

La remodelación de Thanksgiving Tower recibiría \$6 millones del TIF-Downtown, mientras que para la fase dos de Trinity Groves se pretende un monto de \$13.9 millones del Distrito TIF-Sports Arena para construir apartamentos y más espacios comerciales cerca de los restaurantes están echando raíz al pie del puente Margaret Hunt Hill.

Court strikes down Idaho, Nevada bans

Judges say they violated rights; when weddings would happen unclear

BOISE, Idaho — A federal appeals court declared gay marriage legal in Idaho and Nevada on Tuesday, a day after the U.S. Supreme Court effectively legalized same-sex marriage in 30 other states.

The 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco struck down the two states' bans on gay marriage, ruling they violated equal protection rights.

"This is a super sweet victory," said Sue Latta, who along with Traci Ehlers sued Idaho last year to compel the state to recognize their 2008 marriage in California. Three other couples also joined the lawsuit to invalidate Idaho's same-sex marriage ban.

"Taxes are easier, real estate is easier, parenting is easier, end-of-life planning is easier," Latta said.

Exactly when same-sex weddings would happen in Idaho and Nevada was unclear.

A spokesman for Idaho Attorney General Lawrence Wasden said his office believes a previous 9th Circuit stay on marriages pending a U.S. Supreme Court appeal remains in place.

"We are reviewing the decision by the court and assessing all of Idaho's legal options," Wasden said in a statement.

Judge Stephen Reinhardt wrote for a unanimous three-judge panel that laws that treat people differently based on sexual orientation are unconstitutional unless there is a compelling government interest. He wrote that neither Idaho nor Nevada offered any legitimate reasons to discriminate against gay couples.

"Idaho and Nevada's marriage laws, by preventing same-sex couples from marrying and refusing to recognize same-sex marriages celebrated elsewhere, impose profound legal, financial, social and psychic harms on numerous citizens of those states," Reinhardt wrote.

He rejected the argument that same-sex marriages will devalue traditional marriage, leading to more out-of-wedlock births.

"This proposition reflects a crass and callous view of parental love and the parental bond that is not worthy of response," Reinhardt wrote. "We reject it out of hand."

State and federal court judges have been striking down bans at a rapid rate since a landmark U.S. Supreme Court ruling last

year.

On Monday, the nation's top court unexpectedly rejected appeals from five states seeking to preserve their bans. The decision cleared the way for a dramatic expansion of gay marriage in the United States and might have signaled that it's only a matter of time before same-sex couples can marry in all 50 states.

All three judges on the appeals court panel were appointed by Democratic presidents. President Bill Clinton appointed Judges Marsha Berzon and Ronald Gould. President Jimmy Carter appointed Reinhardt.

The court also has jurisdiction in three other states that still have marriage bans in place: Alaska, Arizona and Montana. Lawsuits challenging bans in those states are still pending in lower courts and have not reached the 9th Circuit.

States stay firm against licenses

Officials say they won't issue them until forced despite Monday ruling

WICHITA, Kan. — Conservative officials in some of the six states where Supreme Court action this week probably cleared the way for same-sex weddings say they won't issue marriage licenses to gay couples until their hands are forced. Now, gay rights advocates are preparing to do just that.

James Esseks, director of the American Civil Liberties Union's Lesbian Gay Bisexual and Transgender Project, called the court's action a "watershed moment for the entire country," and other gay rights activists described plans Tuesday to challenge remaining bans.

On Monday, the Supreme Court refused to take up appeals from five states seeking to preserve their bans. Couples in six other states — Colorado, Kansas, North Carolina, South Carolina, West Virginia and Wyoming — would be bound by those same appellate rulings that were put on hold.

'People have spoken'

In Kansas, Attorney General Derek Schmidt noted that to date no court has squarely decided whether the Kansas Constitution's prohibition on same-sex marriage is invalid, and he said that the state will deal with any litigation as it comes. Republican Gov. Sam Brownback, fighting a close re-election battle, has said the state should defend the ban.

"The people have spoken on this," Brownback said. "I don't know how much more you can bolster it than to have a vote of the people to put in the constitution that marriage is the union of a man and a woman."

