylink-type connection (as seen at DFW airport on the secure side that connects the terminals)?
- Does DART have any concerns about impacts to their infrastructure or operations? There are no anticipated impacts to any DART facilities, but the HSR line would cross the DART red and blue lines south of downtown.
 - There has been some early conversations about DART extended TRE service to the inland port, so they would want to make sure the HSR project wouldn't preclude that.
 - DART's general guideline for future planning is a request to the HSR team not to box anyone in prematurely and to do their best to account for something early on and if there's an opportunity to share cost for the extension of TRE, great.
 - Does HSR have a maintenance facility in south Dallas County? If so, DART may want to consider bus routes that tie to the Westmoreland and Camp Wisdom stations. DART working on TMA for inland port area to provide for bus services to move people to those employment centers.

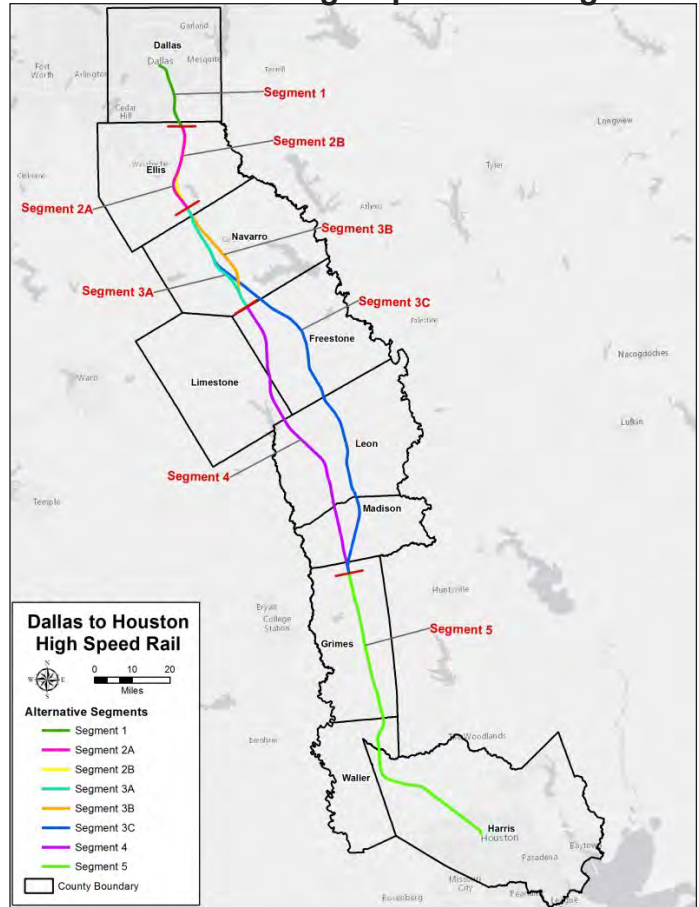

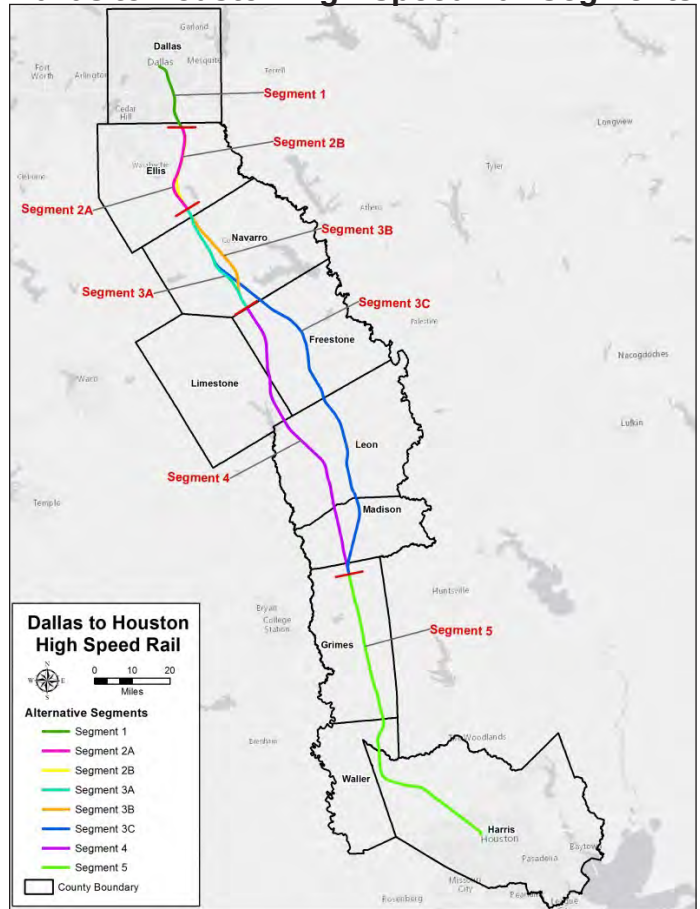

Frequently Asked Questions

1) How many trains will run in a given day?

As currently proposed, Texas Central (TCRR) plans to operate the system from 5:30 am to 11:30 pm each day, with the last train leaving the far station 90 minutes before, at 10pm. Trains would be leaving the terminals for a 16.5-hour operating period, with the first trains leaving at the beginning of that period and the last train leaving at the end of that period. For the initial service (opening day) a train would leave each terminal station every 30 minutes, meaning 34 northbound trains and 34 southbound trains. In a given day this totals 68 trains running along the tracks.

2) Why doesn't the train go to downtown Houston?

TCRR initially proposed two station options in downtown Houston. However, the two downtown options were eliminated due to the potential significant environmental impacts they created, including impacts to the National Historic District Heights Boulevard Esplanade, the U.S. Healthworks Hospital, and Houston and Texas Central Railroad archaeology site, and the high cost to mitigate those impacts. More information about the consideration of a downtown Houston station option is contained in the Federal Railroad Administration's (FRA) Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail Project Alignment Alternatives Analysis Report (November 2015), available on (FRA's) website at <https://www.fra.dot.gov/eLib/Details/L17203>.

3) How can the Draft Environmental Impact Statement (Draft EIS) be complete when no one was allowed on my land to complete surveys?

FRA assessed the environmental impacts of the Build Alternatives using publicly available data, previously published documentation and fieldwork where access was granted or available through public rights-of-way. Surveys have been conducted for the following resources: waters of the U.S., federally listed species, cultural resources, noise and vibration, aesthetics and scenic and hazardous materials. Additional survey work may be conducted as access to property is granted. Property access is not necessary to conduct the analysis for other resource areas (i.e., Air Quality, Land Use, etc.)

4) Will there be sound walls to mitigate noise impacts on nearby communities?

The results of the noise impact assessment in the Draft EIS suggest that the use of sound barriers for mitigation would be limited because noise impacts would be scattered geographically. Where sound barriers are not feasible or desirable, building sound insulation may be a better choice for reducing indoor noise. The Draft EIS does not identify locations for sound barriers or building sound insulation as part of the preliminary engineering. Additional noise assessments will be completed as part of the final design of the Project. This further analysis and TCRR's coordination with affected landowners, will inform the need for and/or location of sound walls. Should sound barriers be determined to be appropriate, TCRR will consider input from the public and local jurisdictions regarding the aesthetic style of the barrier.

5) How far does vibration caused by the train travel from the track and will it impact sensitive facilities like nearby hospitals or schools?

The Draft EIS included modelling of vibration impacts based on actual operational conditions of the Shinkansen train in Japan and existing soil conditions within the corridor. Based on this effort, severe vibration impacts would not extend beyond 275 feet from the track. The analysis indicated there would be no operational vibration impacts on resources like hospitals or schools.



6) How will noise or vibration affect my livestock?

For noise from passing high-speed rail (HSR) trains on animals, the FRA noise exposure criterion limit is a Sound Exposure Level of 100 dBA. For the HSR trains operating at the maximum speed of 205 mph, this limit would only be exceeded within 15 feet from the HSR tracks. No livestock would be this close to the tracks. Where the HSR tracks would be at-grade, this level of noise would be limited to the area within the fenced right-of-way. In most places where the track is on viaduct (raised track) the height of the track would exceed the minimum distance to impact livestock. Where the track is on embankment and there would be a wildlife or livestock crossing enclosed in a culvert, noise levels would be reduced by shielding either below the viaduct or within the culvert. Therefore, no noise impacts to wildlife or livestock would be expected.

7) How do you know if there are threatened or endangered species on my property?

FRA completed a habitat modeling assessment that uses data from U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and Texas Parks and Wildlife Department. The model evaluates soil type, vegetation cover, eco-regions and more to identify areas of high potential for the federally listed species to live. FRA focused their species surveys on these modeled areas and accessed them through public right-of-way or where access to private property was granted. The Draft EIS documents the first year of surveys during which no threatened or endangered species within the surveyed areas were found.

8) What happens if you find a threatened or endangered species on my property?

FRA is conducting surveys for threatened or endangered species in consultation with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Survey areas are currently limited to public right-of-way and where access to private property has been granted. If federally listed species are located within the footprint of the Project and would be adversely impacted, the relocation of the impacted species will be coordinated with U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

9) How will I move my livestock across my property?

Where the track is on viaduct (raised track), adequate vertical clearance should allow for the movement of wildlife or livestock underneath the track. Where the track is on an embankment, wildlife crossings such as tunnels will be incorporated to allow for movement and could potentially accommodate livestock.

10) Will the construction of this project cause upstream or downstream flooding?

During final design, additional hydrology studies will be conducted throughout the study area to inform the engineering. The final design of the Project will take into account existing water flow and be designed to maintain, if not improve it through coordination with the local water management district.

11) Can the electricity grid support the project?

ERCOT regulates about 75 percent of the electric grid for the State of Texas and is currently adding capacity to respond to the population growth and energy needs of the state. FRA conducted analyses that compared ERCOT's current and future capacity to the overall electrical need of the Project. The daily power consumption of the Project would present 0.26 percent of the added capacity.

12) If the project requires new electrical lines, who decides where they go?

Any changes to the overhead electrical lines, including pole adjustments, relocations, or new connections, would be coordinated by the utility owner. These changes would require additional environmental analyses that would be completed by the utility owner.

13) Will the project require the abandonment or closure of any oil or gas wells?

FRA identified underground oil and gas lines that may need to be relocated or protected. FRA also identified surface wells within the footprint of the Project that would be abandoned and closed.

14) Will any public roads be permanently closed by the project?

The train will cross either over or under existing roadways. The construction of the Project may result in changes to existing roadways in order for those roads to cross under or over the track, but no public roads will be closed.

15) How will access on public roadways change/be managed during construction?

Lanes on public roads could be temporarily closed during construction, but a certain level of service (or number of lanes) would be required to remain open. If a road is shut down, it would be temporary and a detour would be identified with appropriate signage.

16) What is the timeline/process for TCRR to purchase or acquire property for the project?

The timeline and process for property acquisition is not part of the environmental review of the Project. If TCRR obtains federal financial assistance for the Project, such as a federal loan, TCRR will be required to comply with the Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (Uniform Act) for any acquisition of property.

17) What impact will this project have on agricultural lands?

Farmland within the 10-county Study Area constitutes approximately three percent of the total acres of all farms in the State of Texas. While the Project will convert agricultural lands to a transportation use, the analysis indicates that agricultural capacity is available within the study area, as well as the State of Texas. Adverse impacts to overall food production would not occur.

18) What safeguards are in place to ensure that cars and trains will not collide?

The system does not allow for the operation of any other type of trains on its track. Cars will not cross over the tracks. Freight trains cannot operate on the tracks. The HSR system will have a dedicated northbound lane and a dedicated southbound lane, which means that no two trains can be on the same track heading towards one another.

19) How will this project impact hunters/hunting?

