




Corridor ID Timeline



Build the foundation for a long-term rail program

Corridor ID Program Overview

Build the foundation for a long-term rail program



Corridor ID creates a foundational framework for identifying and developing new or improved intercity passenger rail (IPR) services. Under the program, FRA will:

Bring world-class passenger rail service to regions across the country



Solicit proposal for implementing new or improving existing IPR services

Select corridors for development

Partner with corridor sponsor to prepare (or update) a Service Development Plan (SDP)

SDP includes a "corridor project inventory"

Corridor project inventories populate a prioritized "pipeline" of projects

Projects in the Corridor ID Pipeline are eligible for funding under FRA's financial assistance programs

Grow a safer, cleaner, more equitable rail system





Establishing the Program – Significant Policy Positions



Corridor ID will be the primary mechanism for developing off-Northeast Corridor intercity passenger rail corridors and projects for subsequent implementation


Level of non-Federal commitment may be modest at the beginning but must grow as a corridor advances through the Program




FRA Project Lifecycle Stages – Corresponding FRA Funding Programs

Selections made later this year will set the "baseline" for Corridor ID



Corridor ID map of selected corridors will illustrate FRA's plan for passenger rail development across the country for new AND existing corridors



FRA's goal is to align the two programs— Corridor ID produces the Project Pipeline for FSP-N



In future funding cycles, projects included in the Project Pipeline will receive priority funding under FSP-N











KEY PARTS OF A NOFO

A Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO):

- Announces the grant opportunity
- Contains details about the application requirements and procedures to request Federal funding for eligible projects







How do I apply?

KEY STEPS

- Obtain a Unique Entity Identifier (UEI)
- Register early in the Federal government's System for Award Management (SAM)
 - NOTE: SAM registration can take up to 4 weeks (longer if you do not have an Employer Identification Number)
- For Grants.gov, complete an Authorized Organization Representative profile and create a username and password
- Submit an application addressing all requirements outlined in the NOFO

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS

Corridor Narrative



A. CORRIDOR NARRATIVE

This section describes the minimum content required in the Corridor Narrative for applications under the Corridor ID Program. The Corridor Narrative must follow the basic outline below to address the Program requirements and to assist evaluators in locating relevant information.

I. Cover Page	See D.2.a.i.
II. Corridor Summary	See D.2.a.ii.
III. Corridor Funding	See D.2.a.iii.
IV. Applicant Eligibility	See D.2.a.iv.
V. Detailed Corridor Description	See D.2.a.v.
VI. Corridor Location	See D.2.a.vi.
VII. Evaluation and Selection Criteria	See D.2.a.vii.
VIII. DOT Strategic Goals	See D.2.a.viii.



- SF424 (Application for Federal Assistance)
 - SF 424A Budget info for Non-Construction
 - SF 424B— Assurances for Non-Construction
- FRA F 30- Additional Assurances and Certifications
- FRA F 251- FRA's Applicant Financial Capability Questionnaire (FRA F 251)
- SF LLL: Disclosure of Lobbying Activities (only required if reportable Lobbying activities exist)

Application Review and Selection Process

1. Intake and Eligibility

Each application is reviewed for completeness and eligibility to determine which applications move to the evaluation stage



3. Selection

Final decisions are made by taking into account the evaluation and selection criteria outlined in the NOFO



2. Evaluation

Each complete and eligible application is evaluated by a panel of DOT subject matter experts using criteria outlined in the NOFO (FRA has reserved the right to engage corridor sponsors to jointly determine what to advance into the program)




4. Announcement

FRA press release announces selections approximately 6 months following application due date




Best Practices – Helpful Hints

 Read the Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) completely and carefully to understand the criteria for eligibility and selection, and what information each application must include



 Provide a clear project title that tells us who you are and what the project is about





Best Practices – Corridor Narrative

Corridor Narrative Outline

- I. Cover Page
- II. Corridor Summary
- III. Corridor Funding
- IV. Applicant Eligibility
- V. Detailed Corridor Description
- VI. Corridor Location
- VII. Evaluation and Selection Criteria
- VIII. DOT Strategic Goals

- Structure your corridor narrative in accordance with the outline specified in the NOFO
- Include all elements identified in the outline
- ✓ Follow the instructions for each element
- Adhere to 15-page limit

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- ✓ If applicable, indicate amount of non-Program funding (Federal and non-Federal) available
- ✓ Identify source(s) of non-Program funds
- ✓ If non-Program Federal funding is available, demonstrate applicant's determination of eligibility for such use
- ✓ Note if any available non-Program funding must be obligated or spent by a certain date
- Whether Federal funding for the Corridor has previously been sought

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✓ Please read the NOFO for the 10 elements requested:

v. Detailed Corridor Description: Include a detailed Corridor description that expands upon the brief Corridor summary. This detailed description should address, at a minimum: (1) information regarding the basic characteristics of the Corridor, including the key geographic travel markets that must be served for the Corridor to fulfill its intended objectives, high-level initial estimates, preferably expressed as ranges or options, of certain Corridor characteristics (such as the potential service frequencies and travel times between the Corridor-defining markets, the potential geographic routes for the Corridor (particularly if the subject Corridor is intended to operate over existing rail lines), and, for Corridors with improvements to existing intercity passenger rail services, a detailed description of the improvements proposed to be developed under the Program); (2) information necessary to assess the readiness of the Corridor to enter into planning and development under the Program, including demonstrating the existing level of commitment of the applicant; (3) a description of any eligible activities (see section (C)) that have been completed or are currently ongoing for the Corridor; (4) the intended operator of the Corridor, if known; [12] (5) the legal, technical, and financial capability and capacity of the applicant and



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- Geospatial data (latitude and longitude or railroad mileposts)
- ✓ Include a map of the project
- Congressional districts the Corridor may traverse



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- ✓ Include a separate section in the corridor narrative focused on how the project meets each of the evaluation and selection criteria
- ✓ DO NOT rely solely on the contents of the "detailed corridor description" section to satisfy this requirement it is OK to repeat key points in this section
- Quantify benefits whenever possible



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- As applicable, efforts to consider climate change, sustainability impacts, improve equity, and reduce barriers to opportunity
- How Corridor planning and development may advance goodpaying, quality jobs and workforce programs and hiring policies that promote workforce inclusion.
- Additional information about strong labor standards

- Always read the NOFO carefully
- Address all the evaluation and selection criteria on which you will be rated
 - By clearly and directly responding to the criteria, your application will be easier to read and evaluate
 - Don't bury key points!
