SLOCOG, TAMC, and FRA will review all substantive comments received from the public and reviewing agencies. Consistent with state and Federal law, a Final Environmental Impact Statement/Environmental Impact Report will be circulated. The final document will include responses to substantive comments received on the Draft Environmental Impact Statement/Environmental Impact Report and will identify the preferred alternative.

Following circulation of the Final Environmental Impact Statement/Environmental Impact Report, if the decision is made to approve the preferred alternative, SLOCOG will publish a Notice of Determination for compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act and FRA will publish a Record of Decision for compliance with the National Environmental Policy Act. This is a programmatic, "tier 1" environmental review that considers a comprehensive list of potential physical rail improvements in addition to increased passenger rail service. The exact physical rail improvements necessary to accommodate additional passenger rail service in this corridor will be identified after the conclusion of the environmental review process and following discussions and negotiations between SLOCOG, TAMC, FRA, other agencies, and the railroad owner (Union Pacific Railroad). FRA, SLOCOG, and TAMC anticipate conducting future project-level or "tier 2" environmental reviews under both NEPA and CEQA for any physical improvements identified for potential construction. Further design refinements will also be necessary to inform any required tier 2 environmental reviews. Only after such further design and environmental review work could construction then proceed.

Abstract: The purpose of the proposed rail improvements to the Coast Corridor is to enhance safety and develop a faster and more reliable passenger and freight rail system that provides added capacity in response to increased travel demand between Los Angeles and San Francisco, and the cities in between.