The Project is not expected to result in a change hunting regulations within the 10 county Study Area.

20) What other permits or permissions does TCRR need before they can begin construction and operation of the system?

In addition to the Record of Decision, FRA will also need to publish a Final Rule on TCRR's Rule of Particular Applicability application related to the safety of the system. TCRR cannot operate the system until FRA has published the Final Rule. Additionally, prior to construction the United States Army Corps of Engineers (USACE) will need to issue permits for 404 and 408 crossings. Also, several local counties and cities, as well as TxDOT, will require TCRR to obtain permits for roadway modifications.

21) What role does the public have in determining the alignment of the Project?

TCRR is a private entity that proposed the project and initial corridors. FRA evaluated those corridors and sought public input on them during the public scoping meetings held in late 2014. TCRR and FRA considered that input in selecting a corridor, identifying alignment alternatives within the corridor, and narrowing the alternatives down to the six build alternatives studied in the Draft EIS. The public also has an opportunity now to provide comments on the alignments in the Draft EIS, including the preferred alternative. FRA will consider all comments received during the public comment period before making a final preferred alternative selection in the Record of Decision.

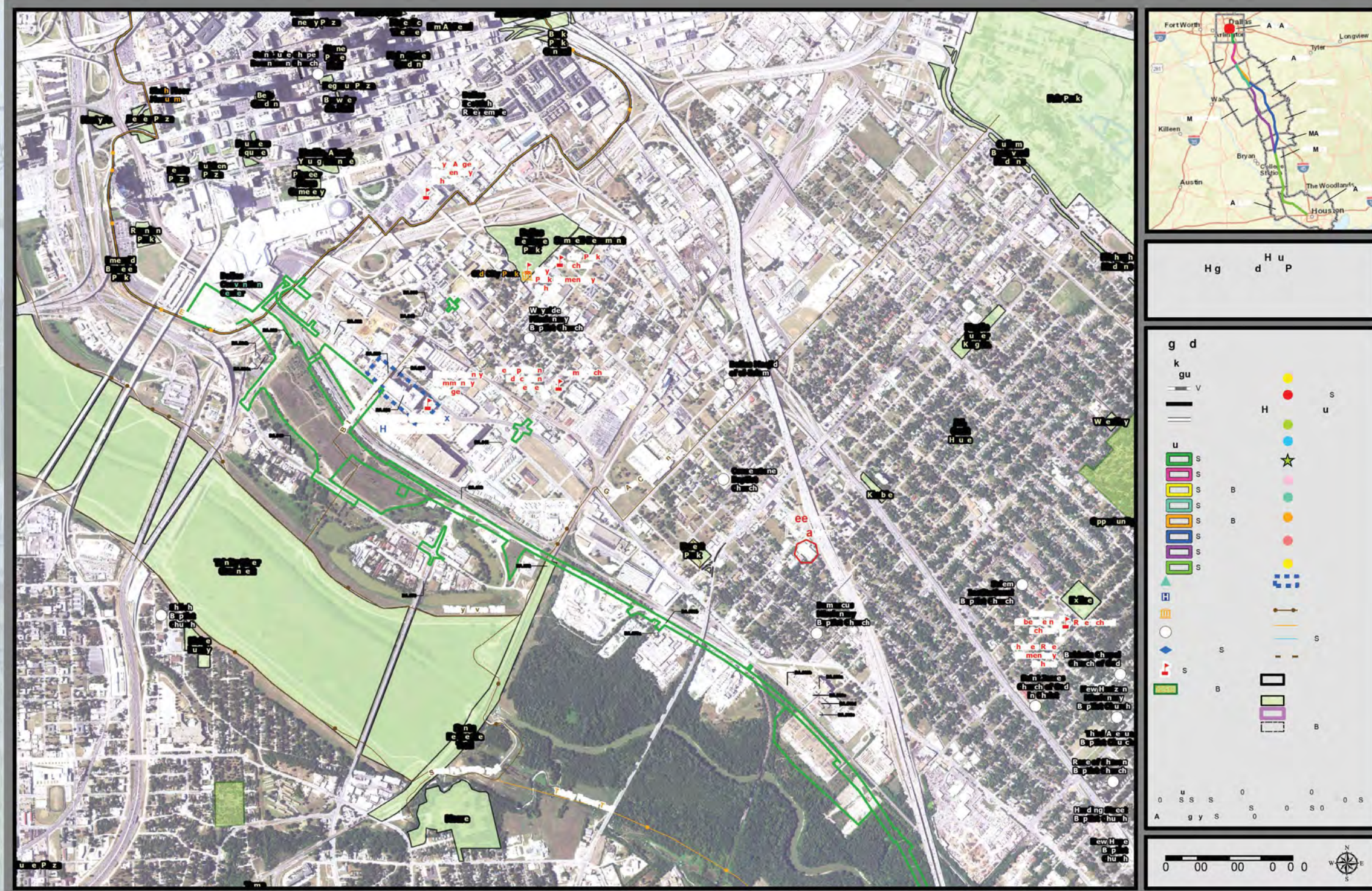

24) What are the next steps FRA will take on the project?

FRA has recorded and is organizing all of the comments received on the Draft EIS as part of the development of the Final EIS. They will also evaluate any engineering refinements and complete additional surveys in support of the Final EIS. The Final EIS will include updates to the resources discussed in the Draft EIS and will also contain a formal response for each comment and a summary of all Draft EIS comments. The Final EIS will be published for public review.

After the Final EIS, FRA will make a determination on the Rule of Particular Applicability and issue a Record of Decision.

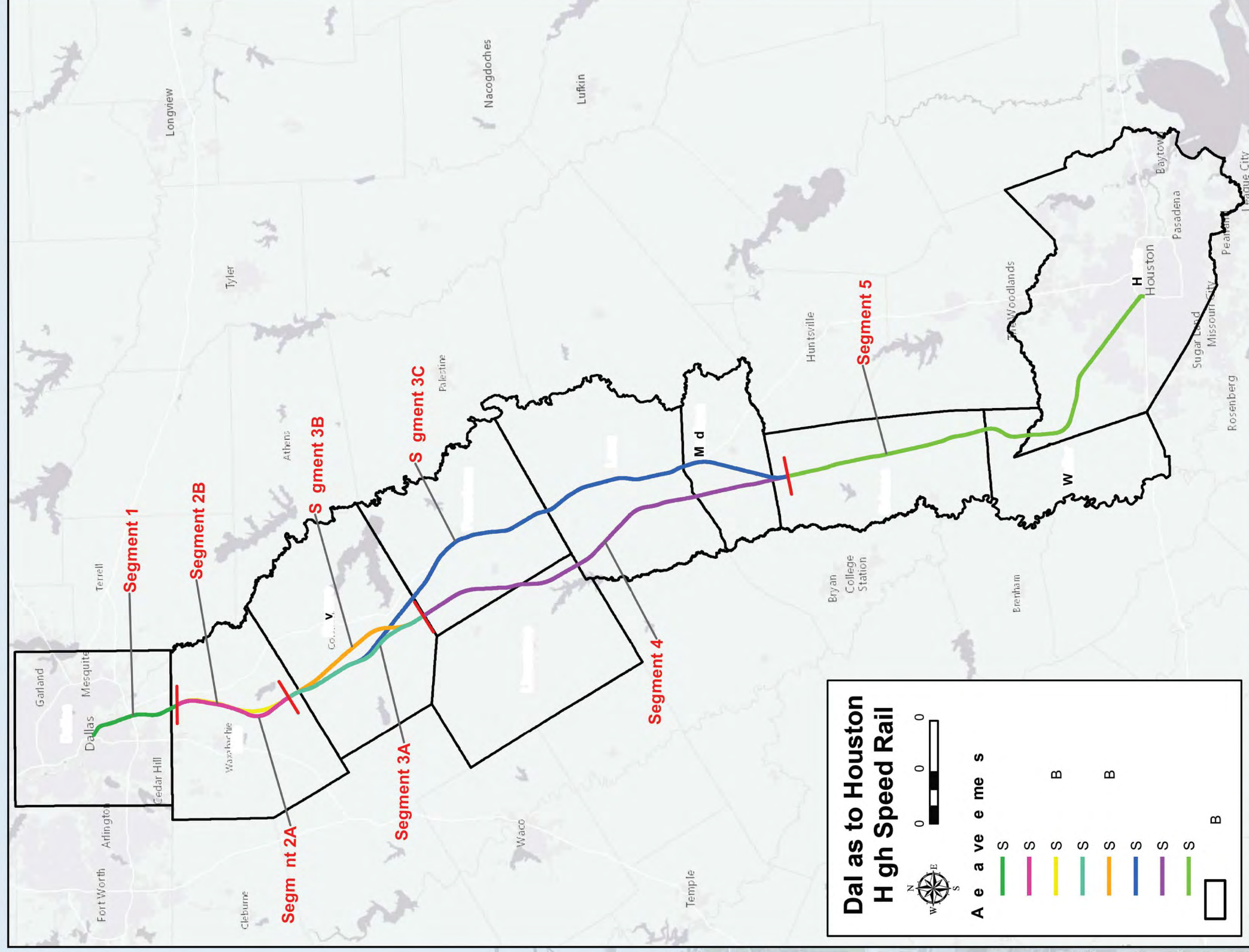
Dallas Terminal Area Map

Eight people registered their attendance at the listening session and seven stayed for the entire session. Erin Lee, AECOM Project Manager, gave an approximately 15-minute presentation describing the project, and the team responded to and asked questions of the attendees. Diana Cabrera was available should anyone have needed Spanish translation. Attendees also had an opportunity to review the display board exhibits.

Public Questions

The most common topics of concern were:

- What will happen to nearby structures and roads?
- Property values have changed in the area; can we renegotiate our contracts?
- What areas can we relocate to that has comparable homes for comparable prices that are still near our churches, clinics, and workplaces?
- People in the neighborhood have lived there for significant periods of time and have become like family. They'd like to stay together.

Notes

Many of the attendees were renters. These renters were very concerned about having to move due to their landlord selling the properties. Some of these renters had been in the same homes for years. The longest renter had been in her home for 14 years. Renters were concerned about the length of time given to vacate their homes, financial compensation for leaving, packing and moving assistance, and finding affordable rental properties on fixed incomes.

Multiple landlords attended the listening session. These landlords were, in the past, also residents of the neighborhood. One landlord had purchased multiple properties in 1979. Another lived in a different neighborhood but family occupied her property. Another landlord expressed his feelings that the offers from TCR would be a benefit to the entire neighborhood. He did not stay for the meeting.

Some attendees had lived in the neighborhood for a significant amount of their lives. Many were elderly and needed assistance with health or mobility issues. There is no local bus stop that directly serves the neighborhood.

Property owners were concerned about market increases in DFW since the time they signed their option contracts with TCR. Many were concerned that the amounts negotiated needed to be revisited due to unprecedented home value increases in Dallas. Owners also expressed concern that their option contracts would expire next year.

All attendees expressed concern that they would need more than 90 days to vacate their homes.

Most attendees were neighbors or knew each other. They expressed concern that they would like to be relocated to the same neighborhoods as their relationships are like family.

Fourteen people registered their attendance at the listening session with one child not registered and stayed for the entire session. Erin Lee, AECOM Project Manager, gave an approximately 15-minute presentation describing the project, and the team responded to and asked questions of the attendees. Attendees also had an opportunity to review the display board exhibits.

Public Questions

The most common topics of concern were:

- What impacts will there be to well water?
- How will noise impacts be mitigated?
- Will there be coordination between the rail line construction and Loop 9 construction?
- What is the next step after the FEIS?