Wyoming Gov. Matt Mead has said that the state's attorney general will continue defending its constitution defining marriage between a man and a woman and that the U.S. Supreme Court refusal to hear ap-

peals of gay marriage bans had no impact on a state case contesting that definition.

South Carolina's attorney general said if a court specifically rules against its gay marriage ban, he will then decide how to proceed.

Meanwhile, some of the indirectly affected states didn't feel the need to wait. In Colorado, which is also covered by the same 10th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals as Kansas, gay marriage is now officially legal. Attorney General John Suthers said Tuesday that all of the state's counties must issue the licenses.

Planning to fight

Nationally, the ACLU plans to fight state bans from circuit court to circuit court, said staff attorney Joshua Black, noting Tuesday's decision in the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of striking down Idaho and Nevada's bans on gay marriage.

In Kansas, where the state constitution specifically bans same-sex marriages, the ACLU affiliate spent Tuesday reaching out to lawyers to join its legal team for a federal challenge that would seek an immediate court order blocking the ban, given the precedent in the 10th Circuit. It could be filed as soon as next week, said Doug Bonney, legal director of the ACLU of Kansas and Western Missouri.

In Kansas' Reno County, Julia and Regina Johnson were given the necessary paperwork Tuesday for a marriage license before a clerk called them hours later to say their application was denied.

Reno County Chief Judge Patricia Macke Dick said she had no choice because there is no case that specifically overturns the Kansas same-sex marriage ban.

The only gay marriage-related lawsuit now in the Kansas courts is a narrow case filed by two couples who married in other states and sued Kansas over tax treatment. Their case is being heard next month.

Court strikes down Idaho, Nevada bans

Judges say they violated rights; when weddings would happen unclear

BOISE, Idaho — A federal appeals court declared gay marriage legal in Idaho and Nevada on Tuesday, a day after the U.S. Supreme Court effectively legalized same-sex marriage in 30 other states.

The 9th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals in San Francisco struck down the two states' bans on gay marriage, ruling they violated equal protection rights.

"This is a super sweet victory," said Sue Latta, who along with Traci Ehlers sued Idaho last year to compel the state to recognize their 2008 marriage in California. Three other couples also joined the lawsuit to invalidate Idaho's same-sex marriage ban.

"Taxes are easier, real estate is easier, parenting is easier, end-of-life planning is easier," Latta said.

Exactly when same-sex weddings would happen in Idaho and Nevada was unclear.

A spokesman for Idaho Attorney General Lawrence Wasden said his office believes a previous 9th Circuit stay on marriages pending a U.S. Supreme Court appeal remains in place.

"We are reviewing the decision by the court and assessing all of Idaho's legal options," Wasden said in a statement.

Judge Stephen Reinhardt wrote for a unanimous three-judge panel that laws that treat people differently based on sexual orientation are unconstitutional unless there is a compelling government interest. He wrote that neither Idaho nor Nevada offered any legitimate reasons to discriminate against gay couples.

"Idaho and Nevada's marriage laws, by preventing same-sex couples from marrying and refusing to recognize same-sex marriages celebrated elsewhere, impose profound legal, financial, social and psychic harms on numerous citizens of those states," Reinhardt wrote.

He rejected the argument that same-sex marriages will devalue traditional marriage, leading to more out-of-wedlock births.

"This proposition reflects a crass and callous view of parental love and the parental bond that is not worthy of response," Reinhardt wrote. "We reject it out of hand."

State and federal court judges have been striking down bans at a rapid rate since a landmark U.S. Supreme Court ruling last

year.

On Monday, the nation's top court unexpectedly rejected appeals from five states seeking to preserve their bans. The decision cleared the way for a dramatic expansion of gay marriage in the United States and might have signaled that it's only a matter of time before same-sex couples can marry in all 50 states.

All three judges on the appeals court panel were appointed by Democratic presidents. President Bill Clinton appointed Judges Marsha Berzon and Ronald Gould. President Jimmy Carter appointed Reinhardt.

The court also has jurisdiction in three other states that still have marriage bans in place: Alaska, Arizona and Montana. Lawsuits challenging bans in those states are still pending in lower courts and have not reached the 9th Circuit.