Notes

Several homeowners share water from a nearby well. There is concern about the rail line impacts to the water well and vibrations to water lines. For noise concerns, it was explained that modeling has been and will continue to be updated using information Texas Central Railway (TCR) provides for this type of train and tracks. This is a much quieter train. TCR will do more listening sessions to address noise impact mitigation as they get further along in the detail design.

Once the Final Environmental Impact Statement (FEIS) is published, the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) will issue a record of decision. Then, several permits will be acquired by TCR. TCR is working on the right of way acquisition/relocation plan and public involvement plan during construction.

FRA and TCR are coordinating with the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) where the proposed rail line will cross the Loop 9 construction project. TxDOT is part of the review and coordination at this location. The required public involvement plan for TCR will keep the public informed of construction lane closures.

Several attendees commented on the 90 days given to relocate once notified. This is a challenge to find comparable homes in the area when they do not receive their funds until closing. Attendees have not found comparably priced land as theirs in the area. One resident has a family member with special needs and requires special home accommodations. She has not found a suitable home to provide the same access and care for the family member and cannot live in a temporary location without the accommodations.

All attendees expressed concern about the water, construction, visual and noise impacts of the rail line.

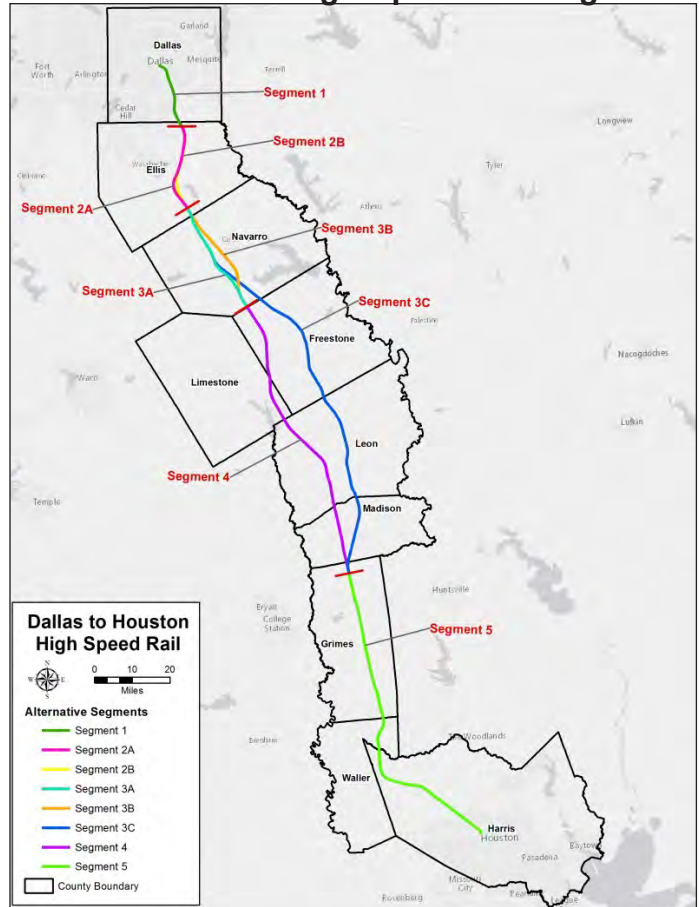

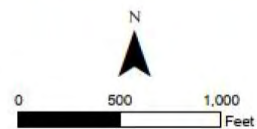

Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail EIS Hash Rd. and Nail Dr. Neighborhood

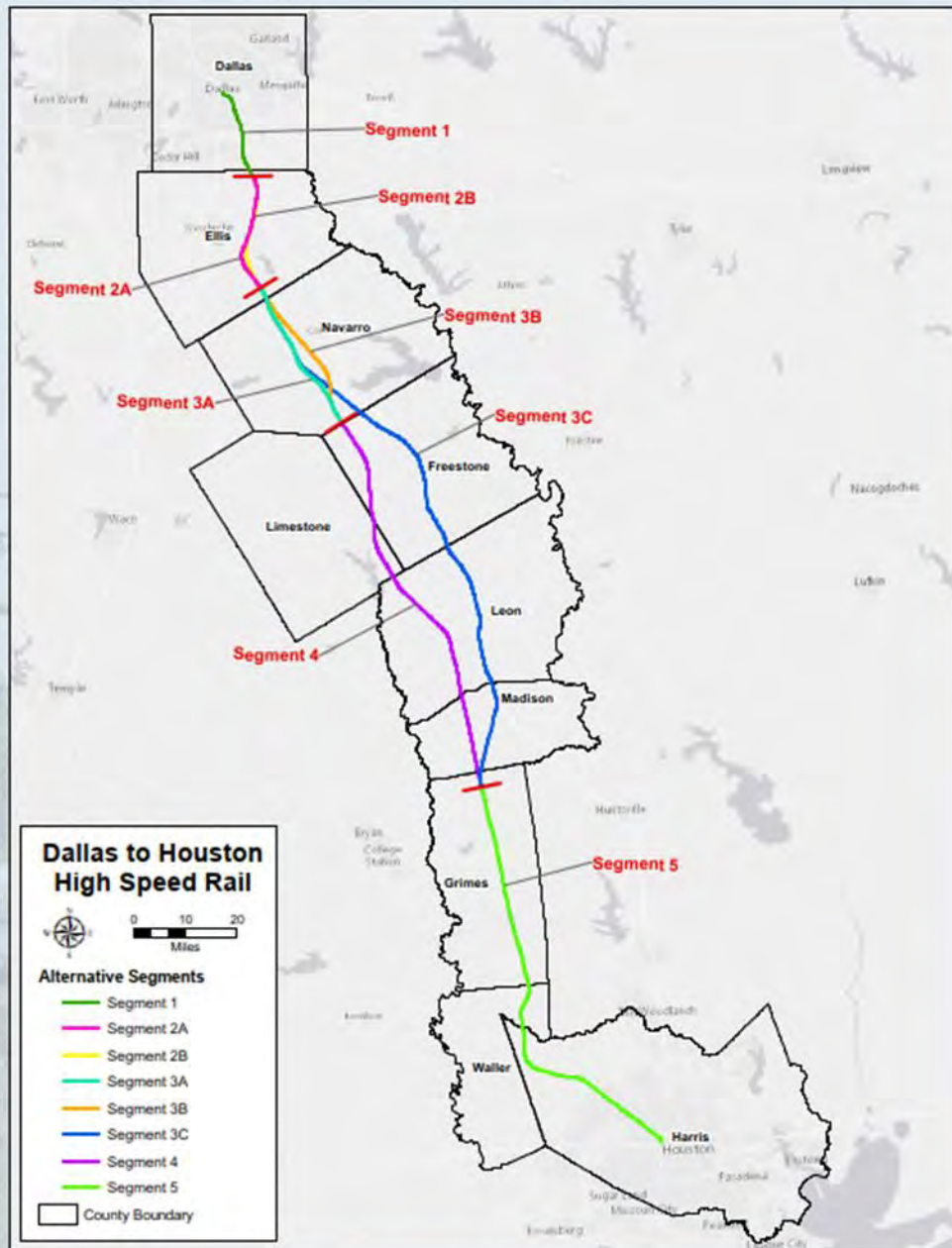

- Paulette VanderKamp of AECOM gave the PowerPoint presentation.
- Staffed by project team members from AECOM.

Meeting Attendance:

Eleven people registered their attendance at the listening session and stayed for the entire session. Paulette Vander Kamp, AECOM, gave an approximately 15-minute presentation describing the project, and the team responded to and asked questions of the attendees. Attendees also had an opportunity to review the display board exhibits and answer the survey.

Public Questions

The most common topics of concern were:

- Who will oversee construction and ensure residents are not impacted?
- Why aren't residents being bought out for visual impacts?
- My home is paid off or my house payment is very low. I can't find other housing/property that is comparable.
- Flooding already occurs in the area. There are concerns about placement of the embankments and detention ponds could create more flooding issues.
- Residents claim TCR can lease purchased homes along the corridor to construction staff. How can residents confirm safety and safety for kids walking for bus?

Notes

The residents were very concerned about the construction and visual impacts of the rail line in front of their homes which they state is approximately 300 ft. There is only one road into and out of their neighborhood, and they have concerns about construction impacting their access and the safety of their families around the workers. Children play near the road and walk to the bus stop. There were also concerns about noise, especially maintenance on the track conducted at night. The attendees were very concerned about the possibility of homes that will be purchased could be rented to construction workers. They expressed concern for their families' safety around the workers and parties and trash in and around the homes.

According to residents, there are currently water shed issues where flooding already occurs. Residents have drainage concerns where the embankments are proposed. Water appears to be diverted across property owner's land and into a small creek which cannot handle more water.

A few residents cannot find comparable homes/property for the same monthly payment or to purchase outright with no payment.

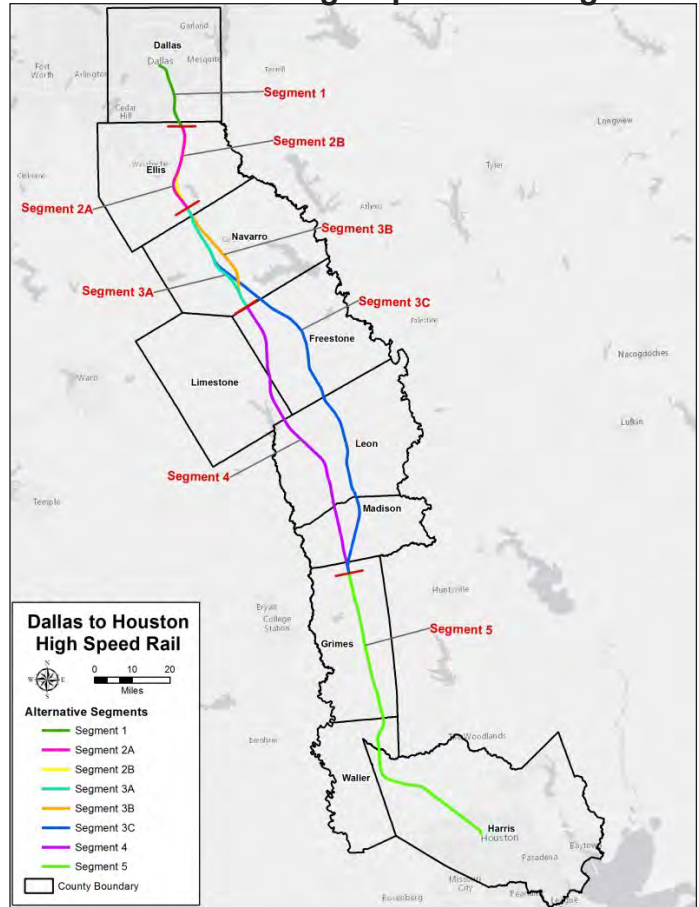

HSR trains would run on electricity and travel on tracks for HSR passenger rail service only. There would be no at-grade railroad or roadway crossings on the HSR system. Existing or future roads would either go over or under the HSR tracks. The FRA is the Agency responsible for evaluating the project's environmental impacts and safety.

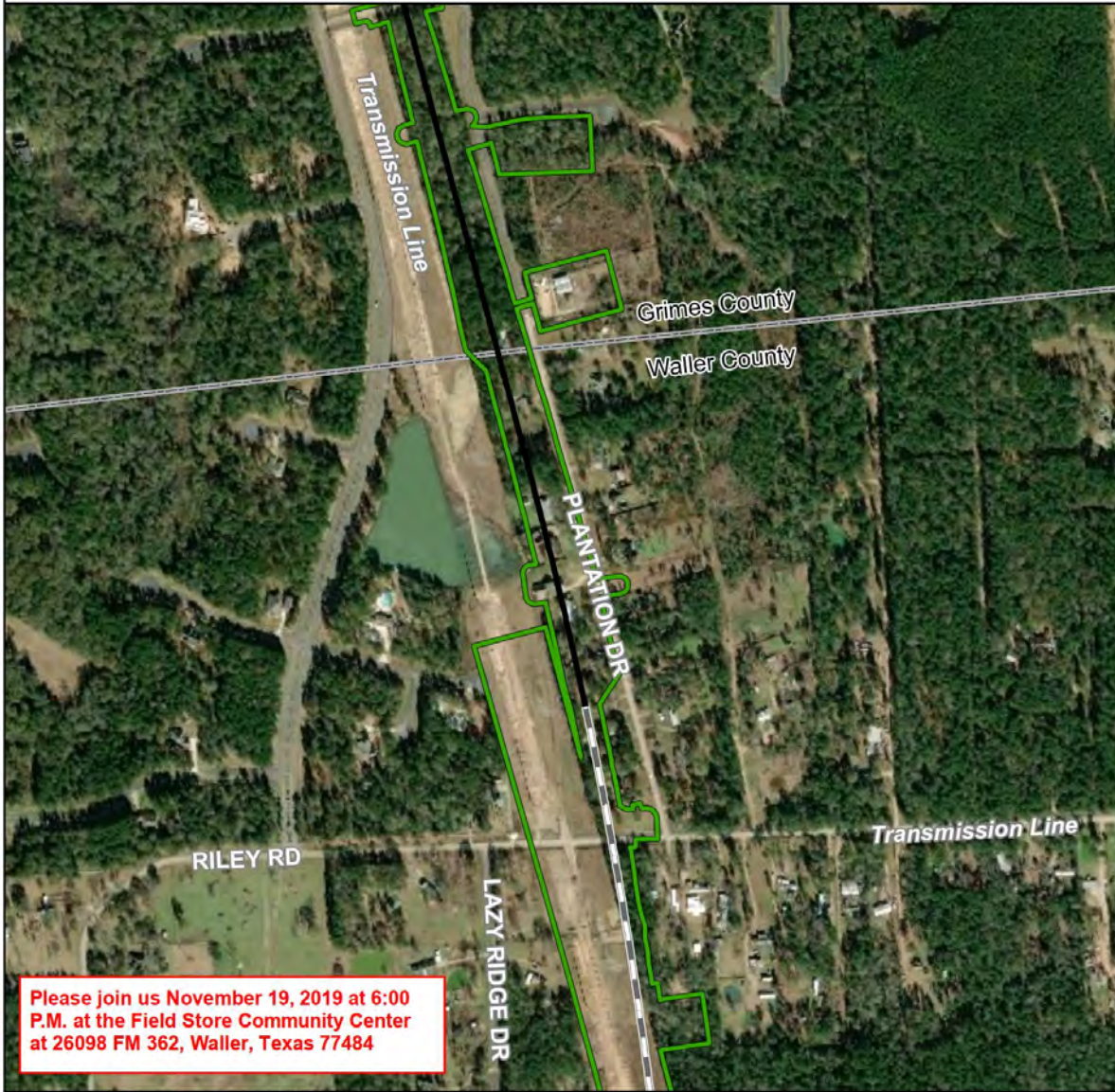

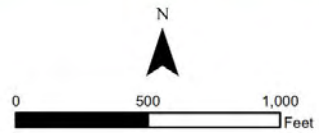


Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail EIS Plantation Forest Neighborhood

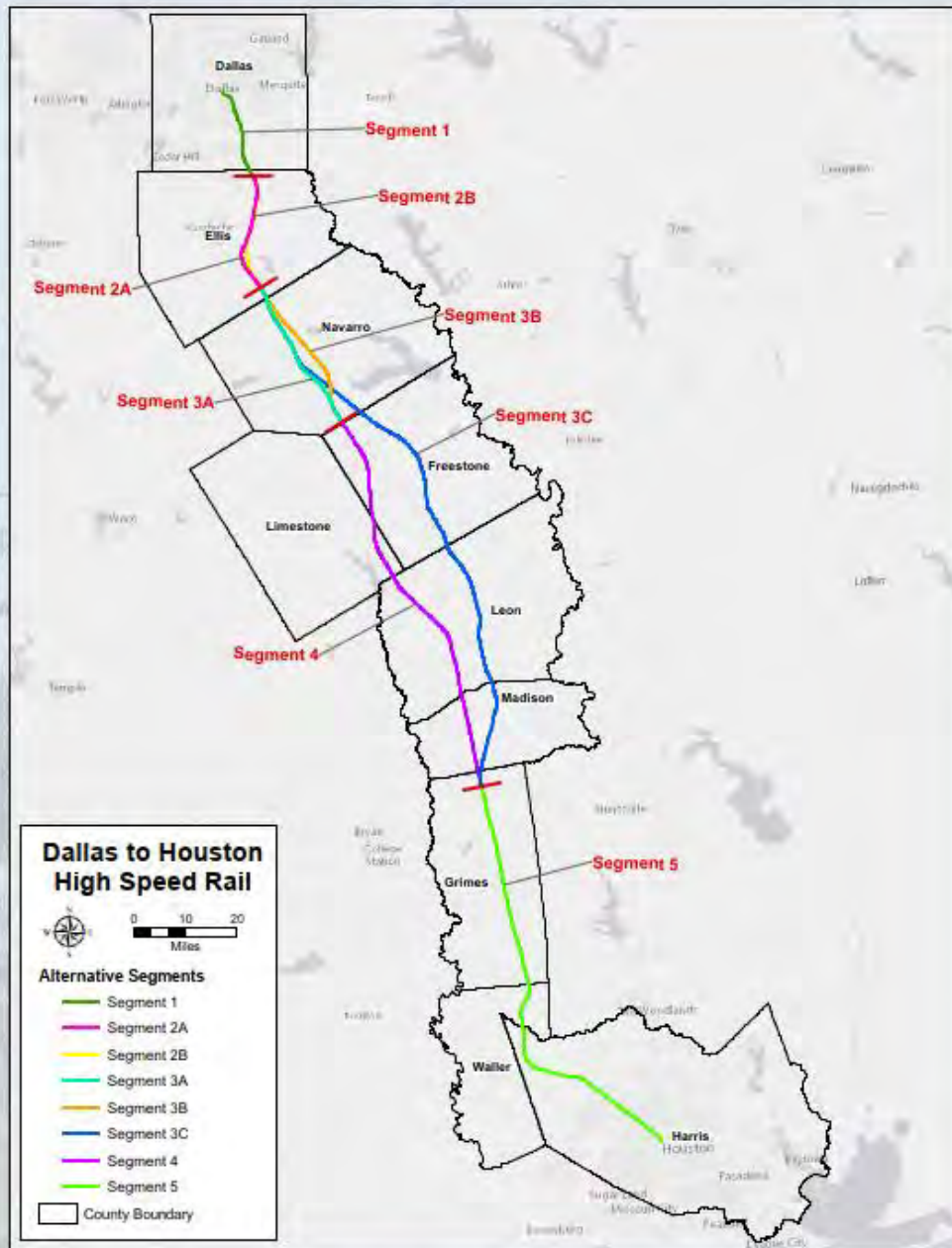

Frequently Asked Questions

What is the Dallas to Houston HSR Project?

The Dallas to Houston Project would connect Dallas and Houston with a dedicated High-Speed Rail (HSR) system proposed by a private company, Texas Central High-Speed Railway (TCR).

Where would it go?

In 2015, the Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) completed an independent evaluation of potential HSR corridors between Dallas to Houston. FRA evaluated corridors next to existing freight and passenger rail lines, along Interstate 45 (IH-45), and next to gas pipelines and high-voltage electricity lines (utility corridor). FRA recommended further study of the utility corridor. Within this corridor, TCR proposed different potential routes for the HSR tracks. FRA evaluated 21 different alignment alternatives proposed by TCR, and recommended six end-to-end Build Alternatives to be studied in the Draft EIS. The final HSR route will be determined when the engineering and environmental analyses are complete.

Where will the HSR trains run and where will it stop?

In Dallas, a potential station is proposed south of Interstate 30 (IH-30), near downtown. In Houston, there are three potential station locations near IH-610, US 290 and IH-10. In between the two metropolitan areas, a Brazos Valley Station is proposed in Grimes County. The final route and station locations will be determined when the engineering and environmental analyses are complete.

What is high-speed rail?

A high-speed passenger rail system travels at speeds over 150 miles per hour (mph) and can reach speeds up to 225 mph. They are sometimes called bullet trains. The trains run on electricity. There are no high-speed passenger rail systems in the United States although California is currently constructing its high-speed rail system.

TCR proposed the Dallas to Houston Project to provide an alternative to traveling by car on I-45 or air. The Dallas to Houston Project is proposed to travel at speeds up to 205 mph, meaning that the 240-mile trip between Dallas and Houston would take approximately 90 minutes. TCR proposes to use the N700 Tokaido Shinkansen HSR (bullet train) technology currently in operation in Japan.

The proposed HSR trains would travel in a "closed" system, meaning that the train would run on dedicated tracks for HSR passenger rail service only. HSR trains would use a specialized track designed specifically for the Japanese bullet trains. Freight and Amtrak trains operate on diesel fuel. The HSR trains would operate on electricity. The HSR trains would not run on existing or planned freight and passenger rail lines, such as Amtrak or BNSF rail lines. Additionally, only the HSR trains could run on the HSR tracks. There would be no railroad/roadway crossings for the HSR system. Existing or future roads would either go over or under the HSR tracks.



What is the Federal Railroad Administration's role on the Project?

The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) has the authority to regulate the safety of railroads. Currently, there is no existing HSR system in the United States; and there are no HSR railroad safety regulations. FRA is reviewing the Project's technology to develop applicable safety regulations specifically for the Dallas to Houston Project. This action requires FRA to comply with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and prepare an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). Through this environmental review, the Project's final route and the location of all stations, maintenance facilities and substations will be determined. As part of the EIS, the environmental and social impacts of the Project's Build Alternatives will be analyzed. The EIS will also include impacts associated with Project infrastructure and facilities, such as stations and maintenance facilities.

What is the status of the Project?

FRA is currently preparing a Draft EIS, which will be issued for public review and comment in late 2016.

How can I be involved?

Public involvement is a key component of the EIS process. FRA will host a series of public hearings to get input and feedback on the Draft EIS in late 2016. Qué es el Proyecto Dallas a Houston HSR?

El Proyecto Dallas a Houston conectara Dallas con Houston con un sistema de tren de alta velocidad (High-Speed Rail o HSR por sus siglas en inglés) propuesto por una empresa privada, Texas Central High-Speed Railway (TCR por sus siglas en inglés).

Donde iría?

En el año 2015, la Administración Federal de Ferrocarriles (Federal Railroad Administration o FRA por sus siglas en inglés) completó una evaluación independiente de los posibles corredores HSR entre Dallas a Houston. FRA evaluó corredores junto a las líneas ferroviarias de carga y pasajeros, a lo largo de Interestatal 45 (IH-45), y al lado de tuberías de gas y líneas de electricidad de alto voltaje (corredor de utilidad). FRA recomendó más estudios acerca del corredor de utilidad. Dentro de este corredor, TCR propone diferentes rutas posibles para los carriles HSR. FRA evaluó 21 alternativas de alineación diferentes propuestas por TCR, y recomendó seis alternativas de punta a punta para ser estudiado en la declaración de impacto ambiental preliminar (Draft Environmental Impact Statement o Draft EIS por sus siglas en inglés). La ruta final de HSR se determinará cuando se haya completado los análisis de ingeniería y medio ambientales.

Donde ejecutan los trenes HSR y dónde va a parar?

En Dallas, se propone una posible estación al sur de la Interestatal 30 (IH-30), cerca del centro de la ciudad. En Houston, hay tres posibles estaciones ubicadas cerca de IH-610, US 290 y IH-10. Entre las dos áreas metropolitanas, se propone una estación en el Condado de Grimes. La ruta final y ubicaciones de la estación se determinará cuando se haya completado los análisis de ingeniería y medio ambientales.