States stay firm against licenses

Officials say they won't issue them until forced despite Monday ruling

WICHITA, Kan. — Conservative officials in some of the six states where Supreme Court action this week probably cleared the way for same-sex weddings say they won't issue marriage licenses to gay couples until their hands are forced. Now, gay rights advocates are preparing to do just that.

James Esseks, director of the American Civil Liberties Union's Lesbian Gay Bisexual and Transgender Project, called the court's action a "watershed moment for the entire country," and other gay rights activists described plans Tuesday to challenge remaining bans.

On Monday, the Supreme Court refused to take up appeals from five states seeking to preserve their bans. Couples in six other states — Colorado, Kansas, North Carolina, South Carolina, West Virginia and Wyoming — would be bound by those same appellate rulings that were put on hold.

'People have spoken'

In Kansas, Attorney General Derek Schmidt noted that to date no court has squarely decided whether the Kansas Constitution's prohibition on same-sex marriage is invalid, and he said that the state will deal with any litigation as it comes. Republican Gov. Sam Brownback, fighting a close re-election battle, has said the state should defend the ban.

"The people have spoken on this," Brownback said. "I don't know how much more you can bolster it than to have a vote of the people to put in the constitution that marriage is the union of a man and a woman."

Wyoming Gov. Matt Mead has said that the state's attorney general will continue defending its constitution defining marriage between a man and a woman and that the U.S. Supreme Court refusal to hear ap-

peals of gay marriage bans had no impact on a state case contesting that definition.

South Carolina's attorney general said if a court specifically rules against its gay marriage ban, he will then decide how to proceed.

Meanwhile, some of the indirectly affected states didn't feel the need to wait. In Colorado, which is also covered by the same 10th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals as Kansas, gay marriage is now officially legal. Attorney General John Suthers said Tuesday that all of the state's counties must issue the licenses.

Planning to fight

Nationally, the ACLU plans to fight state bans from circuit court to circuit court, said staff attorney Joshua Black, noting Tuesday's decision in the 9th U.S. Circuit Court of striking down Idaho and Nevada's bans on gay marriage.

In Kansas, where the state constitution specifically bans same-sex marriages, the ACLU affiliate spent Tuesday reaching out to lawyers to join its legal team for a federal challenge that would seek an immediate court order blocking the ban, given the precedent in the 10th Circuit. It could be filed as soon as next week, said Doug Bonney, legal director of the ACLU of Kansas and Western Missouri.

In Kansas' Reno County, Julia and Regina Johnson were given the necessary paperwork Tuesday for a marriage license before a clerk called them hours later to say their application was denied.

Reno County Chief Judge Patricia Macke Dick said she had no choice because there is no case that specifically overturns the Kansas same-sex marriage ban.

The only gay marriage-related lawsuit now in the Kansas courts is a narrow case filed by two couples who married in other states and sued Kansas over tax treatment. Their case is being heard next month.