Qué es el tren de alta velocidad?

Un sistema de carril de alta velocidad pasajero viaja a velocidades de más de 150 millas por hora (mph) y puede alcanzar velocidades de hasta 225 mph. A veces son llamados trenes de bala. Los trenes funcionan con electricidad. No hay ningún sistema de carril de alta velocidad pasajero en los Estados Unidos aunque California actualmente está construyendo un sistema de carril de alta velocidad.

TCR propuso el Proyecto de Dallas a Houston para ofrecer una alternativa a los viajes en coche en IH-45 o el aire. El Proyecto de Dallas a Houston propone viajar a velocidades de 205 mph, significando que el viaje de 240 millas entre Dallas y Houston tomaría aproximadamente 90 minutos. TCR propone utilizar la tecnología N700 Tokaido Shinkansen HSR (tren de bala) que esta en operación en Japón.

Los propuestos trenes HSR viajarían en un sistema "cerrado", lo que significa que el tren funcionaría en pistas dedicadas solamente para el servicio de trenes de pasajeros HSR. Trenes HSR utilizaría un carril especializado y diseñado específicamente para los trenes de bala japoneses. Los trenes de carga y trenes de Amtrak funcionan con combustible diesel. Los trenes HSR funcionaría con electricidad. Los trenes HSR no funcionaría en carriles existentes o previstas de carga y de pasajeros, tales como líneas de ferrocarril de Amtrak o BNSF. Además, sólo los trenes HSR podrían correr en las pistas HSR. No habría ningún ferrocarril/carretera cruzando por el sistema HSR. Carreteras existentes o futuras irían por encima o por debajo de la pista HSR.





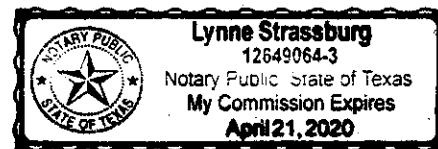

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Oriunda de Detroit, Hall se ha convertido en una celebridad en la región tres meses después de haber asumido el cargo, su agenda repleta de discursos y eventos comunitarios donde es recibida con aplausos y pedidos de foto con ella.

"Pensé que iba a ser la jefa de policía, y creo que me he convertido en una suerte de ícono", dijo Hall en un simposio sobre justicia penal en septiembre.

La imagen de Hall en la comunidad permanece intacta, aunque algunas decisiones suyas no han sido bien vistas al interior de la institución.

Muchos oficiales se han ido desilusionando, y más a raíz de una reestructuración en la que algunos oficiales con poca experiencia fueron asignados a puestos de mando y respetados veteranos fueron degradados, dos de los cuales habían sido finalistas para el puesto que ella ahora ocupa.

La reorganización fue un golpe más para el departamento, que ya estaba contra las cuerdas tras una crisis en su fondo de pensiones y un éxodo que ha reducido sus filas.

"Este era un trabajo al que no era necesario traer un martillo", dijo el teniente Thomas Glover, presidente de la Asociación de Policías Negros, antes de jubilarse en agosto.

"Lo que ella ha hecho ha afectado

Los seis años en que David Brown estuvo al frente del departamento se distinguieron por una baja en la criminalidad y un énfasis en la vigilancia comunitaria.

Pero la moral se fue erosionando bajo su mando, y la popularidad de Brown en la comunidad contrastaba con la relación a veces espinosa que tenía con sus oficiales de base.

Dos veces las asociaciones de policías intentaron expulsar a Brown, pero su popularidad aumentó gracias a la destreza con que hizo frente a la emboscada de policías en julio de 2016 en que cuatro policías municipales y un oficial de DART perdieron la vida.

Pero con su retiro el año pasado —en medio de una crisis en el fondo de pensiones que hizo a varios oficiales veteranos apresurarse a egresar del departamento—, le dejó vía libre a la ciudad.

Siete finalistas compitieron por el puesto, pero fue Hall, jefa adjunta de la policía de Detroit y la menos experimentada de todos, la que impresionó a los panelistas en sus entrevistas.

"Extremadamente afable, ofrece planeación estratégica. Sabe lo que es la vigilancia comunitaria y tiene buenas ideas para levantar la moral. La más transparente y con la que es más fácil hablar", escribió una persona que formó parte del sondeo

para jefa de policía, y el jefe asistente Gary Tittle, quien fuera el enlace legislativo del departamento y otro finalista para dirigir el DPD.

Los cinco jefes degradados se rehúsan a comentar.

La Asociación de Policías de Dallas, que con frecuencia tuvo choques con el conjunto de comandantes, criticó las degradaciones diciendo que "agravarán la pérdida de moral".

Se desconoce quién aconsejó a Hall.

No buscó la opinión de por lo menos dos ex jefes de la policía que todavía viven en el área metropolitana, Bill Rathburn y David Kunkle.

Brown, su predecesor inmediato, no respondió los pedidos de comentario.

Rathburn consideró que degradar a dos competidores por su puesto no hacían ver bien a la nueva jefa de policía.

"Lo primero que pensé fue que ya estaba saliendo a la luz su paranoia", dijo Rathburn.

Varios oficiales veteranos, algunos de los cuales se han retirado después de que Hall asumió el cargo, dijeron que nunca les pidió un consejo.

"Desde luego, tiene que haber sobresaltos, y eso se da en una reorganización", evaluó Glover.

Pero equiparó las acciones de Hall con "mandar a la banca a Michael Jordan y meter a jugar a J.J. Barea".

The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA), U.S. Department of Transportation is issuing this notice to advise the public that it has prepared a Draft Environmental Impact Statement (Draft EIS) for the Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail (HSR) Project (Project). Postcard stamps and metered letters would also have a one cent increase. Today's filing does not include any price change for single-piece letters being mailed to international destinations or for additional ounces for letters.

The proposed prices would raise Mailing Services product prices approximately 1.9 percent, and most Shipping Services products will average a 3.9 percent price increase. While Mailing Services price increases are limited based on the Consumer Price Index (CPI), Shipping Services prices are adjusted strategically, according to market conditions

and the need to maintain affordable services for customers.

process of accepting bids for new contracts. Council approved to extend the current cemetery maintenance contracts thru March 1.

Council also amended their budget by \$10,000 to recognize unanticipated funds from the Economic Development Corporation. This revenue, funded by the EDC, will provide revenue to the City in quarterly installments of \$2,500.

If anyone has walked through City

Hall recently one may notice trash cans strategically placed in the middle of the floor to catch water dripping through the ceiling here in recent weeks during the rains. The roof was found to be in repair and bids went out with two estimates received for repair.

Bi-Stone submitted a bid to perform the roof repair as submitted by the City in the amount of \$39,017. The council awarded the bid to Bi-Stone.

Council also approved a request for proposal for metal recycling services at the Public Works Department. The Mexia Fire Department was approved to purchase a new self-contained breathing apparatus in the amount of \$143,045.

within that time frame. You can't wait hours to get help. We can recognize that you're having a heart attack, get you shipped over to Waco or to a catheter lab, and they can get you in there, go in and take that clot out, or do the balloon, open up that blood vessel and take care of you."

The time frame from symptom onset to taking care of the blockage, however, is two hours.

"After two hours, we can't do anything," she said. "After that, the damage is done."

That explains why the ER personnel are in such a hurry when they get a patient who may be suffering a heart attack. Many times, however, people with the signs of a heart attack don't perceive their situation as life threatening. They may think they don't have time to see a doctor, or they may not want to bother family members or friends.

"You can help by being persistent, by asking questions," she said. "If you know the signs and symptoms, and somebody says they have jaw pain or neck pain, start asking questions and be pro-active about encouraging them to go get it checked out and seek help."

People who think they may be having a heart attack should call 911 rather than try to drive themselves to a hospital, because if the person loses consciousness, they may crash and hurt themselves and others. Similarly, calling 911 for another person is better than trying to drive them to a hospital because if they go unresponsive on the way, the driver will not be able to help them.

To shorten the time before the heart attack patient gets treatment, Parkview has been working with the Mexia Fire Department EMS Waco Cardiology and Waco hospitals, working as a region, to improve medical care.

For example, Mexia EMS can fax an EKG to a doctor from the field, she said. If the doctor recognizes that the patient is having a massive heart attack, they can get a helicopter to meet them and fly the patient straight to Waco to the catheter lab.

The hospital board has even established a landing zone at the hospital, rather than keep the old landing zone at the Armory. Now when a patient arrives with chest pain they auto-

matically call a Code Chest Pain, which cuts the time to Waco by 10 minutes, since the air ambulance team needs 10 minutes to do weather checks, helicopter checks and their pre-flight checks to make sure they can launch -- and cutting their response time can mean a better outcome for heart attack patients.

"The earlier you seek care, the better," LaFoy said. "What we say is, 'Time is muscle,' and the longer you wait to seek medical care, the more muscle dies and the longer you have to live with heart failure or heart damage."

New Parkview CEO Bob Honeycutt later thanked LaFoy for her leadership at Parkview's Emergency Room.

"Teri's excellent communication with EMS and the ED (Emergency Department) staff at Parkview Regional Hospital makes a difference in the matter of saving lives," Honeycutt said. "When you're experiencing chest pain, every minute matters. Teri and her team take that response time very seriously. The ER at Parkview Regional Hospital is a higher level place now, always striving to do what's best for the patient and our community."

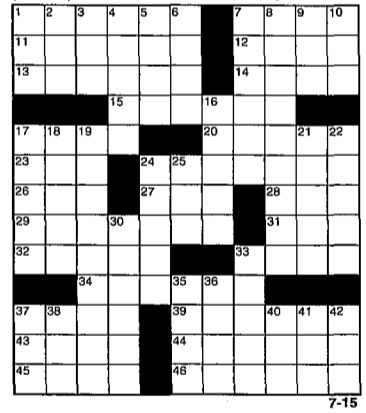

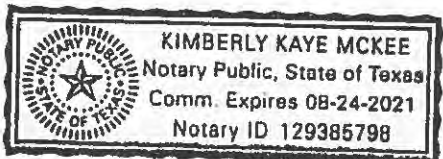

Locations used to be names, not numbers

Editor's note: This is the second of two columns highlighting locations of note in Madison County.

If I told you to go out past where Miss Louise Hatcher's house once stood, could you? Maybe you could if I said "Turn right on Concord Road, up North 75 about a mile past the Highway Department." For many years, Miss Hatcher (1909-2005) lived on the left a ways down that road. She taught in Madisonville High School for decades, I know at least some math classes and Spanish, and she was a strong teacher. She was a spinster, which we students thought was strange. Now I feel bad realizing she must have lived a hard and lonely life. Not long ago I heard that as late as the 70s, her home had no hot water heater, she heated water on her stove! Until her mother died in 1981

and her brother in 1991, they lived there too. Miss Hatcher loved her cats and to tell visitors about them.

Could you locate the home owned by Roger Knight Senior (1910-1991) and his wife, Louise (1912-1989)? If so, you'd be on Woodrow Street, which I had to look up! That's sad, since I drive on it daily! Mrs. Knight was an English teacher at

Madisonville High School for many years, at Junior High before that. She was a top-notch teacher. Her maiden name was Griffin, and that's now her youngest granddaughter's name. Mrs. Knight was not a Madison County native, but since it was her son's home, no place else mattered. Roger Senior was a lawyer, and it looks like that profession is staying in the family for now. I'm sure I'm not the only one that remembers him walking into First Baptist Church services late but jingling his change as he strolled down to the front row.

Can you easily go to the home of the late Glenn (1916-1992) and Lena (1917-2012) Mathis? Recently that place sold. It's on 1452 West, a few miles off Highway 21, across

from Leland and Barbara Corley's home. Glenn was a cattle rancher and later in life traveled working in the oil industry. Lena taught school and was Madisonville High School counselor for years. They raised 2 sons, Forrest (1943-2004) and Bruce (1946-1966), who rode the same school bus (#5) that I did. Bruce was tragically killed in a car wreck before his 20th birthday. Forrest went to school here some, played football too, but much of his early education was elsewhere. Due to Lena's exposure to measles during pregnancy, Forrest was deaf and had to be trained in lip reading. The fact that he played Mustang football is a real tribute to his coaches as well as to Forrest.

Loyd (Senior, 1900-

1985) and Bess (1902-1989) Whitmire's home no longer stands, but some of you pass the spot often. It was on the south side of OSR a few miles west of Highway 75. Their daughter, Jo Cannon, has told me that early in their marriage, her parents and family lived other places around the county, too, but their beautiful OSR home housed them in their later years. Jo has also told me that her father pipelined overseas when she was young, but when I remember him, he had a dairy behind their home. He raised Brown Swiss cattle and was quite successful showing them, too. Mr. and Mrs. Whitmire were fine folks, let me tell you! I spent the night in that house in the 60s once, with their granddaughter, my cous-

in, Dianne Cannon. That night, they switched the cattle from hand milking to electric milkers, and you've never seen a better rodeo than those Brown Swiss put on!

When we keep folks' names and their stories in our conversations, they don't seem so far gone. It worked for me today, hopefully for you too. Perhaps some readers will enjoy this Musings in 2018 and keep these good folks' stories alive then!

My father-in-law started a business as an LLC few years ago. He named all his daughters owners, with him owning the majority share. The business failed, and now he is being sued by creditors. He told the family these creditors can't come after us and the other siblings, because he is the majority owner. Is this true, or should we get a lawyer?

Dear Caleb:

Your wife is probably not in danger, unless she signed paperwork making her liable for a loan or liable with a creditor. If she signed official, legal paperwork — like if she went down to the bank and signed on a loan — then she's liable. It's that simple. That would make her, or any of her siblings who did this, co-makers on the loan.

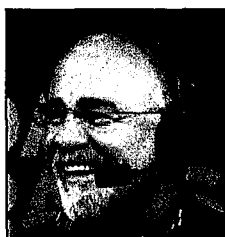
Your wife, and any of her sisters, who signed on trade accounts taking supplies from a supplier and paying them could also be liable. But they are not automatically liable simply because they were listed as minority owners in an LLC, or even a sub-S corporation. If it were a general partnership, there's a possibility they could be liable. That's one of the reasons I hate general partnerships. I hate partnerships in general, but I hate general partnerships, too!

In other words, I think you're OK. I would still advise speaking with an attorney, and giving him or her all the details of this situation, to be absolutely certain.

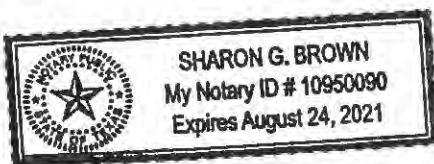

US stocks finish slightly lower after light day of trading

A listless day of trading on Wall Street ended with major stock indexes closing slightly lower Tuesday, weighed down by losses among some big technology companies.

Apple slid 2.5 percent amid speculation that the consumer electronics giant might cut its targets for sales of its latest iPhone. Banks also declined, outweighing gains by energy companies and retailers. Oil prices closed higher.

Trading was light as investors returned from the Christmas holiday.

"It's a low-volume day after Christmas, with hardly anything going on," said Tom Martin, senior portfolio manager with Global Investments. "You have one piece of news that is significant on a major company, Apple. That moved some of the components around."

The Standard & Poor's 500 index fell 2.84 points, or 0.1 percent, to 2,680.50. The Dow Jones industrial average slid 7.85 points, or 0.03 percent, to 24,746.21. The Nasdaq lost 23.71 points, or 0.3 percent, to 6,936.25. The Russell 2000 index of smaller-company stocks picked up 1.30 points, or 0.1 percent, to 1,544.23.

Stocks had finished higher for five straight weeks heading into this week. They are on pace to finish every month this year with gains, when dividends are included.

The major indexes were slightly lower early on and veered little for the rest of the day. It was the lightest day of trading, imrabouta.com

as 30 percent on Friday. Bitcoin futures on the Cboe Futures Exchange rose 13.3 percent to settle at \$15,810.

The futures contracts allow investors to make bets on the future price of bitcoin. The price of the digital currency has soared this year, having begun 2017 under \$1,000.

Many economists and market watchers believe bitcoin is in a speculative bubble that could burst any time. Major markets in Europe were closed for a holiday. In Asia, markets were mixed in light trading. Tokyo's Nikkei 225 shed 0.2 percent, while Seoul's Kospi fell 0.5 percent and India's Sensex gained 0.2 percent. Shares in Taiwan and Singapore declined while Bangkok rose.

Markets in Hong Kong and Australia were also closed for a holiday.

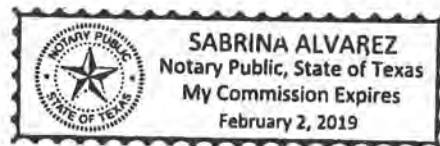



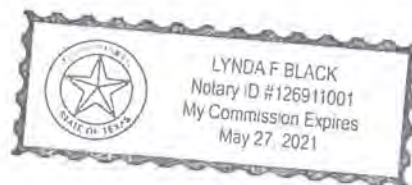

Policia mata a sospechoso de asesinato en Uptown

Un tiroteo en el que participó un policía puso un final sangriento a una persecución que empezó el martes en la mañana con una balacera en un complejo de apartamentos en Uptown.

A eso de las 10 a.m., la policía encontró muerta a Nancy Churchill, de 52 años, y quien trabajaba como administradora de un complejo cerca del Perot Museum.

El sospechoso era un ex guardia de seguridad en el mismo edificio, dijo el subjefe de policía Thomas Castro.

Las autoridades encontraron al sospechoso, Marlon Smith, de 29 años, tres horas más tarde en la cuadra 2100 de Hulse Boulevard, en Oak Cliff.

La jefa de policía, U. Renee Hall, dijo que Smith intercambió fuego con dos policías y un U.S. Marshal antes de que fuera abatido por los agentes. No hubo heridos pero un vehículo policial quedó afectado.

"Obviamente no es algo que nos deja tranquilos", dijo Hall. "Nos perturba como comunidad que se contrate a individuos para protegernos y cuando se dan la vuelta puedan hacer daño".

Curtis King, que ha vivido en el complejo por 10 años, dijo que bajó las gradas para retirar un paquete y encontró al edificio rodeado de policías.

Le explicaron que alguien recibió un disparo. Los empleados del complejo le dijeron que era una administradora conocida por dejar dulces para los residentes en el lobby.

Acusan a pastor de Mesquite de asalto sexual

Un pastor de Mesquite fue arrestado bajo cargos de asalto sexual de un adolescente por más de un año.

Steve Aaron Winn, de 33 años, un pastor de la iglesia bautista Open Door se encuentra en la cárcel del condado de Dallas el jueves con tres cargos de asalto sexual a un menor. También enfrenta tres cargos de asalto sexual a un menor en el condado de Kaufman.

La policía dice que la víctima tenía 15 años cuando comenzaron los abusos y que la relación duró 14 meses. Las autoridades conocieron las acusaciones el pasado 18 de febrero y arrestaron a Winn cuatro días más tarde.

La víctima es un estudiante de la academia cristiana de la escuela, dijo la policía.

Open Door dijo a KXAS-TV (NBC5) que Winn era un voluntario, no un empleado. La iglesia no ha hecho ningún otro comentario.

Winn, un residente de Crandall, había trabajado en el Departamento de Obras Públicas

de Mesquite por 14 años, hasta que fue despedido la semana pasada, dijo la policía.

Winn permanece recluido con una fianza de \$75,000. Al parecer no hay un historial criminal previo.

Mexicana sentenciada a 18 años por narcolavado

Una mexicana fue sentenciada el lunes a 18 años de prisión por lavado de dinero, obtenido por la venta de metanfetaminas que cocinaba junto a su marido.

Marisol Carmona Arreola Ávalos, de 43 años, se declaró culpable en junio de un cargo de conspiración para lavar dinero.

Arreola y su marido, José Ávalos, cocinaban y limpiaban metanfetaminas en su casa en Wilmer, a 15 millas del centro de Dallas. La operación tuvo lugar entre septiembre de 2015 y marzo de 2016, dice el acuerdo judicial.

La policía de Dallas realizó un allanamiento de su casa en marzo de 2016 e incautó 172 kilos de metadona líquida y en cristal, además de armas y miles de dólares en efectivo.

Arreola usó el dinero de la venta de drogas para pagar por el material para producir las drogas que fabricaban en su casa.

José Ávalos fue sentenciado el año pasado a 27 años de prisión luego de declararse culpa-

ble de posesión con intención de distribuir una sustancia controlada.

took me to the ER. The all of the doctors and the medical staff checked on me. That is when they said I had congestive heart failure," Wilcox said. "I stayed a week at the hospital, and they all did all kind of tests. My mom was nervous because she had congestive heart failure and she has had her heart valve replaced. So she kind of knew the road that I potentially could go down."

Wilcox stated she was placed on medication, but a month later symptoms returned. Doctors determined that she needed to have surgery to have a pacemaker installed, which took place and was successful.

Health issues surfaced again in 2015 when her doctors sent her to see a heart failure specialist at Baylor University Medical Center in Dallas. During the visit, she was told that she had to have open-heart surgery to repair two of the four valves in the heart.

Wilcox stated her attention at the time was focused outside of the hospital walls.

"Well, if I am going to feel better, let's go ahead and do it. I didn't think let's not do it. I had my first open heart surgery December 2015. The surgery was successful. I actually planned it a week before Christmas break so I could have those two weeks off. I had those three weeks off, and when Christmas break was over I went back to school," Wilcox stated. "To me, I am a fighter. I refuse to be a victim of my illness. I refuse to let that keep me down and refuse to be depressed about that. I am blessed that I am still here. This is just a setback."

But the setbacks continued.

Issues again arose when Wilcox began to experience blackouts after returning to school in January 2016. The first of three happened after coming back from church. Her husband, Melvin, was driving them home and she blacked out in the passenger seat of the car for about five minutes. The second time was at Waxahachie High School when she fell out of a chair. She busted her lip and was taken to the hospital, later returning to school.

After speaking with her doctors Wilcox spent a week in the hospital.

"The third time that I had a blackout I was at Crafty Scraper in the downtown square. I called my doctor and said this was happening for the third time. I got to the ER and they put a central (line) in at the ER and then I had to be (taken) to big Baylor. At that time they kept me," Wilcox recalled. "The heart failure team came in and said, 'this should not be happening after your open-heart surgery. What is going on.' They looked through everything. Come to find out my old pacemaker was set at 40 (beats per minute). So those three times my I blacked out my old heart was below 40. My heart was stopping and my pacemaker kicked in."

Doctors installed a new pacemaker, which was set at 80 beats per minute. If her heart rate ever dropped below 80 beats, it would kick in and level Wilcox out. Two leads were installed by doctors the bottom and top of the heart to keep a constant track of it during the surgery.

A short time later in March, Wilcox suffered a stroke after school while

teaching Charmer parents a routine for the spring show. The cause behind it was that she was not on blood thinners, which led to her being prescribed to Warfarin. The medication helped keep her blood not too thick or thin but evened it out.

Wilcox again met with doctors in January 2017 where a heart Catheterization procedure was done.