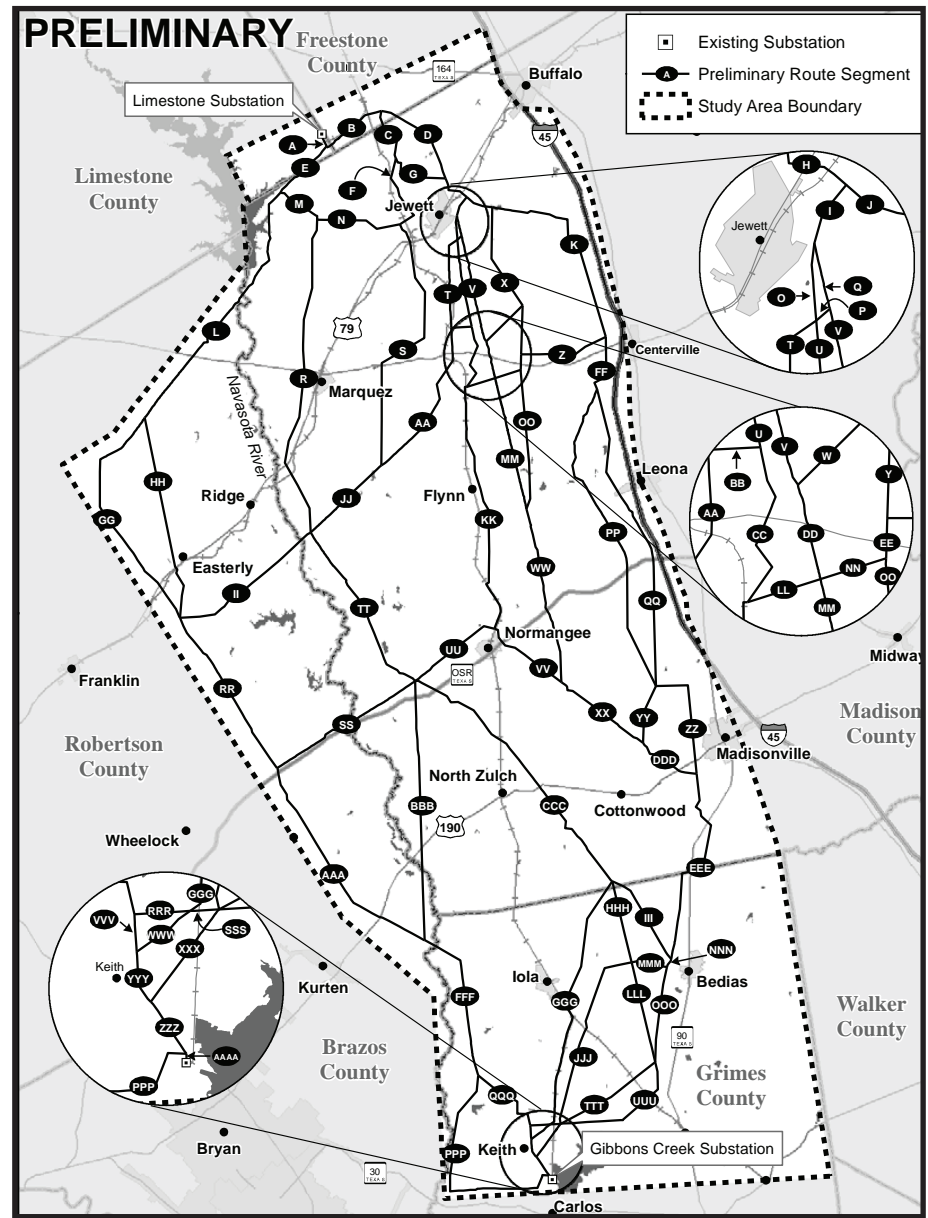
Cross Texas Transmission, LLC (CTT), in partnership with Garland Power & Light, is proposing to design, construct, and operate a new double circuit 345 kilovolt (kV) high voltage electric transmission line. The proposed transmission line would be constructed between the existing CenterPoint Energy Limestone Substation, located in Limestone County, and the existing Texas Municipal Power Agency (TMPA) Gibbons Creek Substation, located in Grimes County. The Electric Reliability Council of Texas (ERCOT) has determined that this project is critical to improving the reliability of the bulk transmission system in this part of the state. Safety agency pushes to widen air bag recall

DETROIT — The federal government is demanding that the auto industry recall millions of additional cars equipped with faulty air bags that can injure — and even kill — a driver.

The action Tuesday by the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration covers driver's side air bags equipped with inflators made by Takata Corp. of Japan. The inflators can erupt and send metal fragments into the passenger compartment.

December 2014 Public Scoping Meetings

The Federal Railroad Administration (FRA) and the Texas Department of Transportation (TxDOT) recently hosted six public scoping meetings for the preparation of an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) for the Dallas to Houston High-Speed Rail project. Based on comments received during the scoping process, FRA and TxDOT will hold additional public scoping meetings in early December. This will result in an extension of the public scoping comment period, which will now end on January 9, 2015.

Scoping is the first phase in the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process that must be followed in producing an EIS. During scoping, FRA is seeking public and agency input on the proposed alternative route alignments as well as other information about the proposed project area. No specific alternatives have been selected at this time nor will any be selected until the EIS is completed and approved, and a Record of Decision is signed. Scoping is the first opportunity for public input but not the last. Public input will be gathered throughout the development of the EIS and after the Draft EIS is issued.