According to the Mayo Clinic's website, cardiac catheterization is a procedure used to diagnose and treat cardiovascular conditions. A long thin tube known as a catheter is inserted into an artery or the vein in your groin, neck or arm. It is done to see if a person has a heart problem or as a part of a procedure to correct a heart problem doctors already know about.

Once the test was completed, she was given two choices – the first being that she could have a left ventricular assisted device installed. This device helps the heart pump blood throughout the body. The doctor told her this would increase her quality of life but not the quantity. They also informed her that they didn't have anything to treat the failure on her right side of her heart.

"So in the hospital stay I discussed it with my doctors, my husband, and with my mom," Wilcox remembered. "That was when we made the decision to do the transplant."

She continued, stating that once you make the decision to go forward with a transplant your not immediately placed on the list. The transplant committee has to give its approval after making sure that a person is physically qualified to be a candidate for the procedure. Then the insurance company has to offer its approval due to the expense involved. If the insurance company does not approve the procedure, it does not move forward. After meeting with the doctor on a Tuesday she got the news on Friday that both groups had given the green light.

"My congestive heart failure nurse, who is also the transplant coordinator, she called me. It was about 5 o'clock that day. I was going to Cain's Chicken and I was going through the drive-thru. She said, 'hey Erica, you are approved. You are officially on the transplant list,'" Wilcox stated. "For that moment I was like, 'wait what happens now.' Then she said, 'I am going to give you a callback and I am going to give you all the information you need.'"

Wilcox had to have an IV 24 hours a day with a peripherally inserted central catheter (PICC) line to pump medication through her body. To conceal it, she wore long-sleeved shirts or jackets and a fanny pack. Two days a week she would go home for lunch where a

home health nurse would change out the PICC line, clean out everything and sterilize. Then she would go back to work. Prior to the transplant, Wilcox went to a course with the hospital staff to understand what was going to happen along with the financials involved.

"Once I was on the transplant list I could not go anywhere further than three hours away from the hospital. So that was a big shock too because I like to travel and go places. I could not do any of that. I was fortunate because I was only on the transplant list for four months," Wilcox said. "My doctors and nurses always laughed at me because I told them that I would prefer for my transplant to happen after the banquet and the Charmer year is over. They were like, 'we really can't plan it like that, but you know if you get the call and it is before banquet we can't help you there.' I said, 'I want to get the year over with so I can have the summer to heal.' So I prayed about it."

It was April 2017 when Wilcox received the call while hosting Charmer tryouts. The medical staff told her that there was a heart available, but there was another patient that needed both a heart and lungs. So she went to the hospital, prepped for surgery, and placed on standby in case the other patient could not use heart.

Then she waited. "That is when the transplant surgeon came out and told me, 'if this was the last resort for you I would give you this heart. But since you're so young (Wilcox is 33) and you are in shape, I don't want to potentially have to do another surgery on you. This heart is not for you. I need the perfect heart for you,'" Wilcox recalled.

"I was crushed." Wilcox never dwelt on this setback but only looked at what was ahead and what needed to be done. Two days later she was released from the hospital.

The perfect heart came two weeks later at about 11 p.m. But medical staff at the hospital were unable

to reach Wilcox or husband, Melvin, on their cell phones. That is when they called her mother, who then told relayed the news.

Wilcox and her husband then left for Roberts Hospital at Baylor University Medical Center in Dallas where the transplant team was waiting. The surgery took between eight to nine hours and, at 10 a.m. the next morning, Melvin was told everything went well.

Dr. Parag Kale, part of Wilcox's transplant team, listed several factors that made her a good candidate for this procedure. Those include her age, physical fitness, and the "fighting spirit" she brought when approaching these health matters.

He noted the family history of heart disease contributed to Wilcox having issues at such a young age.

"When we look at the questions about heart transplants one we ask is if they are fit enough and are they well enough? By virtue of being fit enough we look at if they have looked at all other options like medication," Kale said. "In her case she had a pacemaker and several surgeries done. There was also medication optimization done. All these were exhausted before a transplant was made."

Kale explained that Wilcox, apart from the issues with the heart, was well enough to where she would be able to benefit from a heart transplant. He continued, stating that Wilcox also had the support team in place to help her through the postoperative process.

Wilcox was kept unconscious for four days due to a high heart rate after transplant. The fourth day she was woken up. She recalled that it was Mother's Day and her mother stated that, "this was the

best Mother's Day gift she could ask for."

On the sixth-day, medical staff got her out of bed to sit in a chair. The seventh day she was moved to the regular heart floor. Physical and occupational therapists then began working to have her walk around the floor.

"I had a friend who was a heart transplant recipient as well, and he is a coach. He came and visited me, and the coach in him told me that the more I walk, the quicker that I was going to get out of that hospital. He said, 'when they tell you to walk two laps, I want you to walk four.' So I took that, and I ran with that," Wilcox recalled.

"The nurse she would tell me to go walk for two or three minutes. I would tell my husband that I would want to walk 10 minutes. I just started pushing it. Eventually, I am walking 30 laps, and I am walking by myself."

Wilcox was released from the hospital 18 days later. She was initially set to go back to work in September, but due to her progress, doctors allowed her to attend Charmers summer camp in July.

In August she got the chance to view her original heart with her doctor and go over what happened that led to her congestive heart failure.

"It was kind of like an out-of-body experience to know that I am holding the heart that I was born with and to watch the doctor dissect it and open it up and go over everything on the inside of my heart," Wilcox said

She explained that doctors discovered, well, not much. The determined the congestive heart failure was due to an unknown factor.

Now eight months after

the transplant, Wilcox can notice the transformation that has taken place, which has given her more energy. It also allowed her to resume a more normal diet where before she had to watch her eating habits very closely.

The donor of Wilcox's heart was a 21-year-old man. She has reached out to the family through letters and hopes one day to meet them in person to thank them for the gift of life.

"It takes time, but I am going to keep sending letters and reaching out to them and telling them 'thank you' and that 'I appreciate your loved one being an organ donor.' By doing that he saved my life," Wilcox stated. "It means a lot. Even though a life had been lost, they still live within me and saved my life. So it means a lot. Modern-day science and my faith have brought me through. I have stopped and haven't missed a beat. I just keep going and keep persevering."

She advises people that are facing a situation like hers not to become a victim of their diagnoses, hold to their faith, reach out others for support, and live their life one day at a time and to the fullest.

Wilcox thanks her family, friends, fellow teachers and district staff, and students for showing their support through this time.

She feels that God has more in store for her life and wants to help people who are on the transplant list. She wants to provide that same level of support people showed her to others.

During the funeral service, his sister relayed a story of how Husfeld's "pranking" even got the attention of the local postal worker, when as a kid he placed a live possum in the family's mailbox.

Husfeld had touched the lives of many during his lifetime in Grimes County, whether through his political service as commissioner since 2015 or through his business with Husfeld Construction Co. Inc. He had a love for music and barbecue and would often combine the two to entertain his family and friends. A life-long

Grimes County boy at heart, many in the county had raised their children alongside his or had attended Navasota High School with him.

"He and I grew up together, kindergarten until our graduation in 1969," said Grimes County Sheriff Don Sowell. "He was a dear friend and comrade and will be missed."

Husfeld was laid to rest in the Husfeld Family Cemetery in Piedmont, but his mark on Grimes County can never be erased.

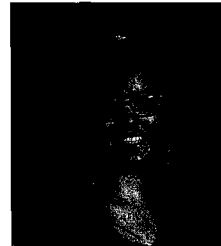

Resident and Planning & Zoning board member, Randy Peters told council that Jones had moved from the home more than three years ago. He supported Dimmel's testimony about theft - that even "the garage door was carried off."

He also expressed his concern that the "eyesore" will have a negative impact on home sales

of the soon-to-be-developed Dove Court subdivision.

Other residents spoke of the thefts, debris flying into their yards, the danger to children and the affect on property values.

Before council's unanimous vote approving the demolition in 30 days, Gruver clarified that the 30-day countdown begins the day he receives the last return receipt notification advising the involved parties of the order.

City Manager Brad Stafford told council: "We'll get with le-

gal counsel and we'll figure out the quickest way to get this done, with effort being made to get our money back from the mortgage company's insurance."

Mayor Pro-Tem Grant Holt was not present for Monday's meeting. No one attended to speak against the demolition.

Fee Increase for trash collection

Council members approved the 2.2 percent rate increase requested by Republic Services,

Inc. for residential trash pickup. Stafford told council that residents will see about a \$0.30 increase to their utility bill.

The increase is adjusted according to the Consumer Price Index. The last increase was approved in 2016 and was the first in four years.

Shuttles to relieve TBB traffic

Marketing Coordinator Casey Ellis reported that everything is in place for the Texas Birthday Bash March 2-3. Six 15-passenger shuttle vans will be running from Navasota High School to downtown, with one that will pick up at local hotels if called, and one that will run to Washington-on-the-Brazos State Park. Texas Birthday Bash tickets are \$5 until midnight, March 1, when they will increase to \$10. Visitors can avoid the lines by ordering online.

Other council actions:

Tabled for additional research was consideration and possible action on the selection of an engineer for relocation of the city's RV Park from airport property to city park property at August Horst park.

Approved was the second reading of an ordinance amending the budget by adding \$24,000 to Swimming Pool Capital Outlay from General Fund Reserves for resurfacing and repairing the pool deck area.

No action was taken on approval of a joint election contract between the city of Navasota, Grimes County and the Navasota Independent School District. Council members tabled the item for additional information related to Special Election for House District 13 representative ordered by Gov. Greg Abbott. The Special Election is to fill the house seat of Leighton Schubert, who resigned Jan. 29 before completion of his term.

Lady Tiger hoops battles hard, but falls short vs. Tenaha

JEWETT - The Centerville Lady Tiger basketball team battled hard, but couldn't hold on at the end, falling 39-29 Friday, Feb. 23, to the Tenaha Lady Tigers. Centerville fell to Tenaha - tied for fifth in Class 2A in this week's Texas Girls Coaches Association poll - in the Class 2A Region 3 Tournament semifinals, played at Leon High School's Cougar Gym in Jewett. Centerville - led by Coach Rick Dickson - finished their 2017-18 season at 30-9, and are tied for ninth in Class 2A in this week's TGCA poll.

The Lady Tigers advanced to the Class 2A Region 3 Tournament semifinals on Tuesday,

Feb. 20, with a 45-31 win over the rival Lovelady Lady Lions in the Region 3 quarterfinals. The Centerville-Lovelady contest was also played at Leon High School's Cougar Gym.

It was the fourth meeting of the season between the two schools. Centerville and Lovelady tied for second place in District 20-2A, with Centerville defeating Lovelady 53-41 on Saturday, Feb. 7, at Crockett High School's Bulldog Gym in a one-game playoff to determine post-season seeding. Centerville competed in post-season as the 20-2A runner-up, while Lovelady was competing as the district's third-place

team.

In their season-ending playoff loss to Tenaha - the District 22-2A champion - after finishing the first quarter tied 6-6, Centerville grabbed an early second-quarter lead, and held it until the fourth quarter. The Lady Tigers led Tenaha 19-12 at halftime, but Tenaha rallied in the third quarter and began chipping away at the lead, and pulled within one point of Centerville, 25-24, at the end of the third quarter.

And that's when Centerville had a cold shooting stretch. Tenaha scored a free throw to tie the game 25-25, then hit a bucket at 6:12 remaining in the game

to take its first lead of the game, 27-25.

Centerville, meanwhile, didn't score another point until there was just over a minute left in the game, and also had three players exit the contest in the final frame after fouling out. Raylynn Brewer's three-pointer late in the fourth quarter cut Tenaha's lead over Centerville to eight points, 36-28, and the Lady Tigers managed just a Brittany West free throw the rest of the way in the 39-29 loss.

Centerville scoring in the Region 3 semifinal loss to Tenaha was led by Tara Goolsby with eight points, followed by Brewer with six - on two three-point shots - West with seven, Sara Stutzman with five - including a three-pointer - and Hannah Matthews with three.

In Region 3 quarterfinals action on Tuesday, Feb. 20, in Jewett, the Lady Tigers earned a 45-31 over Lovelady in the two school's fourth meeting of the 2017-18 season.

"We were up 15-3 after one, and 22-8 at the

half. Our energy on defense early set the tone for the game. We controlled the glass and dictated what we allowed them to do offensively," said Dickson.

Centerville scoring in

the win over Lovelady was paced by West with 14 points, followed by Stutzman with 12 - including one three-pointer - Brewer and Goolsby with eight each, and Averi Hancock with three.

use "to become better citizens, better parents, better Americans."

"Many of the (Semper Fi Fund) veterans can't work because of their injuries, and are just sitting at home, not doing anything. Things like this are a way to give them a purpose, an interest in something. It's a way to teach them something they can make with their hands, and get them back into life," Mayer said.

"The whole idea is to give them a mission, to work towards a cause. This week isn't a vacation; it's about pursuing something they may can turn into an occupation."

Williams said the support from the local community has been "great" in 2018. Centerville ISD donated the use of the livestock barn - the former home of the Leon County Fair prior to the Leon Coun-

ty Expo Center being built. Numerous others have contributed as well, such as Ernie and Pam Ferguson of Keechi - owners of The Pharm Restaurant in Buffalo - who allowed all to bunk at their ranch, so that the veterans and instructors wouldn't have to foot a hotel bill; many who donated and prepare meals; Catalena Hatters, who donated hats to all veterans; and Tanos Exploration, who donated a saddle to the Jinx McCain Horsemanship Program.

The veterans also received a visit on Monday, Feb. 19, from U.S. Rep. Kevin Brady, who represents a portion of Leon County which includes Centerville. Brady spoke to veterans and watched the work, as well as presented all the veterans with a \$200 gift certificate to Rodeo Western Wear in Jewett, for use in purchasing cowboy boots.

"Overall, it's been a

very successful clinic," Williams said.

One of the veterans taking part was Travis Green, a U.S. Marine Corps veteran who is originally from Victoria, but now hails from Canyon Lake. Green, who said he served "all over the place," lost both legs in combat in Afghanistan in September 2011.

Green said he's "done metalwork" before, but hadn't tried his hands at making spurs before. He said he's going to add it to his welding fabrication and machining business.

"I have all the tools in place, and a shop to do it, and I'm going to start making spurs. But I'm nowhere near the level of these guys," he said, pointing towards Williams.

Williams, peeking at Green's first-time effort, smiled.

"You should've seen my first pair. They were nothing compared to yours," he said.

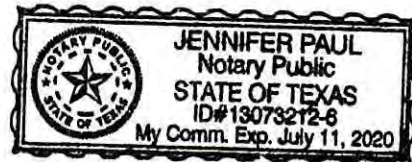

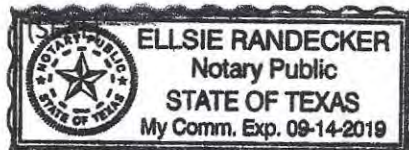

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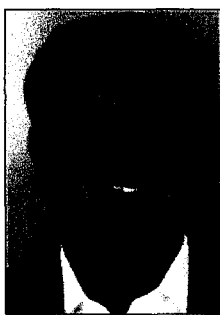

3 Steps to Take Now for a Luxurious Summer Lawn

In a few short months the family will enjoy spending time playing outside in the grass. Or will they?

We tend to really pay attention to our lawns during the sweltering heat of the summer. Yet late February and early March, when the weather is more moderate and comfortable, is the time to prepare for a luxurious landscape. Here are the important steps to making your yard an oasis for your family's enjoyment and a vision of beauty for those who drive by.

PRUNE AND CUT BACK

Many shrubs benefit from pruning in the early spring. When you thin out the structure of small trees, like crape myrtle, it improves the structure and provides more energy for lots of blooms during the summer. To avoid topping out a big crape myrtle, which can look ugly for several months, plant a variety of tree/shrub with an ultimate height to fit your landscape. Use sharp tools and cut at a 45 degree angle. Consider giving your shrubs a completely differ-

ent shape this year.

Cut down banana trees to 18 inches above the ground. While these trees are soft, you want to use sharp trimming shears to make a clean cut. Wear old clothing and gloves because the sap produces black stains. Cut down cannas to 4 inches above the ground to give them a fresh start. Prune roses to a third of their height. Remove deadwood from all the plants to allow energy to be channeled to the fresh, attractive parts of the plants.

PREPARE FLOWER BEDS

Start by trenching around the bed edges using a sharp, straight-edge spade to define the perimeters of the bed. Turn the soil within the flower bed. Beware of sprinkler pipes, utility cables or gas lines leading

to lamps or BBQ pits. Consider using a granular pre-emergence herbicide. They are formulated to kill only broadleaf and grassy weeds by preventing seed germination. If you want to avoid chemicals which have the potential of depleting the soil of good microorganisms and earthworms, you can always spot-spray the chemical or resign to pulling the weeds individually.

CHANGING NEEDS FOR MOWING

In many areas of the county, compacted soil is a big obstacle to good lawn health. The winter cold makes the ground more dense and makes it hard for the grass to get access to water and air for good growth. While it will loosen up a little as the weather warms, you can expedite the process by aerating your soil. This can be done with a spade or pitch fork poked in the ground all over the yard. An easier, and perhaps more effective way is to rent a gas-powered device which will extract plugs of soil from the lawn.

It's about time for the bi-weekly mowing, but

first start with mowing the yard lower than in the summer months. You don't want to "scalp" the lawn because it looks bad and doesn't make the grass green up any more quickly. Usually a blade height of 3 inches is about right.

Use a broadcast spreader to apply fertilizer when the outside temperature reaches about 70 degrees. It's best to use a slow-release nitrogen mix at a rate of no more than one pound per 1,000 square feet. Extreme cold or heat can cause a reaction between the fertilizer and the grass, so watch out for good timing for best results.

This time of year is a favorite of many people in our area. It's a very good time to get out and take care of the yard for maximum enjoyment during the summer months.

Tomatoes, peppers and herbs

Family cemetery discovered on former Russo property



By Lillie Ruby

Glenbrook residents have discovered a graveyard on the former Russo property that holds the remains of members of the Cassaro and Crisafi families. While it is not known at this time exactly how many people are interred there or what family surnames are included, there is some evidence that other graves and possible markers are also located on the property. What appears to be part of a stump

tombstone has no name on it. The stump tombstone may indicate a Woodman of the World marker but it has been damaged. There also appears to be a ground wall surrounding the graves. The graveyard was not included in a cemetery survey conducted in Waller County in the 1970s. Family cemeteries were not always included, or known about to be included the survey. The two identifiable graves are of Angelo

Leonard Cassaro, who was born January 14, 1922 and died December 13, 1988. Cassaro is identified by a US Navy military World War II marker. The other identifiable grave, nearly 100 years old, is for Santo Crisafi who was born December 17, 1902 and died October 22, 1918. Marion Russo's November 2014 obituary lists his mother as Mary Cassaro Russo. It is not known at this time how Angelo Leonard Cassaro

is related or if the Crisafi family is related to the Russo family.

Glenbrook residents discovered the cemetery while working to stop the construction of an RV Park on the property. The property is located to the north of the subdivision.

Without documentation by citizens such as those in Glenbrook, family cemeteries are often lost to time as family members move away or pass on. The Russo property was sold after Helen Ramona Robicheaux Russo, Russo's wife moved to Katy.

Helen Robicheaux is the descendant of the Stockdick family. Her mother Mabel was the daughter of Chester Stockdick. Chester Stockdick was the son of William Chester Stockdick. The Stockdick family arrived in Waller County in 1896 and began rice farming. The family is related to many Waller County rice farming families. The cemetery has



been documented with the State of Texas and Glenbrook residents are working with the Texas State Historical Society.

Certain legal restrictions concerning the cemetery and any construction will apply through the Texas Health and Safety Codes.

for the ambulance personnel. About that same time the City of Pattison applied and received a grant for \$23,000 that was used to purchase appliances for the fire department and those ambulance personnel. After that buildout and expenditure, the ambulance was stationed in Pattison once again.

Garcia went on to state that the area has had population, traffic and industrial growth increases and experienced several natural disasters in the past twenty-four months. During those disasters, the PAVFD was a staging area for emergency responders. The parking lot

was filled to capacity with equipment, boats, personnel etc.

Garcia then stated his desire that the WHESD 200 amend their budget to put another ambulance into service that would be stationed at PAVFD as quickly as possible. He followed that up with information from the ESD meeting minutes stating that in September of 2017 a Public Hearing was held about increases in the tax rate and a projected increase in income from that increase at approximately \$600,000. Garcia stated that the January 2017 minutes

from the ESD Board show that the ESD pays the Waller County Emergency Services approximately \$125,000 per month, adding that another ambulance would not exceed the projected increase in income.

Garcia said that a citizen of the area told him that if someone were to stand in Monaville and look north, that person would see three ambulances serving the northern part of the county. If that person looked south he/she would only see one ambulance serving the southern part of Waller County. Garcia continued by stating that the ESD took on the obligation of providing more service

on the south end of the county when those citizens (Brookshire) elected to join the ESD.

Garcia said, "It's my opinion the ESD should take steps to improve services, not juggle the available service to try and get by. Every time an ambulance on the south end of Waller County responds to a call an ambulance in the middle of the county or the north end of the county has to be moved down close to this area to try and reduce response time. We are just playing musical chairs, but we are still sitting on the same row."

Barry Wineman of the WHESD 200 responded by offering to answer questions. He corrected

Garcia by saying there are two ambulances in the south end of Waller County. He stated there was one on the north end of Katy on Stockdick School Road. Wineman stated that in his opinion the district wasn't prepared to do what they had to do when Katy said, "We're out of here." (Left the WHESD 200).

Garcia asked if there was a plan to put another ambulance into Pattison. Wineman stated not to his knowledge. Garcia asked if the ambulance was in Waller County. Wineman stated that is was not in Waller County, but in the Harris County part of the district.

Garcia continued saying the community had stepped up, the fire department had stepped up, that the emergency management had dispatched 24 hours a day during the disasters ending with, "We have done everything asked of us to have an ambulance here." Garcia stated that the time to act is now and that he felt the ESD should have taken action in 2013, 2014, and 2015 when they picked up other service areas.

Garcia asked for public comments from the audience. Comments included: Concerns about response time; an aging population; increasing train traffic that blocks emergency services, Stockdick School Road is eleven to twelve miles away and that's too far away from the schools, should the Brookshire ambulance not be avail-

able; one ambulance can't handle a situation where multiple people are hurt; possibility of extra coverage during peak call times.

After the citizen participation, Council motioned to approve Garcia pursuing his efforts to have an ambulance housed in the Pattison area. Garcia assured Wineman that he was willing to attend the WHESD 200 Board meetings and the WCEMS meetings to push the point of another ambulance. At one point Wineman stated decisions on the ambulance were really up to the WCEMS. Garcia protested, stating that the WCEMS has a contract that is paid by WCESD 200 and that they could have input through that contract. He repeated his resolve to attend the meetings about the matter.

A motion was made and passed approving the Resolution. The Resolution included reasons for the petition as: The City is a member of Waller Harris ESD 200 by vote and pays taxes to the district; the district was created to provide emergency services; Pattison is in a rapidly growing area of Waller County; the area has experienced several natural disasters; the City recognizes the need for a second ambulance in Southern Waller County and for at least one of them to be located in the Pattison area to protect and preserve the health, safety and welfare of all citizens in the area.
